

The Pastor's Corner

Who receives our homage?

The magi were astrologers—wise and influential advisors in the Persian Royal Court. Having read the signs in the stars, they came to Bethlehem to find the newborn king of the Jews. As we all know, the king that they will find is very different from the current king, Herod.

King Herod was a tyrant, a cruel and violent dictator. Like every bully, his ego was fragile. When the king was in the middle of a tantrum, he inflicted great suffering upon the people of Jerusalem. No one was safe from the violence Herod could unleash upon his people when his power was threatened.

The small child who was born in a stable and spent his first night sleeping in a feeding trough represents a different kind of king, one who will "govern [the] people with justice" (Ps. 72:2). This king will rescue "the poor when they cry out, the oppressed when they have no one to help" (Ps 72:12). This king is the kind who "shows pity to the needy and the poor and saves the lives of the poor" (Ps 72:13). That is the kind of ruler we need.

Jesus Christ, the King of Kings and Lord of Lords, is the only person worthy of our total allegiance. The magi, who were also foreigners, may not have fully understood who they were about to encounter, but they came to understand that the infant Jesus was the one before whom they were to bend their knees. They figured out that it was Jesus to whom they should offer their gifts. Realizing this, they disobeyed Herod and "returned to their country by another way" (Matt 2:12). This is an example of how we are called to


deal with cruelty and hate in others and in ourselves. Sometimes, we simply need to find another way.

During the last decade, we've been plagued by political conflict and animosity, fear and confusion in the face of a pandemic that has taken so many lives and the livelihoods of others. We might be tempted to give our allegiance to something other than God. We may be tempted to surrender our wills and offer our loyalty to a person or ideology in the hope this will solve all our problems. Friends, this has never worked.

Only God is worthy of our worship. No person, even me, is worthy of our unflinching loyalty. That belongs to God alone. As people of faith, however, we know that there are certain criteria that we should use to evaluate our leaders. Do their policies give relief to the poor? Do they work to protect life in all its stages from conception to natural death? Do they show compassion toward the afflicted, the disabled, immigrants, the imprisoned, and the elderly? As we evaluate our leaders, we must ask these questions of ourselves as well. Who receives our homage?

Personal items: shampoo, soap, dish soap, Q-tips and deodorant.


Infant care items: baby food, baby wipes, baby shampoo, baby powder, baby lotion and diaper cream.




2021 Donations
