



The Pastor's Corner

And he said, "Amen, I say to you, no prophet is accepted in his own native place." Luke 4:24

It's always easier to share our faith with strangers then it is to share with members of our family. Conversely listening to other family members "preach" to us is harder to take then hearing the witness of friends and strangers.

That's because of something called familiarity. The familiarity we have with family members can lead to lack of confidence in their convictions and Christian witness. We know their sins and shortcomings all to well and they know ours. It's easy to allow our personal history with somebody to become an obstacle to hearing God speaking to us through them. We might hold on to negative experiences with family members and the emotions that are attached to them, and we allow these things to color our experience of this family member.

Jesus's statement that "no prophet is accepted in his own native place," is a challenge to us to make sure that we don't fall into that trap. We should do whatever we can to accept the Gospel witness of our family members. The best way to do this is by regularly working to let go of any baggage we carry in our family relationships. Often, we carry hurt, anger, and resentment without even realizing it. It's very easy to focus on focus on our family members' shortcomings and faults because we are so close to them.

Today, reflect upon your family and whether you look beyond their weaknesses and sins to see God's goodness in them. There may be something that God is trying to say to you through them. Don't close the door on the possibility that they may be God's messenger to you.




