Happy New Year to everyone! We continue to be in the Christmas season,

which ends this Sunday, as we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord. This is one of the epiphanies of Jesus - the other ones are the arrival of the Magi, which we heard about in the Gospel for last Sunday, and the wedding feast of Cana.

Today we celebrate that Jesus has a unique relationship with God who is His Father and we hear the words of the Father to Jesus in this Sunday's Gospel - "You are my beloved Son with you I am well pleased". We who have been baptized also have a unique relationship with God our Father since through the Holy Spirit we are united to Jesus, the Son of God. We are called to a higher standard than the cultural standards of our times and St. Paul writes to us about this in this Sunday's Epistle. Take time out this week to reflect on your Baptismal commitment and give thanks for the gift of the Holy Spirit which gives us power to carry it out.

On another note, perhaps you have read in the Inland See or seen on the diocesan website that Pope Francis has called a synod, a meeting with Bishops, to discuss consultation with the laity as they lead the church. I ask that you go to the diocesan website and learn more about the Synod and fill out the survey posted. Listening sessions are being planned by the diocese and on the local level Kathy Brink has offered to facilitate some sessions so we can get more feedback on the parish level. More details will follow.




