

The Scripture readings this Sunday, the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time, focus on the importance of the Word of God in worship. Two noteworthy examples are de-

scribed in our readings. When Ezra the priest read the Torah in the streets of Jerusalem after the Jewish people had returned from exile, it brought people to tears. In the Gospel, we hear that when Jesus read from the prophet Isaiah in his hometown synagogue. he revealed that He himself was the fulfillment of that passage. As we celebrate the Eucharist together, let us consider the blessings of being able to listen to the Word of God. May we be attentive to the words that are being spoken and realize that it is truly the Word of God. May we find nourishment and inspiration from Scripture so that we can put God's Word into action by our good deeds.

Last Wednesday the Pastoral Councils of Holy Family-St. Lawrence Parish and St. Pius X Parish met in a joint session. The Pastoral Council is the advisory group to me, the Pastor, as I offer leadership to the parish community. Most every month we meet to discuss different issues that come up and plan future events. Recently, we have been meeting by "Zoom" because of the pandemic. Last week we had a "listening session" as we offer opinions for the upcoming universal Synod called by Pope Francis which plans to meet in Rome next year. The Synod is the advisory group of bishops to Pope Francis called to discuss different issues and the topic this time has to do with developing a process so that the laity can have a greater role in the governance of the church. As you might know from previous bulletins, Kathy Brink, is the coordinator for our parishes and has been and will be holding "listening sessions". I encourage you to get involved.
