FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT BY CLARE CROSSLEY, PARISH COUNCIL

Rejoice! Easter is only three weeks away! Today we celebrate the Fourth Sunday of Lent, traditionally called **Laetare** (rejoice) **Sunday**. Now is the time for us to look ahead with joyful anticipation of Jesus' Resurrection, even as we continue our practices of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. A reason to **Rejoice!**

For some, Lent can be a season of doom and gloom, a time to feel bad about all the ways we are not "measuring up" in our spiritual lives. But this view is far from the truth. Lent is a season of refreshment and love, of awakening and rebirth. A reason to **Rejoice!**

Today we hear the parable of the Prodigal Son in the Gospel of Luke. It's probably one of the most familiar of all of Jesus' stories because we've heard it so many times and resonates with many. This amazing parable tells the story of a young son who has the nerve to ask his dad for his inheritance, now! The father agrees and the young son leaves his home and turns away from his family only to squander away his money. In desperation from the mess he made of his life, the son finally "comes to his senses", realizing he would be better off back at home and returns with a heavy heart. And what does the father do? With deep compassion the father not only welcomes him home but honors him with a party. This compassion brought the son back to life. A reason to **Rejoice!**

As I reflect on Luke's Gospel, I am transported back a few years to a time when my husband, Dennis and I attended Mass at St. Monica's in NYC. Whenever we spend the weekend in the city, Mass is always part of the plan. Our friends Bill and Sue attended Mass that

evening as well. She reluctantly joined us because she hadn't been to Mass in several years. He attends Mass each week by himself. Unfortunately, Sue never made her Confirmation, and they never married in the Catholic Church. Down deep she was struggling and feeling guilty.

Fr. Brady made quite an impression on our friend Sue that evening. His homily about the Prodigal Son opened Sue's eyes and heart as he asked the congregation if we were like the Prodigal Son? Maybe we thought God would never forgive us for things we did in our lives. The priest reminded us that God is like the father in today's parable. He is waiting for us to return. The Father in Heaven will never reject us. His love is unconditional, relentless and always inviting. He encouraged all to go to confession and invited those interested to explore the **OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults)** program, (formerly RCIA), for those seeking to become Catholic, or for Catholics who haven't received all the Sacraments of Initiation. This was the glimmer of hope Sue needed to right the wrongs in her life.

The emptiness she carried for so long was replaced with a sense of relief. Sue was finally Confirmed and her marriage to Bill was blessed in a special Mass solidifying her faith journey with her husband and the Catholic Church. A reason to **Rejoice!**

Sometimes we are lost. We lose sight of the Lord as well, but God never loses sight of us. He waits for us to "come to our senses", ready to welcome us back with open arms! A reason to **Rejoice!**

WEEKLY READINGS

FIRST READING

Joshua 5:9a, 10-12

The LORD said to Joshua, "Today I have removed the reproach of Egypt from you." While the Israelites were encamped at Gilgal on the plains of Jericho, they celebrated the Passover on the evening of the fourteenth of the month. On the day after the Passover, they ate of the produce of the land in the form of unleavened cakes and parched grain. On that same day after the Passover, on which they ate of the produce of the land, the manna ceased. No longer was there manna for the Israelites, who that year ate of the yield of the land of Canaan.

SECOND READING

2 Corinthians 5:17-21

Brothers and sisters: Whoever is in Christ is a new creation: the old things have passed away; behold, new things have come. And all this is from God, who has reconciled us to himself through Christ and given us the ministry of reconciliation, namely, God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting their trespasses against them and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation. So we are ambassadors for Christ, as if God were appealing through us. We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. For our sake he made him to be sin who did not know sin, so that we might become the righteousness of God in him.

GOSPEL

Luke 15:1-3, 11-32

Tax collectors and sinners were all drawing near to listen to Jesus, but the Pharisees and scribes began to complain, saying, "This man welcomes sinners and eats with them." So to them Jesus addressed this parable: "A man had two sons, and the younger son

said to his father, 'Father give me the share of your estate that should come to me.' So the father divided the property between them. After a few days, the younger son collected all his belongings and set off to a distant country where he squandered his inheritance on a life of dissipation. When he had freely spent everything, a severe famine struck that country, and he found himself in dire need. So he hired himself out to one of the local citizens who sent him to his farm to tend the swine. And he longed to eat his fill of the pods on which the swine fed, but nobody gave him any. Coming to his senses he thought, 'How many of my father's hired workers have more than enough food to eat, but here am I, dying from hunger. I shall get up and go to my father and I shall say to him, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. I no longer deserve to be called your son; treat me as you would treat one of your hired workers.'" So he got up and went back to his father. While he was still a long way off, his father caught sight of him, and was filled with compassion. He ran to his son, embraced him and kissed him. His son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you; I no longer deserve to be called your son.' But his father ordered his servants, 'Quickly bring the finest robe and put it on him; put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. Take the fattened calf and slaughter it. Then let us celebrate with a feast, because this son of mine was dead, and has come to life again; he was lost, and has been found.' Then the celebration began. Now the older son had been out in the field and, on his way back, as he neared the house, he heard the sound of music and dancing. He called one of the servants and asked what this might mean. The servant said to him, 'Your brother has returned and your father has slaughtered the fattened calf because he has him back safe and sound.' He became angry, and when he refused to enter the house, his father came out and pleaded with him. He said to his father in reply, 'Look, all these years I served you and not once did I disobey your orders; yet you never gave me even a young goat to feast on with my friends. But when your son returns who swallowed up your property with prostitutes, for him you slaughter the fattened calf.' He said to him, 'My son, you are here with me always; everything I have is yours. But now we must celebrate and rejoice, because your brother was dead and has come to life again; he was lost and has been found.'

It's incredible to think that we've already arrived at the **Fourth Sunday of Lent**. As we gather to mark the Fourth Sunday of Lent, it's remarkable how swiftly time passes. We find ourselves now beyond the halfway mark of this sacred season, journeying steadfastly towards the joy of Easter.

The Paschal Candle burns bright throughout the Easter season, as well as at every Baptism and Funeral celebrated throughout the year.






