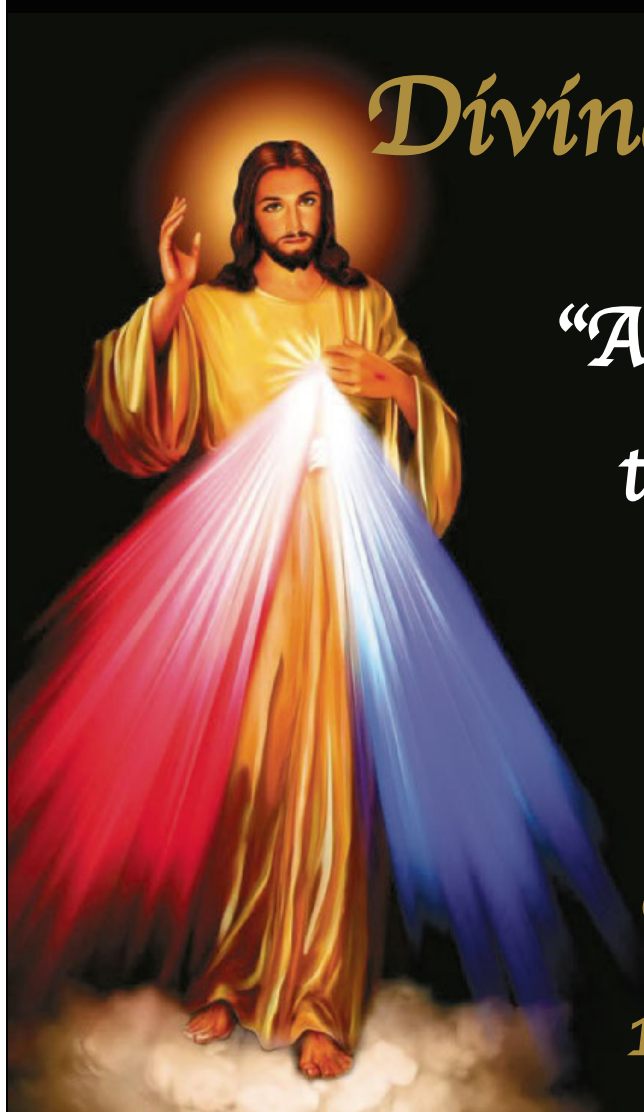

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

Beliefs are a very cherished part of who we are as human beings. In fact, in the 1950's there was a radio program dedicated to the very idea of belief. The "This I Believe" radio show, hosted by acclaimed journalist Edward R. Murrow debuted and people embraced it wholeheartedly. Americans gathered by their radios to hear compelling stories of belief from the likes of Eleanor Roosevelt, Jackie Robinson, Helen Keller and Harry Truman as well as corporate leaders, cab drivers, scientists, and secretaries – anyone able to distill into a few minutes (no more than 500 words) the guiding principles by which they lived. These guiding principles were formed from moments that shaped them and birthed their beliefs into being which, during this time, brought inspiration to a country worried about the Cold War, McCarthyism and racial division. Even today, if you go searching for "This I Believe" essays, you will find them throughout the Internet and they are marked by the same pattern: a belief system that was personally created by a happening or an experience and explained for all to see.

In the Gospel today, Thomas, one of Jesus's Twelve, was yearning for that background information in order to compose his own "This I Believe" narrative. The others had seen Christ, experienced Christ's presence and heard his Holy Words and, therefore, believed that He truly was resurrected into a new life. Their belief was inspired by an occurrence; a divine occurrence and appearance by our Lord. I am sure that each disciple could have composed a gorgeously written, individual account of how this coming of Jesus changed their lives and worlds forever. They would likely have had no problem composing a 500 word "This I Believe," essay that could have, undoubtedly, set the world on fire with their story of how they came to believe. Thomas did not have the details and undoubtedly felt left out of the whole miraculous experience.

What Thomas came to understand and what we must as well is that Jesus does not want a personal "This I Believe" essay from us. He doesn't want 500 words. He doesn't want vivid imagery and language. He doesn't want an acclaimed broadcast. Rather, He wants two powerful words from each of His children: I believe. He wants our "Yes!" even when we don't have proof. We, as humans, crave to share our beliefs and the why behind them. We desire this because our beliefs become the building blocks of our identity. In many ways, we are like Thomas. We desire to see, and feel, and taste and experience in order to hone and shape our belief system. Because then, to us, it is true. It is believable. Our beliefs have merit. Our beliefs are provable. Jesus asks us to take a different road to His heart. "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." So the question becomes, "How are we to do this?"

The Holy Spirit. Jesus sends us the Holy Spirit, as he did that day, when he breathed the Holy Spirit upon the faces of his Apostles. While the Holy Spirit was given for us to have the power to forgive sins, the Holy Spirit also gives us the power to do that which we can not do alone. During this Lenten season, the app, Hallow, offered a beautiful program called LentPray40 which personally enriched and strengthened my own faith. Throughout the program, we, the listeners, were asked to pray the response, "Lord, I believe. Help my unbelief." Let this be our mantra during this Holy Easter season. May the Risen Jesus help us to believe. Without a story or a reason. Let Him help us simply believe in his precious body and blood so that we may say, "Yes!" to His calling for each of us. And may our unbeliefs be strengthened by the powerful breath of the Holy Spirit that is surely encircling round each of our hearts.

WEEKLY READINGS

FIRST READING

Acts 5:12-16

Many signs and wonders were done among the people at the hands of the apostles. They were all together in Solomon's portico. None of the others dared to join them, but the people esteemed them. Yet more than ever, believers in the Lord, great numbers of men and women, were added to them. Thus they even carried the sick out into the streets and laid them on cots and mats so that when Peter came by, at least his shadow might fall on one or another of them. A large number of people from the towns in the vicinity of Jerusalem also gathered, bringing the sick and those disturbed by unclean spirits, and they were all cured.

SECOND READING Rev 1:9-11a, 12-13, 17-19

I, John, your brother, who share with you the distress, the kingdom, and the endurance we have in Jesus, found myself on the island called Patmos because I proclaimed God's word and gave testimony to Jesus. I was caught up in spirit on the Lord's day and heard behind me a voice as loud as a trumpet, which said, "Write on a scroll what you see." Then I turned to see whose voice it was that spoke to me, and when I turned, I saw seven gold lampstands and in the midst of the lampstands one like a son of man, wearing an

ankle-length robe, with a gold sash around his chest. When I caught sight of him, I fell down at his feet as though dead. He touched me with his right hand and said, "Do not be afraid. I am the first and the last, the one who lives. Once I was dead, but now I am alive forever and ever. I hold the keys to death and the netherworld. Write down, therefore, what you have seen, and what is happening, and what will happen afterwards."

GOSPEL

Jn 20:19-31

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."

Thomas, called Didymus, one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples said to him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nailmarks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe." Now a week later his disciples were again inside and Thomas was with them. Jesus came, although the doors were locked, and stood in their midst and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe." Thomas answered and said to him, "My Lord and my God!"

Jesus said to him, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples that are not written in this book. But these are written that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name.

My Dear Parish Family in Risen Christ,

Christ is Risen! Alleluia!

As we continue to celebrate this glorious Easter season, I greet you with the joy of the Risen Lord who triumphs over sin and death. In this Jubilee Year of Hope, we are reminded that the Resurrection is not a past event—it is a living reality, one that continues to transform hearts, renew lives, and draw us into deeper communion with God and one another.

Today, we also mark **Divine Mercy Sunday**, a feast profoundly close to the heart of our late **Holy Father, Pope Francis**, who returned to the Father's house on Easter Monday at the age of 88. How fitting that his earthly life concluded during the holiest of weeks, and that we now honor him on a Sunday that proclaims the infinite mercy of God—a Mercy he spent his entire papacy preaching, living, and embodying.

encounter the mercy of Jesus. As we pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet today, may we lift Pope Francis in gratitude for his prophetic voice and pastoral heart. May his memory inspire us to be agents of mercy in our families, neighborhoods, workplaces, and world.

We remember the words he often shared: **"Christians are joyful; they are never gloomy. If we are truly in love with Christ and sense how much He loves us, our heart will light up with a joy that spreads to everyone around us."**

Even in our grief, we trust that he now beholds the face of the Risen Christ whom he loved and served so faithfully.

Eternal rest grant unto him, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon him. May he rest in peace. Amen.

This Easter, we at St. Pius X Parish were blessed to experience a deeply moving and joyful celebration of Christ's Resurrection. From the solemnity of the Triduum to the jubilant Easter Sunday Masses, the presence of the Holy Spirit among us was palpable.
