

First Reading: "Behold, I see the heavens opened and the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God." (Acts 7:56) In Acts, we are first introduced to Saul (Paul) at the stoning of Stephen, the first recorded Christian martyr. After his conversion, Paul would look back at his persecution of the Church with deep remorse. How do you deal with regret in your life?

Psalm: The Lord is king, the most high over all the earth. **Second Reading:** The one who gives this testimony says, "Yes, I am coming soon." Amen! Come, Lord Jesus! (Rev 22:20) We hear today the final vison that John received. How do you imagine John thought about all the visions he had received from the Lord?

Gospel: That they may be brought to perfection as one, that the world may know that you sent me, and that you loved them even as you loved me. (Jn 17:23)In his final prayer during the farewell discourse, Jesus speaks about his disciples as the Father's gift to him. What gifts have God given you?




