




SUMMER SCHEDU

Pope Francis has decreed that the ancient devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary, under the title of Mother of the Church, be inserted into the Roman Calendar.

Dear Jesus, in the last moments of Your life when in agony, You gave us one of the greatest gifts of all, Your mother to be our mother too. Help us to learn from Mary a mother's love, and to always point others to Your love for us.





Born to nobility, St. Norbert of Xanten, whose Feast Day is June 6, was ordained as a subdeacon and served in the court of Henry V, Emperor of Germany, however, at court it was easy to be distracted by wealth, power and luxury and he lived a worldly and corrupt life there. By the grace of God while traveling in a storm he was nearly struck by lightning and almost killed. This experience changed St. Norbert and he became penitent, left his court post, and after a period of discernment in a monastery, felt called to be a priest.

Norbert became an itinerant preacher, preaching against worldly attitudes but at the Pope's request finally settled in northern France and founded the Norbertine order established according to the

rule of St. Augustine. The order grew rapidly and soon founded women's branch. Norbert traveled and preached across Germany where he also founded a lay branch of the Norbertines. In Belgium he preached against heresies which denied the Blessed Sacrament.

Eventually he was made Archbishop of Magdeburg, Germany, and later he traveled to Rome in support of Pope Innocent II, against the antipope. Afterward he returned to Germany to court of Emperor Lothar as advisor, at end of life, in failing health, St. Norbert was carried back to Magdeburg.

PENTECOST (Greek for fiftieth) closes the Easter season, the 50 days following the Resurrection. Today we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles.



Pentecost is not merely an historical event. It is a continuing reality. The Holy Spirit


continues to come upon people for the sole purpose of leading us to Jesus Christ. We are all in the Upper Room as the wind blows and the tongues of fire descend on our heads. We possess the Spirit of God. We call upon the Holy Spirit today. We ask Him to continue to work through the Church in general and through each of us in particular. We ask Him to help us continue the mandate of the Lord: May we, like the first apostles and all the fervent Christians throughout the ages, lead others to Christ.
