Profession of Faith


I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.

CPR and AED Devices

We all have the power to **RESTART** a heart. There are more than 350,000 Cardiac arrests annually outside the hospital. Less than 10 % of those victims survive. Cardiac arrest can occur at anytime. Immediate CPR and use of a AED devices within 3-5 minutes of a person's collapse can greatly increase survival. **Cardiac Arrest** occurs when the heart malfunctions and **STOPS** unexpectedly. This can be caused by an electrical malfunction that triggers an irregular heart beat (arrhythmia). This disruption causes the heart to stop pumping blood to the vital organs such as the brain and the lungs. Seconds after the heart stops, breathing stops and death occurs within minutes if the victim does not receive lifesaving treatment.

The American Heart Association recommends the following Chain of survival:

- 1. Prompt recognition and activation of EMS. Call 911
- 2. Implement high quality CPR
- 3. Rapid Defibrillation
- 4. Basic and Advanced Emergency Care
- 5. Advanced Life Care Support and Post Arrest Plan

How can we as laypersons participate in saving lives and restarting hearts?

- 1. Prompt recognition and calling 911
- 2. Providing high quality CPR
- 3. AED devices provide a shock. To the heart. By placing pads on the victim's chest by the bystander, the device is able to analyze the heart rhythm and if necessary will provide the layperson with audio instructions on how to deliver a shock if necessary.

Educations on these devices are part of CPR instruction and anyone can save a life. It is that easy to use the device.

The St. Damien Parish Nurses Ministry is in the process of procuring four AED devices (one for each church and one for the Parish Center) in coordination with a grant obtained from Atlanticare.

The Nurses Ministry supports Community wide education for all parishioners interested in CPR /AED training. We are coordinating education with Ocean City Fire and Rescue. There will be two options and the first is an online program with a short in person skill class. For those who prefer in person learning, we will have a class early Fall. We urge all to consider taking one of these classes and learn skills that may come in handy in your homes or out in the community. You can save a life. Cost of certification is \$35.00.
