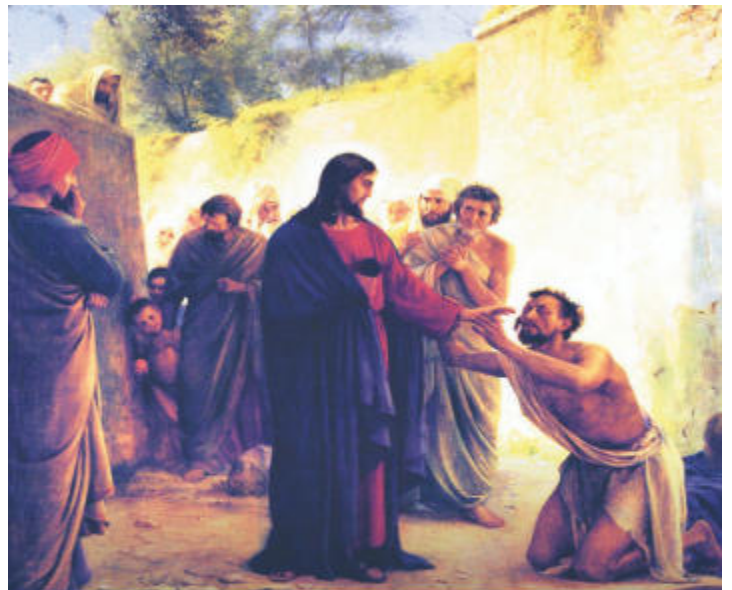
Parish Office Hours—Monday through Thursday—9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. - Friday—9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.

Parish Membership: We welcome new members to our Parish family and request you register in the Parish as soon as possible. Active membership is determined by registration, faithful participation and giving of one's time, talent and resources to this community of faith. **The parish cannot issue certificates of eligibility for sacramental sponsorship, give recommendations or character references if a person is not an active parishioner.**

The Sacrament of Baptism: Baptism is the celebration through which a child is brought into the faith of the Catholic Church. Parents must be registered and practicing members of the parish. Parents and sponsors are required to attend a pre-baptismal class. Sponsors must be practicing Catholics in good standing and able to obtain a certificate of eligibility from their parish.

Sacrament of Matrimony: The Sacrament of Matrimony requires a time of spiritual, intellectual and emotional preparation. Couples should arrange with the Parish Office one (1) year prior to the wedding date. Please call the parish office for an appointment with the pastor prior to making any other wedding plans.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: Anyone who feels called by God to become a member of the Catholic Church participates in the RCIA Program. A series of instructions and liturgical ceremonies designed to give total formation in the Catholic Faith.

Coronavirus: Directives by Bishop James F. Checchio

The Catholic faithful of the Diocese — priests, religious and lay faithful — are advised to keep informed and updated regarding the progress of the coronavirus pandemic during this global, national and state emergency.

Temporary Suspension of Public Masses: All public Masses throughout the Diocese of Metuchen will be temporarily suspended beginning no later than March 18 and resume no earlier than April 3, 2020, when the situation will be reevaluated as circumstances unfold. Despite the suspension of public Masses, a private Mass will be celebrated daily at 7 a.m. in the Cathedral of Saint Francis of Assisi and televised on www.stfranciscathedral.org.

Adoration and Private Prayer: Churches should remain open for prayer, private devotion and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. Pastors are asked to consider Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament for a period of time during the day. Praying in large groups, however, should be avoided. In all situations, participants should be encouraged to observe social distancing practices, recommending 3-6 feet of space between participants, for any event inside church spaces.

Temporary Suspension of Penance Services: The Sacrament of Penance should remain available according to need, but public Penance Services are not to be conducted. Priests are to take reasonable precautions between the penitent and confessor.

Baptisms, Weddings and Funerals: The celebration of baptisms, funerals and weddings may continue at the discretion of the local pastor. Every effort should be made to follow the guidance regarding appropriate crowd size as suggested by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and mandated by the State of New Jersey.

Anointing of the Sick: The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick should remain available for true emergencies.

First Penance, First Holy Communion and Confirmation: Since the celebration of First Penance, First Holy Communion and the Sacrament of Confirmation draws large crowds, these sacraments will be temporarily postponed in the Diocese of Metuchen until after Easter and will be re-scheduled after that time.

Temporary Closure of Catholic Schools and Religious Education Programs: All Catholic schools in the Diocese of Metuchen will remain closed as mandated by the State of New Jersey. Our principals and faculty members have prepared extensive plans for remote learning. All religious education programs are suspended with at-home work provided by the local parish leaders where possible.

Parish Offices: A pastor may decide to alter or limit his parish office staff during this time, however the faithful will still have needs that may need to be addressed right away, so parishioners should easily be able to reach the Pastor. The Church is not "closed," even though Masses are suspended, classes being taught remotely, etc.

Continuation of Catholic Social and Charitable Outreach: Catholic social and charitable outreach programs and services in the Diocese of Metuchen should continue, but be adjusted as needed to meet directions mandated by the State of New Jersey.

Holy Week and Sacred Triduum: Any decisions in regard to the celebration of Holy Week, the Chrism Mass and the Sacred Triduum will be made as we monitor the situation. Pastors and parishes will be notified in due time.

Please note that this is a fluid situation. We do not how long the restrictions imposed on New Jersey residents will be in effect. Please be patient and look for regular updates from the Diocese of Metuchen. diometuchen.org/coronavirus.

Apelación Annual del Obispo 2020

Los Ministerios Diocesanos que se benefician con los aportes que se reciban en esta campaña, tienen un impacto directo en muchos de los feligreses de nuestra Parroquia [Escriba el nombre de la parroquia]. Medidas preventivas de la Diócesis de Metuchen para evitar la propagación del coronavirus.

Suspensión Temporal de Misas Públicas

Todas las misas públicas en las iglesias de la Diócesis de Metuchen se suspenderán temporalmente a partir del 18 de marzo y no se reanudarán antes del 3 de abril de 2020.

Dado que la Eucaristía es la fuente y la cumbre de la vida cristiana, todos los sacerdotes de la Diócesis de Metuchen deben celebrar la Misa en privado ofreciéndola por el bienestar de todos los fieles cristianos confiados a su cuidado, por la humanidad durante este momento crítico y por las intenciones de aquellos que han hecho una ofrenda por la misa, pero sin la presencia de los fieles.

Adoración y Oración Privada

Las iglesias pueden permanecer abiertas para la oración, la devoción privada y la adoración del Santísimo Sacramento. Se les pide a los párrocos que consideren la Exposición del Santísimo Sacramento por un período de tiempo durante el día. Sin embargo, se debe evitar rezar en grupos grandes. En todas las situaciones, los fieles deben ser alentados a observar las prácticas de distanciamiento social, recomendando 3 a 6 pies de espacio entre los asistentes para cualquier evento dentro de los espacios de la iglesia.

Suspensión Temporal de Servicios de Penitencia

El Sacramento de la Penitencia debe permanecer disponible según las necesidades, pero los Servicios públicos de penitencia no podrán llevarse a cabo. Los sacerdotes deben tomar precauciones necesarias entre el penitente y el confesor.

Bautizos, Bodas y Funerales

La celebración de bautizos, funerales y bodas puede continuar a discreción del párroco. En todo caso, se debe hacer lo posible para acatar las medidas respecto al número máximo de personas que pueden asistir según lo sugerido por los Centros para el Control y la Prevención de Enfermedades y lo establecido por el Estado de Nueva Jersey. Los sacerdotes estarán atentos a responder a las necesidades pastorales de su pueblo, incluidos la celebración de matrimonios, a quienes se encuentran en peligro inminente de muerte, y a quienes deben ser bautizados de urgencia.

Unción de los Enfermos

El Sacramento de la Unción de los Enfermos debe permanecer disponible para verdaderas emergencias.

Primera Confesión, Primera Comunión y Confirmación

Dado que la celebración de la Primera Confesión, la Primera Comunión y el Sacramento de la Confirmación atrae a grandes multitudes, estos sacramentos se pospondrán temporalmente en la Diócesis de Metuchen hasta después de Pascua y se reprogramarán después de ese tiempo.

Cierre Temporal de Escuelas Católicas y Programas de Educación Religiosa.

Todas las escuelas católicas en la Diócesis de Metuchen permanecerán cerradas según lo ordenado por el Estado de Nueva Jersey. Todos los programas de educación religiosa se suspenden. Cada parroquia asignará a los estudiantes, cuando sea posible, actividades para hacer en casa.

Oficinas Parroquiales

El párroco tiene la facultad de decidir los cambios en el personal de la oficina durante este tiempo, sin embargo, en todo caso se debe garantizar la comunicación entre el párroco y los feligreses para atender los casos de emergencia anteriormente señalados.

Servicios Sociales y Caritativos Católicos

Los programas y servicios católicos de alcance social y caritativo en la Diócesis de Metuchen deben continuar, pero se ajustarán según sea necesario al cumplimiento de las instrucciones ordenadas por el Estado de Nueva Jersey.

Semana Santa y Triduo Sagrado

Cualquier decisión con respecto a las celebraciones de la Semana Santa, la Misa Crismal y el Triduo Pascual se tomará mientras monitoreamos la situación. Los párrocos y las parroquias serán notificados a su debido tiempo.

Amoris Laetitia: Welcoming a new life

166. The family is the setting in which a new life is not only born but also welcomed as a gift of God. Each new life “allows us to appreciate the utterly gratuitous dimension of love, which never ceases to amaze us. It is the beauty of being loved first: children are loved even before they arrive”. Here we see a reflection of the primacy of the love of God, who always takes the initiative, for children “are loved before having done anything to deserve it”. And yet, “from the first moments of their lives, many children are rejected, abandoned, and robbed of their childhood and future. There are those who dare to say, as if to justify themselves, that it was a mistake to bring these children into the world. This is shameful! ... How can we issue solemn declarations on human rights and the rights of children, if we then punish children for the errors of adults?” If a child comes into this world in unwanted circumstances, the parents and other members of the family must do everything possible to accept that child as a gift from God and assume the responsibility of accepting him or her with openness and affection. For “when speaking of children who come into the world, no sacrifice made by adults will be considered too costly or too great, if it means the child never has to feel that he or she is a mistake, or worthless or abandoned to the four winds and the arrogance of man”. The gift of a new child, entrusted by the Lord to a father and a mother, begins with acceptance, continues with lifelong protection and has as its final goal the joy of eternal life. By serenely contemplating the ultimate fulfilment of each human person, parents will be even more aware of the precious gift entrusted to them. For God allows parents to choose the name by which he himself will call their child for all eternity.

Our Lady of Guadalupe, mother of God and of the people of Metuchen, you always shine on our path as a sign of salvation and hope. We reply on you, Health of the Sick, you who, at the cross, united with Jesus’ pain, keeping steadfast your faith. 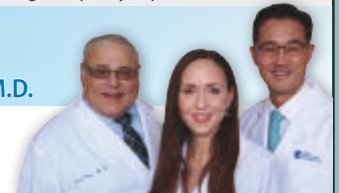
