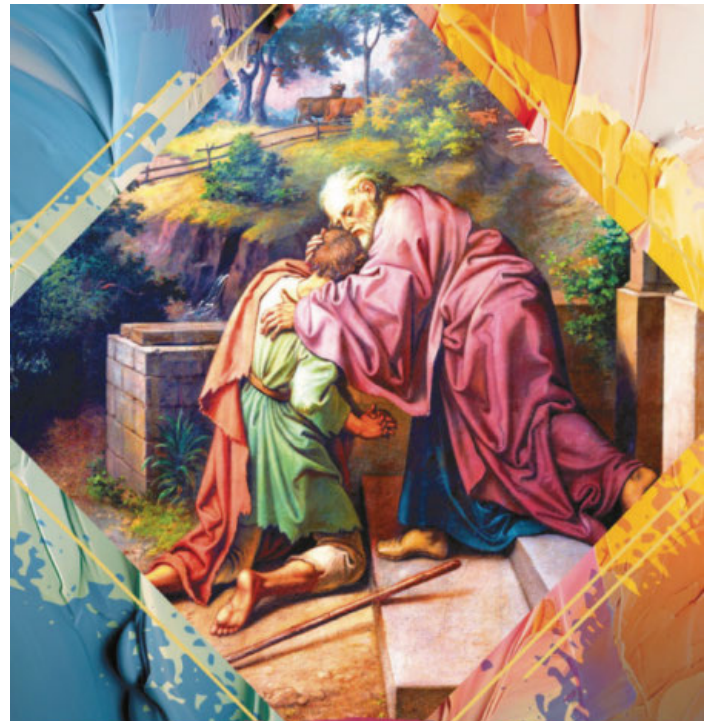
The Sacrament of Baptism:

Baptism is the celebration through which a child is brought into the faith of the Catholic Church. Parents must be registered and practicing members of the parish. Parents and sponsors are required to attend a pre-baptismal class. Sponsors must be practicing Catholics in good standing and able to obtain a certificate of eligibility from their parish.

Sacrament of Matrimony: The Sacrament of Matrimony requires a time of spiritual, intellectual and emotional preparation. Couples should arrange with the Parish Office one (1) year prior to the wedding date. Please call the parish office for an appointment with the pastor prior to making any other wedding plans.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: Anyone who feels called by God to become a member of the Catholic Church participates in the RCIA Program. A series of instructions and liturgical ceremonies designed to give total formation in the Catholic Faith

Pastoral Care of the Sick: Any parishioner who is sick, aged or incapacitated may receive the Eucharist at home. Please contact the Parish Office to have a priest visit you at home or in the hospital.

**Message of the Holy Father Francis
for Lent 2025:**

Let us journey together in Hope

Dear brothers and sisters,
We begin our annual pilgrimage of Lent in faith and hope with the penitential rite of the imposition of ashes. The Church, our mother and teacher, invites us to open our hearts to God's grace, so that we can celebrate with great joy the paschal victory of Christ the Lord over sin and death, which led Saint Paul to exclaim: "Death has been swallowed up in victory. Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?" (1 Cor15:54-55). Indeed, Jesus Christ, crucified and risen, is the heart of our faith and the pledge of our hope in the Father's great promise, already fulfilled in his beloved Son: life eternal (cf.Jn10:28; 17:3).[1]

This Lent, as we share in the grace of the Jubilee Year, I would like to propose a few reflections on what it means to journey together in hope, and on the summons to conversion that God in his mercy addresses to all of us, as individuals and as a community.

First of all, to journey. The Jubilee motto, "Pilgrims of Hope", evokes the lengthy journey of the people of Israel to the Promised Land, as recounted in the Book of Exodus. This arduous path from slavery to freedom was willed and guided by the Lord, who loves his people and remains ever faithful to them. It is hard to think of the biblical exodus without also thinking of those of our brothers and sisters who in our own day are fleeing situations of misery and violence in search of a better life for themselves and their loved ones. A first call to conversion thus comes from the realization that all of us are pilgrims in this life; each of us is invited to stop and ask how our lives reflect this fact. Am I really on a journey, or am I standing still, not moving, either immobilized by fear and hopelessness or reluctant to move out of my comfort zone? Am I seeking ways to leave behind the occasions of sin and situations that degrade my dignity? It would be a good Lenten exercise for us to compare our daily life with that of some migrant or foreigner, to learn how to sympathize with their experiences and in this way discover what God is asking of us so that we can better advance on our journey to the house of the Father. This would be a good "examination of conscience" for all of us wayfarers. (... to be continued)

**Mensaje del Santo Padre Francisco para
la Cuaresma 2025:
Caminemos juntos en la esperanza**

Queridos hermanos y hermanas:

Con el signo penitencial de las cenizas en la cabeza, iniciamos la peregrinación anual de la santa cuaresma, en la fe y en la esperanza. La Iglesia, madre y maestra, nos invita a preparar nuestros corazones y a abrirnos a la gracia de Dios para poder celebrar con gran alegría el triunfo pascual de Cristo, el Señor, sobre el pecado y la muerte, como exclamaba san Pablo: «La muerte ha sido vencida. ¿Dónde está, muerte, tu victoria? ¿Dónde está tu aguijón?» (1 Co 15,54-55). Jesucristo, muerto y resucitado es, en efecto, el centro de nuestra fe y el garante de nuestra esperanza en la gran promesa del Padre: la vida eterna, que ya realizó en Él, su Hijo amado (cf. Jn 10,28; 17,3) [1].

En esta cuaresma, enriquecida por la gracia del Año jubilar, deseo ofrecerles algunas reflexiones sobre lo que significa caminar juntos en la esperanza y descubrir las llamadas a la conversión que la misericordia de Dios nos dirige a todos, de manera personal y comunitaria.

Antes que nada, caminar. El lema del Jubileo, “Peregrinos de esperanza”, evoca el largo viaje del pueblo de Israel hacia la tierra prometida, narrado en el libro del Éxodo; el difícil camino desde la esclavitud a la libertad, querido y guiado por el Señor, que ama a su pueblo y siempre le permanece fiel. No podemos recordar el éxodo bíblico sin pensar en tantos hermanos y hermanas que hoy huyen de situaciones de miseria y de violencia, buscando una vida mejor para ellos y sus seres queridos. Surge aquí una primera llamada a la conversión, porque todos somos peregrinos en la vida. Cada uno puede preguntarse: ¿cómo me dejo interpelar por esta condición? ¿Estoy realmente en camino o un poco paralizado, estático, con miedo y falta de esperanza; o satisfecho en mi zona de confort? ¿Busco caminos de liberación de las situaciones de pecado y falta de dignidad? Sería un buen ejercicio cuaresmal confrontarse con la realidad concreta de algún inmigrante o peregrino, dejando que nos interpele, para descubrir lo que Dios nos pide, para ser mejores caminantes hacia la casa del Padre. Este es un buen “examen” para el viandante. (.....continuará)

Proyecto de Cuaresma 2025

Esta temporada de Cuaresma, la comunidad parroquial de la **Transfiguración del Señor** se está asociando con **Catholic Extension Society** para ayudar a hacer realidad el sueño de expansión de los residentes de Nuestra Señora del Desierto en el Estado Central de Washington. La parroquia de **Our Lady of the Desert** fue construida en 1987 en un terreno donado por un agricultor local. La iglesia fue construida para albergar a 180 personas porque la población en ese momento era de 300. La población ahora es de alrededor de 3,300 personas y las misas de fin de semana a menudo atiende a 1,400 católicos o más. En la clase de confirmación del año pasado, 120 estudiantes realizaron sus sacramentos en un altar improvisado al aire libre de la plaza parroquial. Durante los últimos 12 años, la comunidad ha estado recaudando fondos incansablemente para esta expansión mientras continúan planificando y creciendo para el futuro. Una de sus campanas más exitosas ha sido la venta de miel donada localmente y el 100 % de las ganancias se destinara al proyecto de construcción. El espacio de adoración ampliado tendrá capacidad para 450 personas adicionales para la liturgia regular. Las nuevas oficinas y áreas de reunión apoyaran los programas de educación religiosa y formación en la fe. Se agregaran baños adicionales. La comunidad está ahora cerca de completar su objetivo de recaudación de fondos, ¡y podemos ayudarlos a cruzar la línea de la meta!

Lenten Project 2025

Our Parish Lenten Project this year, in collaboration with Catholic Extension, will be to help Our Lady of the Desert Parish in the Diocese of Yakima, Washington State.

Building Catholic faith communities increases a sense of belonging among remote communities especially among the poor. Our Lady of the Desert parish in Mattawa, WA, was built in 1987 on land donated by a local farmer. The church was built to seat 180 people because the population at that time was 300. The population now is around 3,300 people with weekend Masses often serving 1,400 Catholics. The current church is not inadequate for the needs of the community and is in need of expansion. Last year's confirmation class saw 120 students make their sacraments on a makeshift altar in the open air of the parish plaza.

For the past 12 years, the community has been fundraising tirelessly for the expansion of the worship space. One of their most successful campaigns has been selling locally donated honey, with 100% of the proceeds supporting the building project. The expanded worship space will accommodate 450 additional people for regular liturgy. New offices and meeting areas will support religious education programs. Additional restrooms will be added. The community is now close to completing their fundraising goal. We can help them cross the finish line!

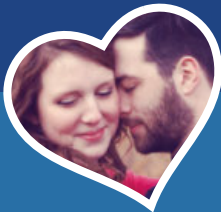
