Sacrament of Matrimony:

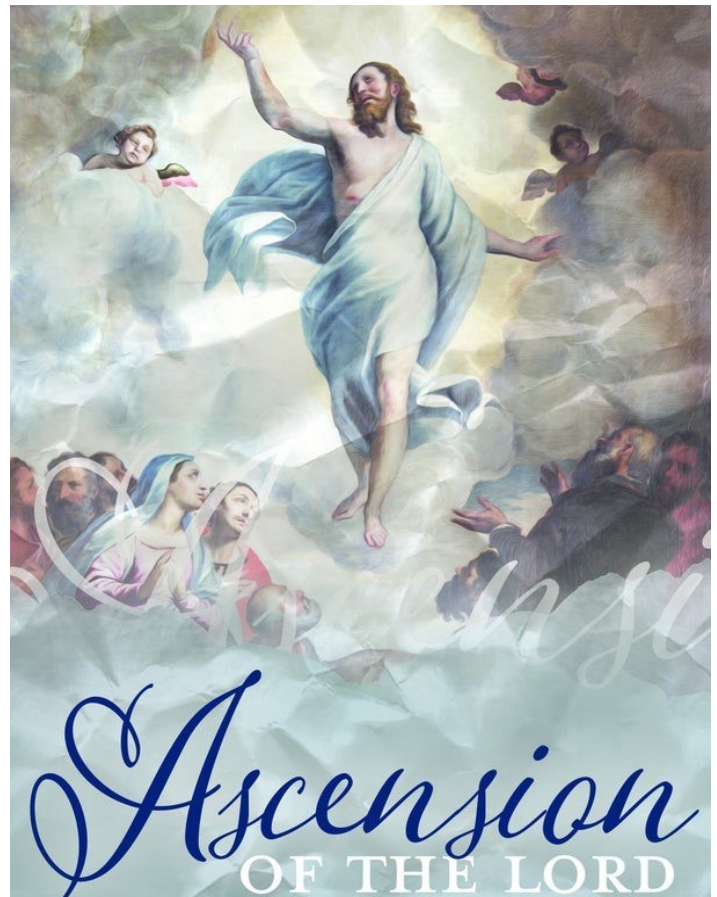

hacia los Pobres

El cuidado de los pobres en la vida monástica

57. Además de la asistencia material, los monasterios desempeñaron un papel fundamental en la formación cultural y espiritual de los más humildes. En tiempos de peste, guerra o hambre, eran lugares donde el necesitado encontraba pan y remedios, pero también dignidad y palabra. Allí se educaba a los huérfanos, se formaba a los aprendices y se instruía a los campesinos en técnicas agrícolas y en la lectura. El saber se compartía como don y responsabilidad. El abad era a la vez maestro y padre, y la escuela monástica era un lugar de liberación por la verdad. Porque, como escribe Juan Casiano, el monje debe caracterizarse por «la humildad de corazón [...], que no conduce a la ciencia que hincha, sino a la que ilumina por medio de la plenitud de la caridad». Al formar conciencias y transmitir sabiduría, los monjes contribuyeron a una pedagogía cristiana de inclusión. La cultura, marcada por la fe, se compartía con sencillez. El saber, cuando está iluminado por la caridad, se convierte en servicio. De ese modo, la vida monástica se revelaba como un estilo de santidad y una forma concreta de transformación de la sociedad.

58. La tradición monástica enseña, por tanto, que la oración y la caridad, el silencio y el servicio, las celdas y los hospitales, forman un único tejido espiritual. El monasterio es lugar de escucha y de acción, de adoración y de compartir. San Bernardo de Claraval, gran reformador de la Orden Cisterciense, «reclamó con decisión la necesidad de una vida sobria y moderada, tanto en la mesa como en la indumentaria y en los edificios monásticos, recomendando la sustentación y la solicitud por los pobres». Para él, la compasión no era una opción accesorias, sino el camino real para seguir a Cristo. La vida monástica, por lo tanto, cuando es fiel a su vocación original, muestra que la Iglesia sólo será plenamente esposa del Señor cuando sea también hermana de los pobres. El claustro no es un mero refugio del mundo, sino una escuela en la que se aprende a servirlo mejor. Allí donde los monjes abrieron sus puertas a los pobres, la Iglesia reveló con humildad y firmeza que la contemplación no excluye la misericordia, sino que la exige como su fruto más puro.

Indulgencia de San Francisco:

En enero de 2026, el Papa León XIV proclamó el Año Jubilar de San Francisco por los 800 años de su muerte. Durante este jubileo (10 de enero de 2026 a 10 de enero de 2027) se concede **indulgencia plenaria** a quienes, cumpliendo las condiciones habituales, peregrinen a una iglesia franciscana o templo dedicado a San Francisco y participen en una celebración litúrgica o dediquen un tiempo a la oración.

to all Christians on love for the poor**

Care for the poor in monastic life

57. In addition to providing material assistance, monasteries played a fundamental role in the cultural and spiritual formation of the humblest. In times of plague, war and famine, they were places where the needy found bread and medicine, but also dignity and a voice. It was there that orphans were educated, apprentices received training and ordinary people were taught agricultural techniques and how to read. Knowledge was shared as a gift and a responsibility. The abbot was both teacher and father, and the monastic school was a place of freedom through truth. Indeed, as John Cassian writes, the monk must be characterized by “humility of heart... which leads not to knowledge that puffs up, but to knowledge that enlightens through the fullness of charity.” By forming consciences and transmitting wisdom, monks contributed to a Christian pedagogy of inclusion. Culture, marked by faith, was shared with simplicity. Knowledge, illuminated by charity, became service. Monastic life thus revealed itself as a style of holiness and a concrete way to transform society.

58. The monastic tradition teaches us that prayer and charity, silence and service, cells and hospitals form a single spiritual fabric. The monastery is a place of listening and action, of worship and sharing. Saint Bernard of Clairvaux, the great Cistercian reformer, “firmly recalled the need for a sober and measured life, in the refectory as in monastic clothing and buildings, recommending the support and care of the poor.” For him, compassion was not an option, but the true path of following Christ. Monastic life, therefore, if faithful to its original vocation, shows that the Church is fully the bride of the Lord only when she is also the sister of the poor. The cloister is not only a refuge from the world, but a school where one learns to serve it better. Where monks and nuns have opened their doors to the poor, the Church has revealed with humility and firmness that contemplation does not exclude mercy but demands it as its purest fruit.

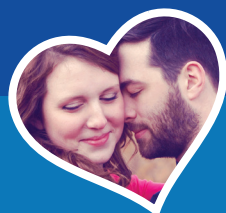
