Active membership is determined by registration, faithful participation and giving of one's time, talent and resources to this community of faith. **The parish cannot issue certificates of eligibility for sacramental sponsorship, give recommendations or character references if a person is not active parishioner.**

Sacrament of Matrimony:

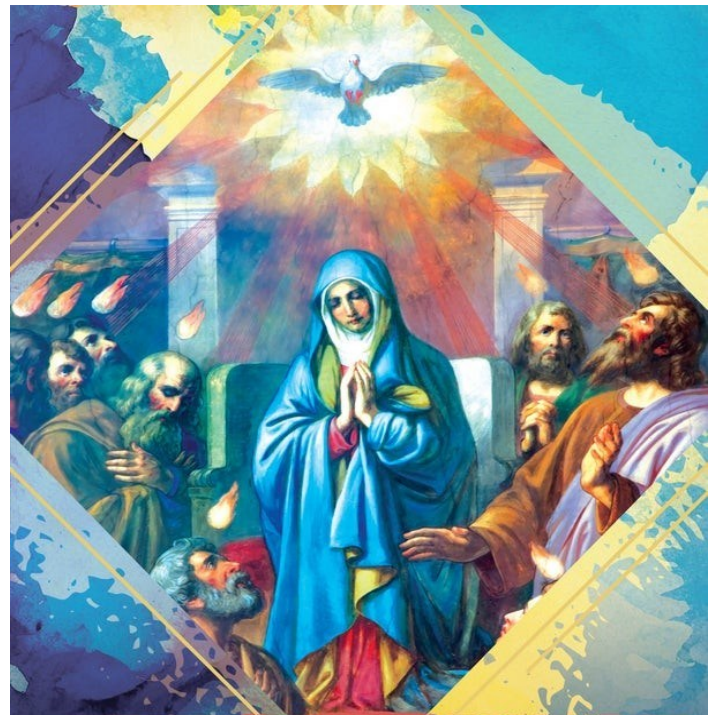

**Exhortación Apostólica Dilexi Te
Del Santo Padre León XIV Sobre el Amor
hacia los Pobres**

Liberar a los cautivos

59. Desde los tiempos apostólicos, la Iglesia ha visto en la liberación de los oprimidos un signo del Reino de Dios. Jesús mismo, al iniciar su misión pública, proclamó: «El Espíritu del Señor está sobre mí, porque me ha consagrado por la unción. Él me envió a llevar la Buena Noticia a los pobres, a anunciar la liberación a los cautivos» (Lc 4,18). Los primeros cristianos, incluso en condiciones precarias, rezaban y asistían a los hermanos y hermanas encarcelados, como atestiguan los Hechos de los Apóstoles (cf. 12,5; 24,23) y diversos escritos de los Padres. Esta misión liberadora se prolongó a lo largo de los siglos mediante acciones concretas, especialmente cuando el drama de la esclavitud y el cautiverio marcó sociedades enteras.

60. Entre finales del siglo XII y principios del XIII, cuando muchos cristianos eran capturados en el Mediterráneo o esclavizados en las guerras, surgieron dos Órdenes religiosos: la Orden de la Santísima Trinidad, Redención de Cautivos (trinitarios), fundada por san Juan de Mata y san Félix de Valois, y la Orden de la Bienaventurada Virgen María de la Merced (mercedarios), fundada por san Pedro Nolasco con el apoyo de san Raimundo de Peñafort, dominico. Estas comunidades de consagrados nacieron con el carisma específico de liberar a los cristianos esclavizados, poniendo a disposición sus bienes y a menudo ofreciendo su propia vida a cambio. Los trinitarios, con el lema Gloria Tibi Trinitas et captivis libertas (Gloria a Ti, Trinidad, y a los cautivos libertad), y los mercedarios, que añaden un cuarto voto a los votos religiosos de pobreza, obediencia y castidad, dieron testimonio de que la caridad puede ser heroica. La liberación de los cautivos era expresión del amor trinitario: un Dios que libera no sólo de la esclavitud espiritual, sino también de la opresión concreta. El gesto de rescatar de la esclavitud y de la prisión se considera una prolongación del sacrificio redentor de Cristo, cuya sangre es el precio de nuestro rescate (cf. 1 Co 6,20).

**Apostolic Exhortation DILEXI TE of the
Holy Father Pope Leo XIV
to all Christians on love for the poor**

Freeing prisoners

59. Since apostolic times, the Church has seen the liberation of the oppressed as a sign of the Kingdom of God. Jesus himself proclaimed at the beginning of his public ministry: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives" (Lk 4:18). The early Christians, even in precarious conditions, prayed for and assisted their brothers and sisters who were prisoners, as the Acts of the Apostles (cf. 12:5; 24:23) and various writings of the Fathers attest. This mission of liberation has continued throughout the centuries through concrete actions, especially when the tragedy of slavery and imprisonment have marked entire societies.

60. Between the late twelfth and the early thirteenth centuries, when many Christians were captured in the Mediterranean or enslaved in wars, two religious orders arose: the Order of the Most Holy Trinity and of the Captives (Trinitarians), founded by Saint John of Matha and Saint Felix of Valois, and the Order of the Blessed Virgin Mary of Mercy (Mercedarians), founded by Saint Peter Nolasco with the support of the Dominican Saint Raymond of Penafort. These communities of consecrated persons were born with the specific charism of freeing Christians who had been enslaved, placing their own possessions at the disposal of the enslaved [46] and many times offering their own lives in exchange. The Trinitarians, with their motto Gloria tibi Trinitas et captivis Libertas (Glory to you, O Trinity, and liberty to the captives), and the Mercedarians, who added a fourth vow to the religious vows of poverty, chastity and obedience, testified that charity can be heroic. The liberation of prisoners is an expression of Trinitarian love: a God who frees not only from spiritual slavery but also from concrete oppression. The act of rescuing someone from slavery and captivity is seen as an extension of Christ's redemptive sacrifice, whose blood is the price of our redemption (cf. 1 Cor 6:20).
