The Sacrament of Baptism:
Requesting the sacrament of Baptism for a child involves a serious obligation and faith commitment on the part of both parents. In order to have your child baptized at Good Shepherd, the parents must be registered members of our parish. Baptisms will ordinarily take place three times a year: on the last Sundays of the months of October, February and June at 1:00 PM. Instruction for parents and Godparents will take place the day before on Saturday at 1 PM.

The Sacrament of Matrimony:

Couples who are planning a wedding should call the parish at least one year prior to their chosen date and before they make any other arrangements. It is necessary that either the prospective bride, groom or their families be registered members of Good Shepherd Parish. Participation in an Engaged Encounter or the Pre-Cana Program is required.

Notify a priest of all who are hospitalized or home-bound. Emergencies at any time.

#### Order of Christian Initiation of Adults:



## GOOD SHEPHERD PARISH - IRVINGTON, NJ September 9, 2012 Twenty Third Sunday—Ordinary Time



At 195 years old, the New York School for the Deaf is the second oldest school for the deaf in the US. Begun through the efforts of a Baptist pastor, Rev. John Stanford, the school was officially chartered in 1817. Stanford served churches in Rhode Island, Pennsylvania, and New Jersey, before coming to New York. An 1835 memoir about his life describes how he devoted considerable time "to promote the comfort and moral improvement of the poor, without regard to denominational distinctions." When Stanford came to New York he preached the Gospel in the Alms House, which is where he first had the idea of developing a place of formal education for the deaf. Stanford recruited others to the cause, and the school in NY was begun.

In the Gospel this weekend, Jesus heals the deaf man who had a speech impediment. Jesus said to the man, "Ephphatha!" which translated means, "Be opened!" And even though Jesus told the crowd that witnessed the event to tell no one, they proclaimed the miracle everywhere. There was no stopping their astonishment.

People were impressed with Stanford's accomplishment in getting a school for the deaf chartered. Other states followed the example, starting their own institutions. What is often forgotten is that Stanford's work was rooted in the Gospel. The same devotion to the word of Christ is seen in the work of people like St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, who began the first Catholic school in the United States, and soon-to-be-St Marianne Cope, who founded hospitals in New York that she insisted admit everyone regardless of religious belief or color. She went on to work with lepers, assisting St. Damian de Veuster on Molokai. The Gospel can push us to do amazing things. They were all motivated to help others improve their lives because of the Gospel message; the same Gospel we hear each Sunday.

#### First US HOUSE FOR WOMEN VOCATIONS...

Magnifcat House was opened on Aug. 15, by Archbishop Gregory Aymond of New Orleans. the residence will now be open to any woman of post-college age who wants to live in community while discerning a possible call to religious life. Sister Sylvia Thibodeaux is the Director of Religious for the archdiocese. It also has the support of various female religious orders based in the area.

Magnficat House can accommodate up to eight women at a time, with the expected duration of stay expected to be around six months. During that time the women will live a daily routine of prayer and work supervised by veterans of the female religious life; timetable of private prayer time, formation, spiritual direction, shared meals and community living, all with the goal of helping each woman discern her vocation.


