The Sacrament of Baptism:

Requesting the sacrament of Baptism for a child involves a serious obligation and faith commitment on the part of both parents. In order to have your child baptized at Good Shepherd, the parents must be registered members of our parish. Baptisms will ordinarily take place three times a year: on the last Sundays of the months of October, February and June at 1:00 PM. Instruction for parents and Godparents will take place the day before on Saturday at 1 PM.

The Sacrament of Matrimony:

Couples who are planning a wedding should call the parish at least one year prior to their chosen date and before they make any other arrangements. It is necessary that either the prospective bride, groom or their families be registered members of Good Shepherd Parish. Participation in an Engaged Encounter or the Pre-Cana Program is required.

Pastoral Care of the Sick:

Notify a priest of all who are hospitalized or home-bound. Emergencies at any time.

Order of Christian Initiation of Adults:

Adults interested in becoming a member of the Catholic Church and Catholics who are in need of the Sacraments of Confirmation and/or Eucharist are welcome to inquire by calling the Parish House.

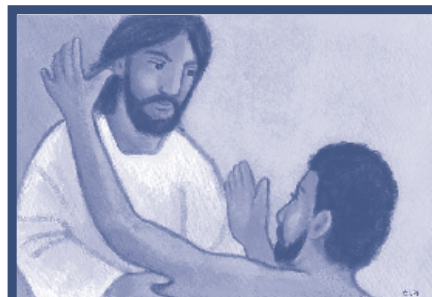

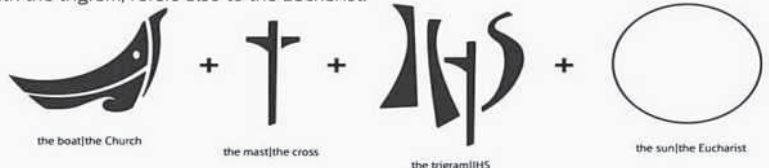

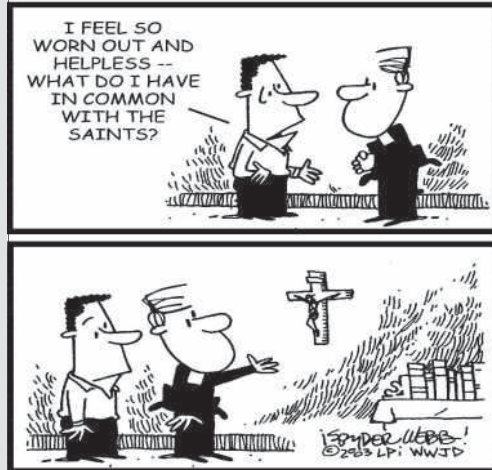

Concept of the logo: The logo is composed of a square, bordered field on which a boat, symbolizing the Church, is represented as sailing on a graphically minimal representation of waves. The main mast of the boat is a cross from which sails are displayed in the form of dynamic signs which compose the trigram of Christ (IHS). The background to the sails is a sun which, associated with the trigram, refers also to the Eucharist.

Sometimes we can't see the things in front of us. It's not that we're blind. Instead, we are distracted. That's one reason so many states or municipalities have outlawed texting while driving. It is said that drivers that are texting are taking their eyes off the road for a minimum of five seconds. Most do it for a longer time. At highway speeds a car will travel four-hundred-forty feet, almost one-and-a-half times the length of a football field. A lot can happen in that distance, including a crash. Of course, one doesn't have to be texting while driving to run into something while distracted. Running into someone can happen almost anywhere.

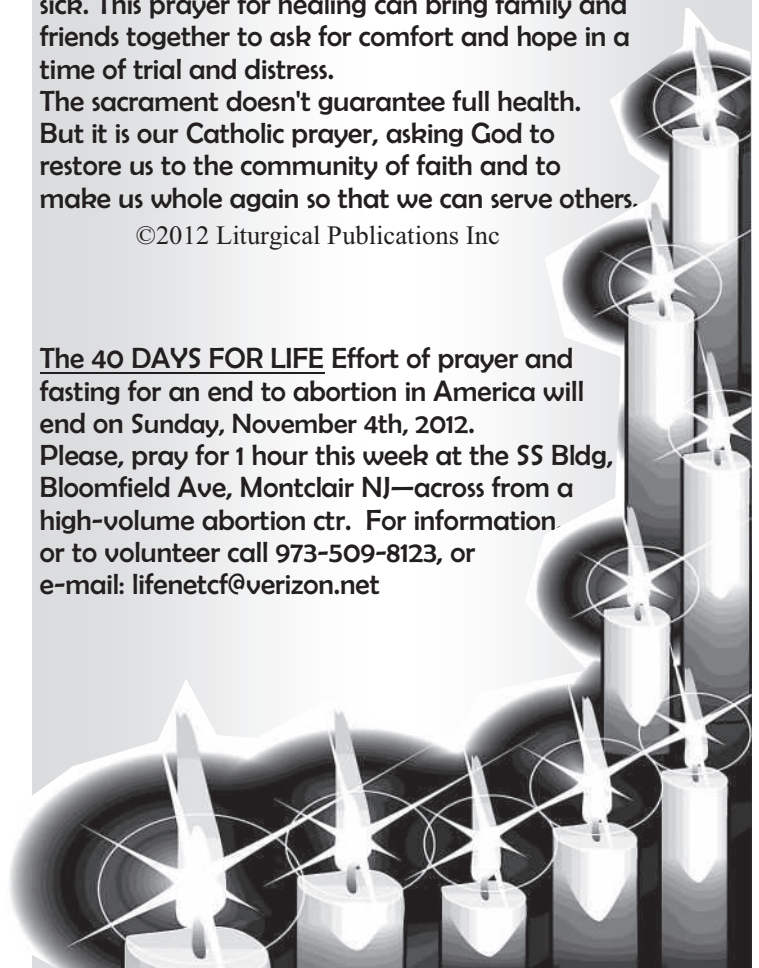
It just so happened that blind Bartimaeus was in the right location to run into Jesus. Well, he didn't actually "run" into him. Bartimaeus was sitting on the side of the road and the crowds passed him by, and when he heard what all the hubbub was about, Bartimaeus called out to Jesus asking to be healed. The crowd's noise provoked him and in turn, the cries of Bartimaeus broke through the noise to catch the attention of Jesus.

Sometimes things happen in our own lives that break through the distractions that may surround us every day. Illness is one of those times that changes how we interact with the world. Our routine is broken. We're no longer on cruise control. We have to reassess where we're at. One of the things that we can do when we're sick is ask to celebrate the sacrament of anointing of the sick. This prayer for healing can bring family and friends together to ask for comfort and hope in a time of trial and distress.

The sacrament doesn't guarantee full health. But it is our Catholic prayer, asking God to restore us to the community of faith and to make us whole again so that we can serve others.

CANONIZATIONS



On Sunday October 21st Sts. Pedro de Cebu as the second Philippine saint, St. Kateri Tekakwitha of New York; first American Indian saint, and St. Marianne Cope who served our Lord in New York and Hawaii were canonized by Pope Benedict XVI.

From an early age Barbara Cope wanted to enter religious life. As the oldest of the children; she worked in a factory to support her invalid father and the family. After his death, Barbara joined the Sister of St. Francis in Utica, New York. She taught for a time, she founded two of the first hospitals in central New York. In 1877 she was elected mother general of the order. In 1883, Mother Marianne journeyed to Hawaii with six sisters to take charge of hospitals and schools. Mother Marianne worked with St. Damien de Veuster. Her community cared for the women and girls, and when Fr. Damien died Mother Marianne was in charge of the boys' facility. On August 9, 1918, at the age of eighty.
