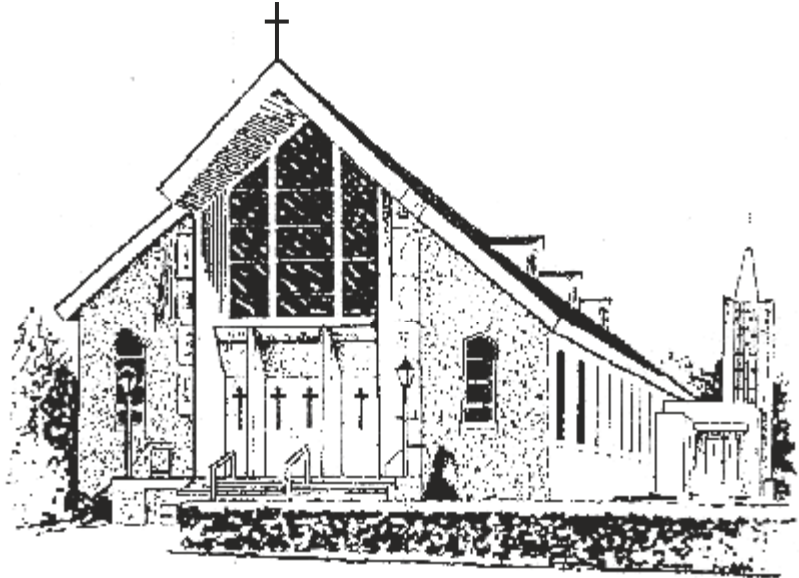

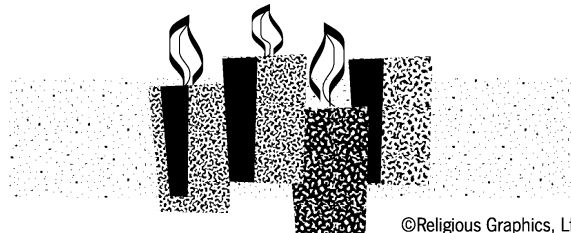

Dear Parishioners,

Pope Francis authored a recent Op-ed in The New York Times (Nov. 26), in which he wrote about a threat to his health he endured as a young man, deriving similarities to our current health crisis coping with the coronavirus pandemic. He makes several observations, among them that we often have to depend upon the “goodness and wisdom of others;” that our lives are a gift and we grow by giving of ourselves not by preserving ourselves; and that these moments can make us ripe for “change and conversion.” The pope writes of our common destination as a people, that we are all in the same boat, so to speak, and that the divisions we humans sow among ourselves threaten to destroy us.

Pope Francis offers some solutions to the existential crises we now face, including the virus, remarking that to emerge from these troubled times as better people, we need to “dream big,” to rearrange our priorities, musing that “God asks us to create something new.” During these final weeks of Advent, let us begin to dream big and reimagine our world as one where all are respected and loved, where all have what they need, even as we acknowledge that new world begins with you and me.

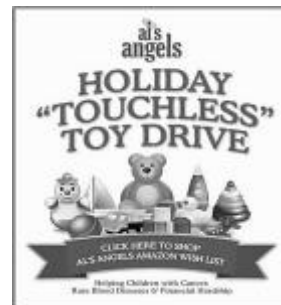
