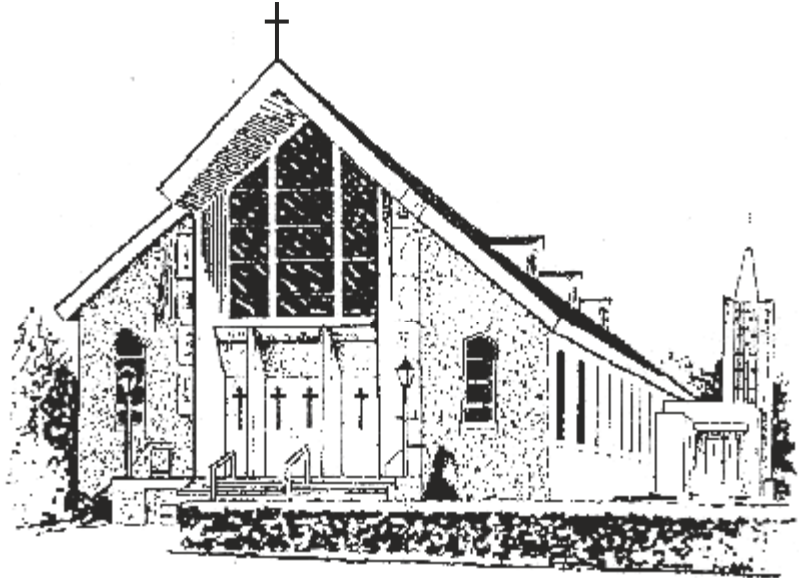

### Sacrament of Baptism

### Sacrament of Marriage

Arrangements must be made at least eight months in advance of the wedding date. Participation in Pre-Cana or Engaged Encounter is a requirement.

The Sacrament of the Sick is offered to any who are seriously ill, preparing for surgery, or homebound. Never permit me to be separated from you. Amen.


