Arrangements are to be made **one year** in advance.

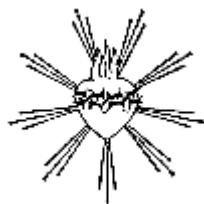

HOW TO REPORT ABUSE

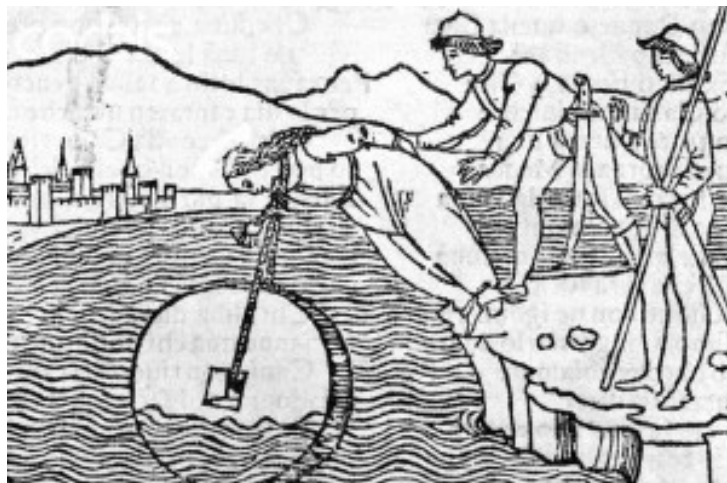

THIS SUNDAY'S GOSPEL



There are two very practical lessons we must learn from today's Gospel: the grave obligation we have of not causing scandal to our fellow-Christians or indeed to any man or woman and secondly, the willingness we should have to sacrifice any earthly possession which is a cause of sin to us. Scandal, the sin of being a cause or an occasion of another's sin, is doubly sinful involving one's own sin and the sin of the person scandalized. Scandal can be caused by word—that is, by teaching or propagating wrong doctrine or by giving sinful advice, and it can be caused by one's own sinful deeds which may be imitated by others. Those in positions of authority such as parents whose duty it is to bring up their children in the Christian faith, are especially liable to give scandal if they fail to live truly Christian lives. Christian parents who fail to live according to their faith will be held accountable not only for their own sins, but for the sins of their children and perhaps their children's children for generations to come. Much, if not all of today's moral laxity and permissiveness can be blamed on parents who have failed to give the example of true Christian living in the home and in dealings with their neighbors. To children of such parents, Christianity is only a label; it does not inform or inspire their lives, hence they are only nominal Christians. It is true that there may be "black sheep" in the best of Christian homes. When, however, all the children of a home are "black sheep" the whiteness, the sincerity, of the parents of such a home must certainly be called into question. There may be many bad influences at work outside the home but the good example of truly Christian parents can counteract these influences. Let parents see to it that they will not be a cause of scandal and a cause of eternal loss to the children God put into their charge. The second lesson for all of us in today's Gospel is that we should ever realize that eternal life is worth any sacrifice which we may be called on to make. The road we have to travel in life is not an easy one. As our Lord says in another place: "Enter by the narrow gate for the gate is wide and the way is easy that leads to destruction, and those who enter by it are many. But the gate is narrow and the way is hard that leads to life, and those who find it are few" (Mt. 7: 13). We wish to reach heaven, therefore we must be prepared to follow Christ; we must not allow others to lead us astray but be prepared and determined to conquer and resist our own evil inclinations also.

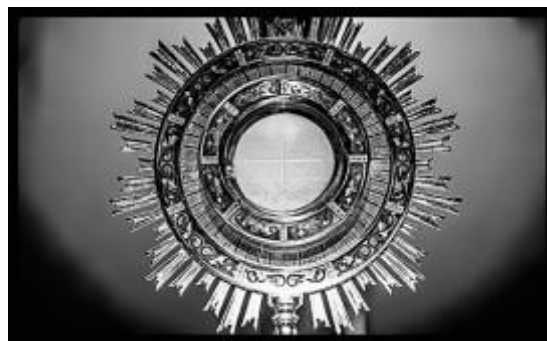

SEPTIEMBRE : MES DE NUESTRA SEÑORA DE LOS DOLORES



*Y a ti, una espada te atravesará
el alma" -Lucas 2:35*

Feliz el corazón de la Santísima
Virgen María, que sin morir
ganó la palma del martirio
bajo la cruz de nuestro Señor!

«No hay nadie que obre un milagro invocando mi nombre
y que luego sea capaz de hablar mal de mí»

Hoy, según el modelo del realizador de televisión más actual, contemplamos a Jesús poniendo gusanos y fuego allí donde debemos evitar ir: el infierno, «donde el gusano no muere y el fuego no se apaga» (Mc 9,48). Es una descripción del estado en el que puede quedar una persona cuando su vida no la ha llevado allí adonde quería ir. Podríamos compararlo al momento en que, conduciendo nuestro automóvil, tomamos una carretera por otra, pensando que vamos bien y vamos a parar a un lugar desconocido, sin saber dónde estamos y adónde no queríamos ir. Hay que evitar ir, sea como sea, aunque tengamos que desprendemos de cosas aparentemente irrenunciables: sin manos (cf. Mc 9,43), sin pies (cf. Mc 9,45), sin ojos (cf. Mc 9,47). Es necesario querer entrar en la vida o en el Reino de Dios, aunque sea sin algo de nosotros mismos. Posiblemente, este Evangelio nos lleva a reflexionar para descubrir qué tenemos, por muy nuestro que sea, que no nos permite ir hacia Dios, — y todavía más — qué nos aleja de Él. El mismo Jesús nos orienta para saber cuál es el pecado en el que nos hacen caer nuestras cosas (manos, pies y ojos). Jesús habla de los que escandalizan a los pequeños que creen en Él (cf. Mc 9,42). “Escandalizar” es alejar a alguien del Señor. Por lo tanto, valoremos en cada persona su proximidad con Jesús, la fe que tiene. Jesús nos enseña que no hace falta ser de los Doce o de los discípulos más íntimos para estar con Él: «El que no está contra nosotros, está por nosotros» (Mc 9,40). Podemos entender que Jesús lo salva todo. Es una lección del Evangelio de hoy: hay muchos que están más cerca del Reino de Dios de lo que pensamos, porque hacen milagros en nombre de Jesús. Como confesó santa Teresita del Niño Jesús: «El Señor no me podrá premiar según mis obras (...). Pues bien, yo confío en que me premiará según las suyas».

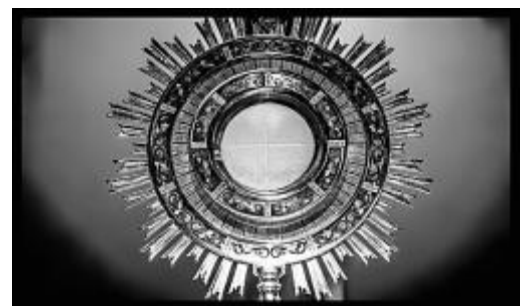
EL ESCAPULARIO



En 1251, la Virgen María, acompañada de una multitud de ángeles, se apareció a San Simón Stock, General de los Carmelitas, con el escapulario de la Orden en sus manos, y le dijo: "*Tú y todos los Carmelitas tendréis el privilegio, que quien muera con él no padecerá el fuego eterno*"; es decir, quien muera con él, se salvará. El escapulario es un signo de nuestra identidad como católicos, vinculados de íntimamente a la Virgen María con el propósito de vivir plenamente según nuestro bautismo. Representa nuestra decisión de seguir a Jesús por María en el espíritu de los religiosos pero adaptado a la propia vocación. Esto requiere que seamos pobres (*un estilo de vida sencillo sin apegos materiales*), castos y obedientes por amor a Dios. En momentos de tentación, tomamos el escapulario en nuestras manos e invocamos la asistencia de la Madre, resueltos a ser fieles al Señor. Ella nos dirige hacia el Sagrado Corazón de su Hijo Divino y el demonio es forzado a retroceder vencido!
