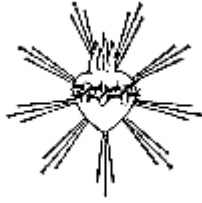

Although the Archdiocese immediately reports all abuse allegations to the appropriate County Prosecutor, it also encourages victims to independently report such matters to the Prosecutor. THIS SUNDAY'S GOSPEL.



Our own natural inclination most likely would be to react like the other ten Apostles and become vexed with James and John and to tell them what we thought of their selfish worldly ambitions. While no Christian today thinks that Christ came on earth in order to make us wealthy, happy and prosperous during our few years on earth, there are, unfortunately, many Christians who are unwilling to accept Christ's teaching that the way to heavenly glory is the way of the cross. "All this and heaven too" is their motto. It would, of course, be marvelous if all our days on earth were days of peace, happiness and prosperity to be followed by eternal happiness when we "shuffle off this mortal coil." But any man who has the use of reason sees that our world is inhabited by weak, sin-inclined and usually sinful mortals, himself included—weak mortals who can and do disturb the peace and harmony that could regulate our mortal lives. There are "accidents" on our roads and highways every day of the year, frequently causing death or grave injury to hundreds. The rules of the road, if kept by all, would prevent ninety-nine percent of such accidents—the other one percent are caused by mechanical failure. Would any man be so naive as to expect that we could have even one day free from car accidents? Because man has a free-will, he is liable to abuse it by choosing what is sinful and wrong. Most of the crosses and trials we meet in life are caused by violations—by ourselves and others—of the rules of life and the laws of charity and justice. To prevent this abuse of free-will, God would have to deprive men of that essential gift which, with his intellect, makes him a man. Likewise, we could prevent all road accidents by removing the steering wheels from cars but then we would have no cars. Let us face the fact, almost all the hardships and sufferings which we have to bear in life, are caused by the unjust and uncharitable actions of our fellowmen and even God himself, following his own wise pattern of life for men on earth, cannot prevent such evil actions. Would God want to prevent all such injustices and all this inhumanity of man toward his fellowman? Not that he approves of it, much less causes it, but can he not have a purpose in permitting it? How would we, his children on earth, earn heaven if this world were an earthly paradise? What loving father would keep his children from school because they found it a hardship, and when they could be so happy playing at home all day and every day? School is absolutely necessary for those children's future, and it is because fathers are truly kind to their children that they compel them to undergo this temporary hardship. God is the kindest of fathers. He wants us all in heaven. He has mapped out the road which will lead us there. He allows these hardships to come our way so that we can prepare for our real future life. With James and John, let us tell our divine Lord that we are ready to follow him on the path to Calvary; that we are ready to drink the cup of sufferings which he drank and to be immersed in the sorrows which he endured. He went through all of this for us; we are doing it for our own sakes. He carried the real cross—ours is light when compared with his; furthermore, he will help us to bear our daily trial and struggles. How could any Christian become weary and fainthearted when he has Christ helping him on the road?

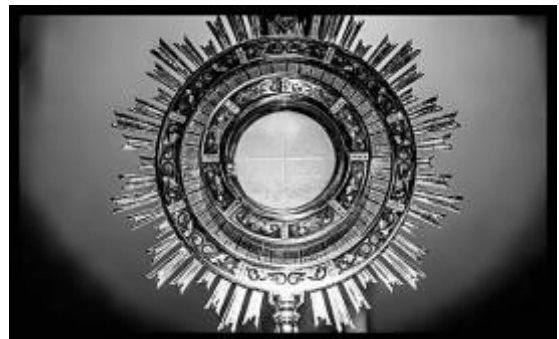

## OCTUBRE : MES DEL SANTO ROSARIO

*"Como las oraciones del Rosario provienen de tan excelentes fuentes - de Nuestro Señor mismo, de las Escrituras, y de la Iglesia - no es de extrañar que el Rosario es tan querido para nuestra Santísima Madre y poderoso en el cielo."*



Rezen el Rosario este Mes !

«El que quiera llegar a ser grande entre vosotros, será vuestro servidor»

Hoy, nuevamente, Jesús trastoca nuestros esquemas. Provocadas por Santiago y Juan, han llegado hasta nosotros estas palabras llenas de autenticidad: «Tampoco el Hijo del hombre ha venido a ser servido, sino a servir y a dar su vida» (Mc 10,45). ¡Cómo nos gusta estar bien servidos! Pensemos, por ejemplo, en lo agradable que nos resulta la eficacia, puntualidad y pulcritud de los servicios públicos; o nuestras quejas cuando, después de haber pagado un servicio, no recibimos lo que esperábamos. Jesucristo nos enseña con su ejemplo. Él no sólo es servidor de la voluntad del Padre, que incluye nuestra redención, ¡sino que además paga! Y el precio de nuestro rescate es su Sangre, en la que hemos recibido la salvación de nuestros pecados. ¡Gran paradoja ésta, que nunca llegaremos a entender! Él, el gran rey, el Hijo de David, el que había de venir en nombre del Señor, «se despojó de su grandeza, tomó la condición de esclavo y se hizo semejante a los hombres (...) haciéndose obediente hasta la muerte, y una muerte de cruz» (Fl 2,7-8). ¡Qué expresivas son las representaciones de Cristo vestido como un Rey clavado en cruz! En Cataluña tenemos muchas y reciben el nombre de "Santa Majestad". A modo de catequesis, contemplamos cómo servir es reinar, y cómo el ejercicio de cualquier autoridad ha de ser siempre un servicio. Jesús trastoca de tal manera las categorías de este mundo que también resitúa el sentido de la actividad humana. No es mejor el encargo que más brilla, sino el que realizamos más identificados con Jesucristo-siervo, con mayor Amor a Dios y a los hermanos. Si de veras creemos que «nadie tiene amor más grande que quien da la vida por sus amigos» (Jn 15,13), entonces también nos esforzaremos en ofrecer un servicio de calidad humana y de competencia profesional con nuestro trabajo, lleno de un profundo sentido cristiano de servicio. Como decía la Madre Teresa de Calcuta: «El fruto de la fe es el amor, el fruto del amor es el servicio, el fruto del servicio es la paz».

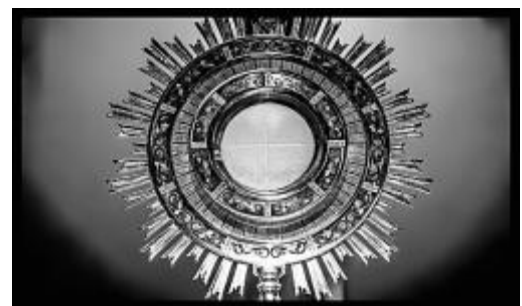
## EL ESCAPULARIO



En 1251, la Virgen María, acompañada de una multitud de ángeles, se apareció a San Simón Stock, General de los Carmelitas, con el escapulario de la Orden en sus manos, y le dijo: "Tú y todos los Carmelitas tendréis el privilegio, que quien muera con él no padecerá el fuego eterno"; es decir, quien muera con él, se salvará. El escapulario es un signo de nuestra identidad como católicos, vinculados de íntimamente a la Virgen María con el propósito de vivir plenamente según nuestro bautismo. Representa nuestra decisión de seguir a Jesús por María en el espíritu de los religiosos pero adaptado a la propia vocación. Esto requiere que seamos pobres (*un estilo de vida sencillo sin apegos materiales*), castos y obedientes por amor a Dios. En momentos de tentación, tomamos el escapulario en nuestras manos e invocamos la asistencia de la Madre, resueltos a ser fieles al Señor. Ella nos dirige hacia el Sagrado Corazón de su Hijo Divino y el demonio es forzado a retroceder vencido!
