

THIS SUNDAY'S GOSPEL



A proud Christian is surely a contradiction in terms. A Christian is a follower of Christ whose humility can never be equaled. He was God as well as man.

While on earth he emptied himself, as St. Paul puts it, of his divine glory so that he could be like one of us. A follower of Christ should not try to make display of gifts which are not his own, nor try to exalt himself above his neighbor because of something he has which was not given to his neighbor. If Christ wanted to be, and indeed was like the least one among us, we must never try to raise ourselves above our neighbor.

Love of neighbor is the second of the two essential commandments—there can be no true love of neighbor where there is pride. The second incident in today's Gospel story highlights true humility and true charity. The poor widow, forgetful of herself and of her own needs gave her all, her last penny, to help others who were in need. She made this sacrifice without publicity and without seeking the praise of her neighbors. It is this deep contrast between her outlook on life and on religion, and that of the Scribes in the first that connects the two incidents. While the Scribes sought to earn the respect and praise of their fellow-Jews—as well as all the financial gain they could come by—from the practice of the externals of their religion, this poor widow's religion was practiced in secret and it was to God alone that she looked for any reward that he might deign to give her. As we saw in today's first reading we can be sure that she was not left without the reward she deserved. The widow of Zarephath was given a temporal reward. The same generous God did not let the similar act of supreme generosity on the part of the widow in Jerusalem go unnoticed. Christ's judgment on the Scribes implies this: They will receive the greater condemnation for their pride, and abuse of religion for their own temporal gain. On the other hand the widow's religion was an act of complete self-renunciation: "she has put in everything she had, her whole living." We may never be called on to share our last morsel with a starving neighbor but if we are, we must remember that Christ gave his very life for us and has asked us to do likewise, if necessary. It may never be necessary for us to make this supreme act of self-renunciation. If, however, we are sincerely practicing our religion, we must be ever-ready to help a neighbor in need even if this cuts into our hard-earned reserves. The greater the sacrifice, the greater the reward.

The Holy Souls cannot help themselves because for them the night has come, when no man can work (John 9:4). It is our great privilege of charity that we can shorten their time of separation from God by our prayers, good works, and, especially, the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

### THE MIRACULOUS MEDAL

The Blessed Virgin Mary herself designed the Medal of the Immaculate Conception – popularly known as the *Miraculous Medal*.



Our Lady appeared to Saint Catherine Labouré in 1830 and, among other things that she said

to Saint Catherine, she requested the following: *“Have a medal struck upon this model. Those who wear it will receive great graces, especially if they wear it around the neck.”* With approval of the Church, the first Medals were made in 1832 and were distributed in Paris. Almost immediately the blessings that Mary had promised began to shower down on those who wore her Medal. The devotion spread like wildfire. Marvels of grace and health, peace and prosperity, followed in its wake. Before long people were calling it the “Miraculous” Medal. In 1836, a canonical inquiry undertaken at Paris declared the apparitions to be genuine. There is no superstition, nothing of magic, connected with the Miraculous Medal. The Miraculous Medal is not a “good-luck charm”. Rather, it is a great testimony to faith and the power of trusting prayer. Its greatest miracles are those of patience, forgiveness, repentance, and faith.



God uses a Medal, not as a sacrament, but as an agent, in bringing to pass certain marvelous results.

## NOVIEMBRE : MES DE LAS SANTAS ALMAS



Como un recordatorio de nuestro deber de orar por los fieles que sufren en el Purgatorio, la Iglesia ha dedicado el mes de Noviembre a las Santas Almas. Las Santas Almas son aquellas que han muerto en estado de gracia pero que todavía no están

libres de todo castigo debido a sus pecados veniales no perdonados, y todos los demás pecados ya perdonados por lo cual la satisfacción aún está por hacerse. Están seguros de entrar al Cielo, pero primero deben sufrir en el Purgatorio. Las Santas Almas no pueden ayudarse a sí mismas porque para ellas ha llegado la noche, cuando ningún hombre puede trabajar (Juan 9: 4).

Es nuestro gran privilegio de caridad en poder acortar su tiempo de separación de Dios mediante nuestras oraciones, buenas obras y, especialmente, el Santo Sacrificio de la Misa.

**«Todos han echado de lo que les sobraba, ésta, en cambio, ha echado de lo que necesitaba»**

Hoy, el Evangelio nos presenta a Cristo como Maestro, y nos habla del desprendimiento que hemos de vivir. Un desprendimiento, en primer lugar, del honor o reconocimiento propios, que a veces vamos buscando: «Guardaos de (...) ser saludados en las plazas, ocupar los primeros asientos en las sinagogas y los primeros puestos en los banquetes» (cf. Mc 12,38-39). En este sentido, Jesús nos previene del mal ejemplo de los escribas. Desprendimiento, en segundo lugar, de las cosas materiales. Jesucristo alaba a la viuda pobre, a la vez que lamenta la falsedad de otros: «Todos han echado de lo que les sobraba, ésta [la viuda], en cambio, ha echado de lo que necesitaba» (Mc 12,44). Quien no vive el desprendimiento de los bienes temporales vive lleno del propio yo, y no puede amar. En tal estado del alma no hay “espacio” para los demás: ni compasión, ni misericordia, ni atención para con el prójimo. Los santos nos dan ejemplo. He aquí un hecho de la vida de san Pío X, cuando todavía era obispo de Mantua. Un comerciante escribió calumnias contra el obispo. Muchos amigos suyos le aconsejaron denunciar judicialmente al calumniador, pero el futuro Papa les respondió: «Ese pobre hombre necesita más la oración que el castigo». No lo acusó, sino que rezó por él. Pero no todo terminó ahí, sino que —después de un tiempo— al dicho comerciante le fue mal en los negocios, y se declaró en bancarota. Todos los acreedores se le echaron encima, y se quedó sin nada. Sólo una persona vino en su ayuda: fue el mismo obispo de Mantua quien, anónimamente, hizo enviar un sobre con dinero al comerciante, haciéndole saber que aquel dinero venía de la Señora más Misericordiosa, es decir, de la Virgen del Perpetuo Socorro. ¿Vivo realmente el desprendimiento de las realidades terrenales? ¿Está mi corazón vacío de cosas? ¿Puede mi corazón ver las necesidades de los demás? «El programa del cristiano —el programa de Jesús— es un “corazón que ve”» (Benedicto XVI).

### MISAS PARA EL REPOSO DE ALMAS




