



THIS SUNDAY'S GOSPEL



How the wisdom of God differs from the wisdom of men! If a businessman of today (or even of the year 28 A.D.) were choosing a chairman and assistants for the world-wide enterprise he was about to set up, is it likely that he would choose them from among the unknown, unlettered fishermen of Galilee? Yet Christ, who was about to set up not only a world-wide institute but an everlasting one, chose these simple fishermen and made them his assistants and his successors in the work that he had taken in hand. And it wasn't that he was restricted in his choice. There were many highly educated priests and scribes in Jerusalem whom he could have won over, men who could preach and instruct so much more eloquently than Peter or Andrew. There were Roman officers in Palestine who were highly educated, and who would be much more eagerly listened to in the Gentile world. There were Greek philosophers whose very name would add prestige to the Gospel message had they been Apostles. Yet it was to none of these that Christ entrusted the arduous task of spreading the good news of the Gospel, it was to none of these that he gave the keys of his kingdom. Christ was not influenced in his judgement by external, accidental qualifications. He judged the heart and the will. He knew the true worth of men. Furthermore, the society that he was about to set up was not a worldly business concern but a free transport system to heaven. The truths he was committing to its keeping were not based on earthly wisdom which would require eloquence and prestige to bolster them up. They were the eternal, divine truths which needed no human propoganda, no help from mere men. Thus, in the selection of his Apostles, Christ has given us an extra proof, if one were needed, of his own divine wisdom and of the divine origin of the Christian religion which we profess. Our religion is not man-made, God is its author. While thanking God today for our Christian religion, with its clearly-drawn map of salvation, let us show our appreciation by doing our own little part, as humble apostles, weak but willing helpers of Christ. This we can do without eloquence, r personal prestige. We do so by living as true Christians in our homes, in our places of work, and in our recreations, by carrying our cross daily and patiently, ever ready to give a hand when the neighbor's cross seems too heavy for him. This will be Christian eloquence, this will be a true apostleship of Christ, because actions speak louder than words.

It could be for our world, our family, our city, our country, our Church, the sick, the dying, victims of violence,


for peace and understanding, the souls in purgatory, the helpless, the homeless, women contemplating an abortion, military personnel, EMS workers, to fight hunger, etc.

## FEBRERO: MES DE LA SAGRADA FAMILIA



Entre los acontecimientos que marcaron la Navidad y el comienzo de la vida pública de Cristo, la Iglesia recuerda el ejemplo de la Sagrada Familia para la emulación de la familia cristiana.

«En tu palabra, echaré las redes»



Hoy, el Evangelio nos ofrece el diálogo, sencillo y profundo a la vez, entre Jesús y Simón Pedro, diálogo que podríamos hacer nuestro: en medio de las aguas tempestuosas de este mundo, nos esforzamos por nadar contra corriente, buscando la buena pesca de un anuncio del Evangelio que obtenga una respuesta fructuosa... Y es entonces cuando nos cae encima, indefectiblemente, la dura realidad; nuestras fuerzas no son suficientes. Necesitamos alguna cosa más: la confianza en la Palabra de aquel que nos ha prometido que nunca nos dejará solos. «Maestro, hemos estado bregando toda la noche y no hemos pescado nada; pero, en tu palabra, echaré las redes» (Lc 5,5). Esta respuesta de Pedro la podemos entender en relación con las palabras de María en las bodas de Caná: «Haced lo que Él os diga» (Jn 2,5). Y es en el cumplimiento confiado de la voluntad del Señor cuando nuestro trabajo resulta provechoso. Y todo, a pesar de nuestra limitación de pecadores: «Aléjate de mí, Señor, que soy un hombre pecador» (Lc 5,8). San Ireneo de Lyon descubre un aspecto pedagógico en el pecado: quien es consciente de su naturaleza pecadora es capaz de reconocer su condición de criatura, y este reconocimiento nos pone ante la evidencia de un Creador que nos supera. Solamente quien, como Pedro, ha sabido aceptar su limitación, está en condiciones de aceptar que los frutos de su trabajo apostólico no son suyos, sino de Aquel de quien se ha servido como de un instrumento. El Señor llama a los Apóstoles a ser pescadores de hombres, pero el verdadero pescador es Él: el buen discípulo no es más que la red que recoge la pesca, y esta red solamente es efectiva si actúa como lo hicieron los Apóstoles: dejándolo todo y siguiendo al Señor (cf. Lc 5,11).


