Arrangements are to be made **one year** in advance.





THIS SUNDAY'S GOSPEL

It would at first sight appear that the demands that Christ makes on our charity here are any-



thing but easy. Loving one's enemies is asking a lot. Blessing them and praying for them might be all right for St. Francis but expecting it of us seems to be going very far. Asking for a blow on the second cheek while the first is still twinging with pain seems fit only for a martyr. Not to try to take tack what was stolen from us looks very foolish. Yet it was Christ who made all these demands. However, before we give up in despair, and decide that this type of Christianity is not for us, let us look a little more closely at the demands that are made. To love our enemy does not mean we must throw our arms about him every time we meet him (he would not let us anyway !). It means we must do all in our power to rid our minds of any hatred of him, and try to see the good that is in him. Not judging and condemning comes under this heading. Human sinful beings that we are, our faculty for seeing in our neighbor the real man as he is before God, is very limited and very prone to error. There are justly convicted robbers and murderers in our jails, in whom God can see a lot of goodness even now, and perhaps future citizens of heaven later on. Not demanding back what was unjustly taken from us does not mean that we may not have recourse to the legal or other means available to us for obtaining compensation in such cases. What it does forbid is personal (generally forceful) restoration of our rights and property. Another consoling point to bear in mind is that the vast majority of our fellowmen have no inclination to injure us in our person or our property and will never do so. If we feel we have a lot of enemies only waiting for the chance to pounce on us, we would do well to examine our own consciences very carefully and then look for the many good points there are in our neighbor's character. "An eye for an eye, a tooth for a tooth, life for life" was the practice amongst the Jews at the time of Christ and for centuries before (Ex. 21 :23-25). Christ sets up the "golden rule" of fraternal charity in place of this Law of Talon. Every man should truly love his neighbor for he is his brother. What is more, Christ's mission on earth has made him a son of God and an heir to heaven. Our chief interest in our neighbor must therefore be a spiritual interest. If he offends us, he offends God which is much more serious. Our charity should help him to seek God's forgiveness. That he should seek ours is of very minor importance in comparison with that. You would like your neighbour to help you to reach heaven. "You go and do likewise" to your neighbor, and you will both get there.

It could be for our world, our family, our city, our country, our Church, the sick, the dying, victims of violence,


for peace and understanding, the souls in purgatory, the helpless, the homeless, women contemplating an abortion, military personnel, EMS workers, to fight hunger, etc.

FEBRERO: MES DE LA SAGRADA FAMILIA

«Sed compasivos, como vuestro Padre es compasivo»



Hoy escuchamos unas palabras del Señor que nos invitan a vivir la caridad con plenitud, como Él lo hizo («Padre, perdónales porque no saben lo que hacen»: Lc 23,34). Éste ha sido el estilo de nuestros hermanos que nos han precedido en la gloria del cielo, el estilo de los santos. Han procurado vivir la caridad con la perfección del amor, siguiendo el consejo de Jesucristo: «Sed perfectos como es perfecto vuestro Padre celestial» (Mt 5,48). La caridad nos lleva a amar, en primer lugar, a quienes nos aman, ya que no es posible vivir en plenitud lo que leemos en el Evangelio si no amamos de verdad a nuestros hermanos, a quienes tenemos al lado. Pero, acto seguido, el nuevo mandamiento de Cristo nos hace ascender en la perfección de la caridad, y nos anima a abrir los brazos a todos los hombres, también a aquellos que no son de los nuestros, o que nos quieren ofender o herir de cualquier manera. Jesús nos pide un corazón como el suyo, como el del Padre: «Sed compasivos, como vuestro Padre es compasivo» (Lc 6,36), que no tiene fronteras y recibe a todos, que nos lleva a perdonar y a rezar por nuestros enemigos. Ahora bien, como se afirma en el Catecismo de la Iglesia, «observar el mandamiento del Señor es imposible si se trata de imitar desde fuera el modelo divino. Se trata de una participación vital y nacida del fondo del corazón, en la santidad, en la misericordia y en el amor de nuestro Dios». El Beato Newman escribía: «¡Oh Jesús! Ayúdame a esparcir tu fragancia dondequiera que vaya. Inunda mi alma con tu espíritu y vida. Penetra en mi ser, y hazte amo tan fuertemente de mí que mi vida sea irradiación de la tuya (...). Que cada alma, con la que me encuentre, pueda sentir tu presencia en mí. Que no me vean a mí, sino a Ti en mí». Amaremos, perdonaremos, abrazaremos a los otros sólo si nuestro corazón es engrandecido por el amor a Cristo.


