Arrangements are to be made **one year** in advance.



2019 LENTEN REGULATIONS

FOR THE ARCHDIOCESE OF NEWARK

• The days of both fast and abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (Holy Saturday night) as the Paschal Fast to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. The other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence.

On a day of fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted, and two (2) smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity.

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast.


On a day of abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.

• The obligation to observe the laws of fast and abstinence "substantially," or as a whole, is a serious obligation.

• The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty*) extends from the First Sunday of Lent, March 10, 2019 to the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity, June 16, 2019.

**Canon 920: All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.*

We wish you a prayerful, holy and fruitful Lenten season.

FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

The first reading is taken from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah, 43:16-21. Last week we heard of the conclusion of the exodus from Egypt; the first Passover celebration in the land of Canaan. This week we look forward to a



a new exodus that God promises through the prophet Isaiah. The new exodus promises to be far more wonderful than the first. God promises to restore His people after they have suffered in exile. The second reading is from the Letter of St.

Paul to the Philippians, 3:8-14, and is a warning to the Philippians about false teachers; Judaizers who would try to hang on to the old ways while at the same time claiming to be

Christians. The Judaizers taught that in order to be a Christian, you first had to be a Jew: to be circumcised and to obey all 613 Old Covenant commandments. This question, whether or not Gentile converts to Christianity must first become full and legal Jews, prompted the Council of

Jerusalem. The Gospel is from St. John, 8:1-11 and is about the woman caught in adultery. "The two of them were left on their own, the wretched woman and Mercy. But the Lord, having smitten them with the dart of injustice, does not even deign to watch them go but turns his gaze away from them and once more writes on the ground with his finger. But when the woman was left alone and they had all gone, he lifted up his eyes to the woman. We have already heard the voice of justice; let us now hear the voice of gentleness. I think that woman was the more terrified when she heard the Lord say, 'Let him who is without sin among you be the first to throw a stone at her,' . . . fearing now that she would be punished by him, in whom no sin could be found. But he, who had driven away her adversaries with the tongue of justice, now looking at her with the eyes of gentleness, asks her, 'Has no one condemned you?' She replies, 'No one, Lord.' And he says, 'Neither do I condemn you; I who perhaps you feared would punish you, because in me you have found no sin.' Lord, can it be that you favour sinners? Assuredly not. See what follows: 'Go and sin no more.'

Therefore, the Lord also condemned sin, but not the woman' (St Augustine, In Ioann. Evang., 33, 5-6). Jesus, who is the just One, does not condemn the woman; whereas these people are sinners, yet they pass sentence of death. God's infinite mercy should move us always to have compassion on those who commit sins, because we ourselves are sinners and in need of God's forgiveness. *The Navarre Bible – St. John*


OFFERING MASSES FOR THE REPOSE OF SOULS





«Tampoco yo te condeno»



Hoy vemos a Jesús «escribir con el dedo en la tierra» (Jn 8,6), como si estuviera a la vez ocupado y divertido en algo más importante que el escuchar a quienes acusan a la mujer que le presentan porque «ha sido sorprendida en flagrante adulterio» (Jn 8,3). Llama la atención la serenidad e incluso el buen humor que vemos en Jesucristo, aún en los momentos que para otros son de gran tensión. Una enseñanza práctica para cada uno, en estos días nuestros que llevan velocidad de vértigo y ponen los nervios de punta en un buen número de ocasiones. La sigilosa y graciosa huida de los acusadores, nos recuerda que quien juzga es sólo Dios y que todos nosotros somos pecadores. En nuestra vida diaria, con ocasión del trabajo, en las relaciones familiares o de amistad, hacemos juicios de valor. Más de alguna vez, nuestros juicios son erróneos y quitan la buena fama de los demás. Se trata de una verdadera falta de justicia que nos obliga a reparar, tarea no siempre fácil. Al contemplar a Jesús en medio de esa “jauría” de acusadores, entendemos muy bien lo que señaló santo Tomás de Aquino: «La justicia y la misericordia están tan unidas que la una sostiene a la otra. La justicia sin misericordia es crueldad; y la misericordia sin justicia es ruina, destrucción». Hemos de llenarnos de alegría al saber, con certeza, que Dios nos perdona todo, absolutamente todo, en el sacramento de la confesión. En estos días de Cuaresma tenemos la oportunidad magnífica de acudir a quien es rico en misericordia en el sacramento de la reconciliación. Y, además, para el día de hoy, un propósito concreto: al ver a los demás, diré en el interior de mi corazón las mismas palabras de Jesús: «Tampoco yo te condeno» (Jn 8,11).
