

## ALL HALLOWS' DAY

All Hallows' Day, the Solemnity of All Saints, or All Saints' Day is a celebration of all Catholic saints held on November 1 each year. "On this solemnity, we recall the holy men and women who, having completed their earthly journeys, now live forever with God. These saints, though not canonized, offer us models of abiding faith and love of God and neighbor" (Essential Guide to Seasons and Saints, 109).

In the Catholic Church, we are called to imitate and venerate saints because of their heroically virtuous lives, martyrdom, or their offering of life for others. But, what does veneration mean and why do we pray to the saints?

Veneration of the saints fosters our faith in God and does not detract from it. Rather, our faith in God is strengthened by our relationship with our brothers and sisters in the faith who are in heaven. The Church teaches that by imitating the virtues lived by the saints, the saints brings us closer to Christ. When we ask the saints to pray for us, we ask them to join their wills with the will of God and intercede for us here on earth. This is the Communion of Saints which we profess every Sunday in the Creed.

## PRAYER FOR THE DEAD

**The Commemoration of All Faithful Departed falls on November 2 each year.**

**Say a prayer for the dead in your family and community:**

*In your hands, O Lord, we humbly entrust our brothers and sisters. In this life you embraced them with your tender love; deliver them now from every evil and bid them eternal rest.*

*The old order has passed away: welcome them into paradise, where there will be no sorrow, no weeping or pain, but fullness of peace and joy with your Son and the Holy Spirit forever and ever. Amen.*



## SECOND COLLECTION: WORLD MISSION SUNDAY

In 1926 Pope Pius XI instituted Mission Sunday for the whole Church with the first worldwide Mission Sunday collection taking place in October 1927. This day is celebrated in all the local Churches as the feast of catholicity and universal solidarity so Christians the world over will recognize their common responsibility with regard to the evangelization of the world.

## SINODO SOBRE LA SINODALIDAD PARTE II

El Cardenal Tobin inauguró el Sínodo 2021-2023 el 17 de octubre con una hermosa celebración eucarística. Representantes de todas las parroquias de la Arquidiócesis, órdenes religiosas y la Comunidad de Sordos, junto con nuestra comunidad parroquial se reunieron para presenciar este evento histórico. Es asombroso pensar que todas las diócesis del mundo celebraron la apertura del Sínodo ese mismo día. Toda la iglesia universal unida en un solo espíritu pidiendo a Dios un nuevo Pentecostés en nuestra iglesia hoy.

El Cardenal en su homilía afirmó que “el sínodo nos recuerda que nos necesitamos, que caminamos juntos por el mismo camino”. El sínodo es una oportunidad para la Iglesia de renovación y de vivir nuestra sinodalidad en comunión, participación y misión. Estas tres palabras son las bases principales del sínodo.

**Comunión:** es lo que el Señor nos invita a ser como Iglesia, unida en él y unos con otros. Estar unidos no significa uniformidad, no buscamos uniformidad, sino unidad en la diversidad de carismas, culturas y pueblos convocados por el mismo Espíritu Santo que es el protagonista de este sínodo. Estamos llamados a estar unidos para tomar decisiones y poder escuchar al Espíritu Santo.

**Participación:** todos los bautizados están llamados a participar en este proceso de discernimiento y escucha, todos los hombres, mujeres, jóvenes, ancianos, personas sin hogar, encarcelados, confinados en casa, personas con necesidades especiales, niños, católicos no practicantes, aquellos que se sienten rechazados por la iglesia; todos estamos invitados a expresar nuestras preocupaciones, alegrías y tristezas, para permitir que el Espíritu Santo se mueva en nosotros.

**Misión:** identifica la actividad de la iglesia. La iglesia es enviada, eso es lo que significa misión, salir a predicar el evangelio de Jesucristo. Dar testimonio al mundo de nuestro encuentro con Cristo en nuestras vidas, no para imponer nuestra fe a los demás, sino para compartir con alegría el tesoro que hemos encontrado en Jesús a través de la misión de la iglesia.

Comunión, participación y misión, así es como nosotros, la Iglesia, estamos llamados a vivir nuestra sinodalidad en el mundo. Permitir que se escuche la voz de todas las personas y permitir que el Espíritu Santo se mueva entre nosotros y nos transforme en la iglesia que Dios quiere que seamos en este milenio.

## SYNOD ON SYNODALITY — PART II

Cardinal Tobin opened the Synod 2021-2023 on the 17th of October with a beautiful Eucharistic Celebration. Representatives of all the parishes of the Archdiocese, religious orders, and the Deaf Community, together with our parish community gathered to witness this historic event. It is mind boggling to think that every single diocese in the world celebrated the opening of the Synod. The entire universal church united in one spirit asking God for a new Pentecost in our church today.

The Cardinal in his homily stated that “the synod reminds us that we need each other, that we walk together the same road”. The synod is an opportunity for the church for renewal and for living out our synodality in communion, participation, and mission. These three words are the guiding principles of the synod.

**Communion:** is what the Lord invites the church to be, united in him and with one another. To be united does not mean uniformity, we do not look for uniformity, but unity in the diversity of charism, culture, and peoples summoned by the same Holy Spirit who is the protagonist of this synod. We are called to be united to make decisions and be able to listen to the Holy Spirit.

**Participation:** all the baptized is called to participate in this process of discernment and listening, all men, women, youth, the elderly, the homeless, the incarcerated, the homebound, those with special needs, children, non-practicing Catholics, those who feel rejected by the church, all of us are invited to voice our concerns, joys, and sorrows, to allow the Holy Spirit move in us.

**Mission:** identifies the activity of the church. The church is sent out that’s what mission means, the going out to preach the gospel of Jesus Christ. To witness to the world our encounter with Christ in our lives, not to impose our faith unto others, but to share with joy the treasure we have found in Jesus through the mission of the church.

Communion, participation, and mission, this is how we, the church are called to live out our synodality in the world. Allowing the voice of all people to be heard and allowing the Holy Spirit to move in our midst and transform us into the church God wants us to be in this millennium.


## YOUNG ADULT VIRTUAL ROSARY


