
NATIONAL MARRIAGE WEEK

SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Josephine Bakhita

Feast Day: February 8th

The story of St. Josephine Bakhita (1869-1947) is a story that many people taken into slavery have experienced. Born in the Darfur region of Sudan, she was kidnapped at the age of 8 and sold into slavery many times. As she passed from owner to owner, she experienced the moral and physical humiliations associated with slavery. It was only at the age of 13 that her suffering was alleviated after she was bought for the Italian Consul in Sudan. It was here that she was fortunate to receive kindness, respect, and peace from her new master.

She was later handed over to the Canossian Sisters when she made the case that slavery had been outlawed in Italy for years. She was baptized and confirmed in the Catholic Church in 1890, where she took the name Josephine. She later entered the Institute of St. Magdalene of Canossa in 1893 and made her profession three years later.

St. Josephine Bakhita's next 50 years were spent serving people through cooking, sewing, embroidery, and housekeeping. She was a source of encouragement and her constant smile won people's hearts, as did her humility and simplicity. Today she is known as the patron saint of victims of modern slavery and human trafficking.

INTO THE DEEP

Dr. Scott Hahn Reflects on the 5th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Simon Peter, the fisherman, is the first to be called personally by Jesus in Luke's Gospel.

His calling resembles Isaiah's commissioning in the First Reading: confronted with the holiness of the Lord, both Peter and Isaiah are overwhelmed by a sense of their own sinfulness and inadequacy. Yet each experiences the Lord's forgiveness and is sent to preach the good news of His mercy to the world.

No one is "fit to be called an apostle," Paul recognizes in today's Epistle. But by "the grace of God," even a persecutor of the Church—as Paul once was—can be lifted up for the Lord's service.

In the Old Testament, humanity was unfit for the divine—no man could stand in God's presence and live (see Exodus 33:20). But in Jesus, we're made able to speak with Him face-to-face, to taste His Word on our tongue.

Today's scene from Isaiah is recalled in every Mass. Before reading the Gospel, the priest silently asks God to cleanse his lips that he might worthily proclaim His Word.

God's Word comes to us as it came to Peter, Paul, Isaiah, and today's Psalmist—as a personal call to leave everything and follow Him, to surrender our weaknesses in order to be filled with His strength.

Simon put out into deep waters even though, as a professional fisherman, he knew it would be foolhardy to expect to catch anything. In humbling himself before the Lord's command, he was exalted—his nets filled to overflowing; later, as Paul tells us, he will become the first to see the risen Lord.

Jesus has made us worthy to receive Him in the company of angels in God's holy Temple. On our knees like Peter, with the humility of David in today's Psalm, we thank Him with all our hearts and join in the unending hymn that Isaiah heard around God's altar: "Holy, holy, holy . . ." (see also Revelation 4:8).

MAR ADENTRO

Dr. Scott Hahn reflexiona sobre el 5° Domingo de Tiempo Ordinario

Simón Pedro, el pescador, es el primero a quien Jesús llama personalmente en el Evangelio de San Lucas.

Su llamada se asemeja a la que narra la primera lectura, refiriéndose a Isaías. Confrontados con la santidad de Dios, tanto Pedro como Isaías se sienten abrumados al saberse indignos y pecadores. Sin embargo, cada uno experimenta el perdón del Señor y es enviado a predicar la buena nueva de su misericordia al mundo.

Nadie tiene la talla necesaria para ser llamado apóstol, reconoce Pablo en la epístola de hoy. Pero "por la gracia de Dios" hasta incluso un perseguidor de la Iglesia –como él mismo lo fue- puede ser elevado para el servicio del Señor.

En el Antiguo Testamento, la humanidad era incapaz de lo divino; ningún hombre podía pararse en la presencia de Dios y sobrevivir (cfr. Ex 33, 20). Pero en Jesús somos capaces de hablar con Él cara a cara, de saborear en nuestra boca su Palabra.

La escena que hoy presenta Isaías se recuerda en cada misa. Antes de leer el Evangelio, el sacerdote pide silenciosamente a Dios que le purifique los labios para que anuncie dignamente su Palabra.

La Palabra de Dios viene a nosotros como vino a Pedro, a Pablo, a Isaías y al salmista de hoy: como una llamada personal a dejarlo todo y seguirlo a Él, a entregarle nuestra debilidad para llenarnos de su fuerza.

Simón, pescador experto, sabía que era iluso pensar que atraparían algo; pero se adentró en el mar. Humillándose ante el mandato del Señor, fue luego exaltado y sus redes desbordadas. Después, nos dice Pablo, sería el primero en ver al Señor resucitado.

Jesús nos ha hecho merecedores de recibirle en compañía de sus ángeles, en el templo santo de Dios. De rodillas como Pedro, con la humildad de David en el salmo de hoy, le agradecemos de corazón y nos unimos al himno interminable que Isaías escuchó junto al altar de Dios: "Santo, santo, santo. (Apoc 4,8)"
