Saint Rose of Lima Parish Patroness

Saint Rose of Lima (1586-1617), Patroness of the Americas, Peru, Philippines and India, is the first canonized saint of the New World. She was born in Lima, Peru on April 20, 1586. Her father was a Spanish businessman, Gaspar de Flores and her mother, Maria d'Olivia, was a mestiza of Spanish and Incan ancestry. The tenth of thirteen children, she was baptized Isabel De Flores Y Del Oliva. Because she had lovely rose-colored cheeks, everyone called her "Rose." In 1597 she chose Rose as her confirmation name. As a child, she was remarkable for her great reverence and pronounced love for all things relating to God.

After reading a biography of Saint Catherine of Siena, Rose decided to take that Saint as her model. Thus, in imitation of Saint Catherine, she spent many hours in prayer before the Blessed Sacrament. Though exquisitely beautiful, she refused to marry, and while helping support her family by needlework and growing flowers, she practiced heroic charity. At the age of twenty she became a Dominican Tertiary and continued to live in her parent's home. Rose tenderly cared for the sick, even those with repulsive wounds, and she often obtained miraculous cures for people from the Child Jesus. On other occasions, she worked miracles in order to feed the members of her family and became known as "Mother of the Poor."

Rose continually prayed, fasted and offered her sufferings for the conversion of the Incas. In 1615, through her prayers, the Blessed Sacrament and the people of Lima were spared being attacked by a fleet of Dutch Pirates.

Rose was a friend and confidant of Saint Martin de Porres, who lived in the same city. Martin, also a Dominican, was a great support and comfort to her. Her love for Jesus was so great that when she talked about Him her face glowed. Her mystical experiences caused an ecclesiastical inquiry.

Rose, like many saints, had a special relationship with nature. She also had a natural talent for singing and composed a song in praise of God. She sang this song many times during the last three years of her life while experiencing a very painful illness. Legend tells us that at sunset a small bird came to her window and accompanied her as she sang the verses of her song-prayer.

Though she died in 1617 at the early age of 31, Rose's love of God was so intense that she was recognized as a saint in her own lifetime. Many miracles and conversions attributed to her intercession soon followed her death. She was canonized by the Church just fifty-four years later in 1671.

Saint Rose of Lima has captured the imagination of the world and stands as one of the most popular saints in the history of the Church. The Feast of Saint Rose is celebrated on August 23rd.

On May 26, the Diocese of Trenton announced a set of protocol changes as the faithful are encouraged to return to in-church Masses. The revisions follow:

The Catholic Bishops of New Jersey have ended the dispensation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation effective Saturday, June 5-6, 2021, the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ. The faithful are to return to the practice of participating at weekly celebrations of Mass in-church.

This obligation does not apply to those who are ill, those who have reason to believe that they were recently exposed to the coronavirus or another serious or contagious illness, those who are confined to their home, a hospital or nursing facility, or those with serious underlying health conditions.

NJ Governor Phil Murphy lifted the mandates requiring the wearing of masks and social distancing for those who are fully vaccinated. Yet, recognizing that the COVID-19 pandemic remains active, wearing a mask is an option for those who wish to do so. Moreover, those who are not fully vaccinated are strongly encouraged to wear a mask. Limits on church capacity to pre-pandemic levels are lifted effective June 4, 2021.

General Information:

- All doors may be utilized for entrance and exit of the church, **but only if we have more ushers to assist all ALL Masses with the collection and Presentation of the Gifts, etc.**
- Collection basket will remain in the main entrance for the time being
- Barriers, tape and cords to maintain social distancing are removed
- Blessed water will be placed in fonts
- Hymnals will be placed in the pews
- Livestreaming Masses will continue for the homebound
- Music ministers will return to their ministry
- All ministers of communion should wear masks while distributing the Holy Eucharist
- Communion will be received in the hand only
- Holy Communion is to be distributed by the sacred host only, no cup.
- The Presentation of the Gifts will resume
- The Sign of Peace will resume
- Sanitizing of pews will continue
- Hand sanitizers will continue to be made available



B.C. Forbes founded *Forbes* magazine a century or so ago. *Forbes* is a magazine about money, business and wealth. Each year they publish a list of the wealthiest people in America.

Forbes compiled the first such list in 1918. There were only thirty people on the first list. It was called simply the Rich List. Rockefeller was number one on the list—the richest man in the world in 1918.

Forbes became wealthy writing about wealth; but listen to what else he had to say. He said, “Don’t forget until too late that the business of life is not business but living.”

This man who had dedicated so much of his life to money knew that there was more to life than money. He understood money and how it works. He had become rich. But he warned us not to focus so intently on money that we miss that which is important in life.

I was surprised to read that, because B.C. Forbes spent his life as the chronicler of business—as the voice of capitalism. His remark sounds almost anti-business and anti-capitalist, but it was not anti-anything. It was simply a reminder that, as important as our daily bread might be, there are even more important things.

Forbes was simply reminding us to lift our nose from the grindstone now and then, so that we might smell the roses or see the sunset.

But Jesus said it first and said it better when He said, “Don’t work for the food which perishes, but for the food which remains to eternal life.”

Couples must register through their home parish. The registration deadline for all anniversary couples is September 15, 2021.










Cohort Youth Group – LIFT Team

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul is a non-profit, all volunteer organization dedicated to helping individuals and families in the local community through the works of kindness and generosity. In 2002, the chapter in St. Rose of Lima was formed. It would be impossible to recount all the families and individuals who have benefitted from the support by the Society. The greatest satisfaction we receive is by being able to help those in need and not by counting how many people we did help.

Our St. Vincent de Paul is funded yearly by the second collection held at the end of September, which is the Feast of St. Vincent de Paul, and by those who use our SVDP envelopes. Since the onset of the pandemic we have not been able to have our annual Simple Supper Fundraiser, which by the way, we make the most delicious and hearty vegetable soup (ask anyone who has attended the Simple Supper).

We put up a Giving Tree at Christmas Time to supply gifts for infants, children and the elderly. Assistance is given to the poor with donated clothing, winter coats, household items, toys, stuffed animals and furniture. We provide medical assistance, such as payments for prescriptions. We have prevented eviction of families, we have prevented NJ Natural Gas shut offs, and we have prevented JCPL electricity shut offs for many years. We do not pay the entire bill; we work with the families and the utilities. When this pandemic shut off rules cease, a lot of families will be in trouble.

Parishioner and community support are essential to the SVDP Society's achieving its goal to help our neighbors in need. We rely upon monetary donations. No federal, state or church money is received. One hundred percent of the donations we receive are used for the benefit of the neighbors we serve. The use of our SVDP envelopes has been almost nonexistent, except for a very few faithful contributors.

The members of the Society wish to thank all who financially support our cause and ask if all of you will please consider assisting those in our community who are in need. If you can see your way clear to donate to us, it would be greatly appreciated by us AND those we help. Thank you does not seem enough to express the deep gratitude

that our Vincentian family feels for the help we receive in support of our mission to help those in need. Please keep us in your prayers as we continue in our mission of helping others.



Forbes fundó la revista Forbes hace aproximadamente un siglo. Forbes es una revista acerca de dinero, negocios y riqueza. Cada año publican una lista de las personas más ricas de Estados Unidos.

Forbes compiló la primera lista de este tipo en 1918. Solo había treinta personas en la primera lista. Se la llamó simplemente la Lista de los ricos. Rockefeller era el número uno en la lista: el hombre más rico del mundo en 1918.

El 26 de mayo, la diócesis de Trenton anuncio una serie de cambios en el protocolo ya que se anima a los feligreses a regresar a las Santas Misas en la Iglesia. Las revisiones siguen:
