Stories THAT UPLIFT

(Luke 4:21-30)
Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Martin Luther King, Jr. had a dream that one day, on the red hills of Georgia, the sons of former slaves and the sons of former slave owners would be able to sit down together at the table of brotherhood. He had a dream that one day his four children would not be judged by the color of their skin, but by the content of their character.

With this faith, he believed people could turn the mountain of despair into the mountain of hope, and transform the jangling discords of the nation into a beautiful symphony.

In his preaching for liberation, he did not say anything new. His message was 2000 years old—as old as Jesus' synagogue speech at Nazareth. Martin Luther King, Jr. said, "We hold it to be self-evident, that all people are created equal," but he saw that people were not treated as equals. So, he went from city to city and said, "Today is the day when we will take seriously the Gospel and our own Declaration of Independence."

Gunshots rang out and cut him down. Why? What radical act did he commit which took his life?

In the tradition of the Bible's prophets, he reminded people of what they already knew and said, "Today is the day." He drew inspiration from the message of total liberation preached by Jesus in his inaugural address at Nazareth and met with the same fate as Jesus did.



The Presentation of the Lord

On February 2, the Church celebrates the Presentation of the Lord in the temple at Jerusalem. This feast occurs forty days after the celebration of the birth of Jesus. On this day, we reflect upon the Christ Child's revelation as "a light to the gentiles" through the words of Simeon and the testimony of Anna the prophetess. (Luke 2:22-38)

In celebration of "Christ our Light," the Church blesses candles that will be used throughout the year on this feast. For this reason, the feast is also known as Candlemas. All those who wish to have candles blessed for use at home are invited to bring them to the 8:30 AM Mass on Wednesday, February 2.

Reflection: So many times, we cry out to God: How long, O Lord? How Long? We pray for the Lord's presence in the world and in our lives. Pope Paul VI wrote to us about the message and significance of the candle..."Christ himself says, 'I am the light of the world." And we are the light, we ourselves, if we receive it from him...But how do we receive it, how do we make it shine? The candle tells us: by burning and being consumed in the burning...a spark of fire, a ray of love, an inevitable immolation is celebrated over that pure, straight candle, as pouring forth its gift of light...it exhausts itself in silent sacrifice." Jesus tells us I am the light and you are the light. Accepting this in faith, we see Christ as a light in the world and in others around us as Christ's light in the world. Turn to each other in faith and let your light shine brighter than any of these candles. And, let that Light of Christ conquer all darkness...a Light to reveal You to the nations and the glory of Your people..."

FEAST OF ST. BLAISE

Thursday, February 3, is the Feast of St. Blaise. Throats will be blessed at the 8:30 morning Mass and after all the weekend Masses, February 5/6.

Little is known about St. Blaise other than he was the Bishop of Sebaste in Armenia in the early fourth century. Legend tells the story of an anxious mother who hurried to St. Blaise with her little son who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. Saint Blaise called for two candles, lit them, held them in the form of a cross under the child's chin, recited prayers and blessed the boy. Immediately, the bone loosened and was removed.

One reason for St. Blaise's popularity arose from the fact he was a physician who was known for performing miraculous cures. Therefore, those who were sick, especially with throat ailments, invoked his intercession. That is why on his Feast Day we have our throats blessed and ask him to protect us from all evil, physical, spoken and spiritual, which may attack the throat.



The Co-Cathedral of St. Robert Bellarmine presents a teaching and exposition of Sacred Relics on Wednesday, February 16 at 6:30 pm. Father Carlos Martins, a Vatican-appointed expert on relics will be here with an extraordinary Vatican collection of over 150 relics, some as old as 2,000 years. Among the treasures will be relics of St. Joseph, St. Maria Goretti, St. Therese of Lisieux (the "Little Flower"), St. Francis of Assisi, St. Anthony of Padua, St. Thomas Aquinas, and St. Faustina Kowalska. There will also be a portion of the Veil of Our Lady and one of the largest remaining pieces of the True Cross in the world. Those in attendance will be able to examine and venerate each relic. Throughout history, many healings have been worked in the presence of relics; and thousands have occurred through this ministry. Do not miss this opportunity. If you have been sexually abused as a minor by a member of the clergy or anyone representing the Catholic Church, or if you know of someone who was, you can report that abuse through the diocesan **ABUSE HOTLINE: 1-888-296-2965** or via e-mail at .abuseline@dioceseoftrenton.org.

The Diocese of Trenton reports any allegations of sexual abuse to the appropriate law enforcement agencies. Anyone with an allegation is also encouraged to provide that information to local law enforcement authorities.

HAITI How can You Make a Difference ?

The riots in Haiti are making life even more difficult for our brothers and sisters as streets close and rampant destruction causes mayhem in the capital, Port-Au-Prince. Although our friends in Fond Pierre are not subjected to the violence and unrest, they are negatively impacted by the economic fall-out from the disturbances. Father Daisma also wanted to thank you on behalf of the people of Fond-Pierre for your past generous support.

The focus of our twinning relationship with St. Peter's Church, which spans over a decade, continues to be the education of the more than 360 students that make up the parochial school. The total cost to pay for the 16 teachers, 3 canteen cooks, 1 secretary



and 1 guard's salaries amount to about \$14,000 for the entire year. Three years ago, we began a program whereby St. Rose parishioners could choose to sponsor the monthly salary of one teacher at a cost of \$100 per month.

We graciously thank all those who participated. We are once again asking for sponsorship of one teacher's salary at possibly the \$100 level. Alternatively, we ask that you prayerfully consider a one-time sacrificial donation. Your donation will provide the school children with the tools they need, give them hope, and will set the foundation for a brighter future. We are mindful that your personal financial situation will

dictate whether a monthly or one-time contribution is appropriate. Rest assured, however, that whether your support is monetary or spiritual, the young people of Fond Pierre and their educators are forever grateful that strangers are willing to sacrifice of themselves to give them an opportunity to lead a fulfilled life.

SANTA TERESITA DEL NIÑO JESUS

Cada primero de octubre se celebra su festividad, ella es la patona Universal de las misiones.

Santa Teresita dispuso que hubiera numerosos conventos y renovó a la iglesia.

El milagro que ella hizo con sus oraciones fue curar enfermos, por ejemplo, la curación de un joven seminarista llamado Charles Anne que fue víctima de hemoptisis pulmonar.

Fue bautizada dos días después de su nacimiento en la iglesia de Nuestra Señora de Alenzón.

A los 7 años en 1880 Teresa se confiesa por primera vez a los ocho años y medio. El 3 de octubre de 1881 Teresa entro en el colegio de las Benedictinas en Lisieux.

En diciembre de 1882 la salud de Teresa empiezo a empeorar de manera extraña, sufría continuamente de dolores de cabeza, dolores en el costado, comia poco y duermia mal. Se convirtió en monja del Carmelo para orar por todos los pecadores.

El 10 de enero de 1889 tomo los hábitos de la orden en la capilla del monasterio en presencia de su padre, hermanos y resto de la familia. En la misma ceremonia además de recibir el velo de novicia también se cambio su nombre por el de Teresa del Nino Jesús y de la Santo Rostro.

Durante la Cuaresma de 1896 mientras hacia los ejercicios espirituales y ayuno en la noche del jueves y viernes Santo sufrió su primer ataque de hemoptisis. También en ese mismo año la invadió una oscuridad interior, con relación a la fe que la atormento por años hasta punto que de querer morir de amor por Jesús. "Para mi orar consiste en elevar el corazón, en levantar los ojos al cielo, en manifestar mi gratitud y mi amor lo mismo en el gozo que en la prueba."

En enero 1897 escribio "yo creo que mi carrera no durara mucho tiempo."

El primer milagro fue curar a los enfermos y el segundo milagro fue religioso. Luis de San German sufría de una infección del estómago ya muy avanzada para una cirugía.

Teresa dejo 21 oraciones, 8 recreaciones piadosas y uno de los clásicos espirituales más famosos. La "Historia de un alma" que fue traducida a 42 idiomas.

En julio 1897 cuando ya estaba en sus últimos meses a su hermana Paulina le dice que su confianza en Dios se debe a que ella se debía a que ella sido preservada del pecado mortal. En la monumental Basílica que fue construida en su honor, en el cementerio reposaron sus restos mortales durante 26 años.


