



Gospel Meditation

We need history. We need it in order to understand ourselves, personally and collectively. The pieces of our histories may not have always been the most positive, honest, exemplary, dignified, proud and best moments of our lives, but they are ours. We have to acknowledge, remember, accept, and often heal them. We cannot forget them or pretend that they never existed. As horrible as the atrocities of events like Auschwitz, brutal injustices committed throughout the human journey, or personal painful experiences in our own stories, we need to remember. These times when humanity in general or people in particular have lost their way are times that need to be reconciled and redeemed.

If we lose the memories, we will make the same mistakes again. The human soul needs a strong sense of affirmation, direction, and clear purpose. Without these essentials, we will easily run amuck and repeat the sins of our past. God's voice throughout history has spoken precisely about this! We are reminded through the voices and example of many prophets and witnesses not to make the same mistakes again, come back to center, discover the purpose given to us by God, maintain a sense of proper direction, seek healing for wounds and be reconciled to our Creator.



Baptism is so incredibly important for the salvation of humankind, not only eternally but here and now. Our existence depends upon it. It gives us the affirmation we need from God by gifting us with the same intimate relationship Jesus had with the Father. We are blessed with the direction and clear purpose we need in order to be productive stewards and faithful Christians. Baptism calls us to remember, accept, and deal with the sins and inequities of our past regardless of how hurtful and serious. We consciously choose to turn away from them and put on the new life of Christ. To do this well, we must look hard and long at our sins and failings, listen to what they are saying and learn from them. If we ignore the past, collectively or personally, or pretend that it never happened, we will never grow. We will surely die.

People need to hear the message, lived and spoken, delivered by the baptized members of the Body of Christ. It is an essential message of hope that is layered with visions of justice, peace, reconciliation, redemption, blessing, and healing. It is a message that helps us remember what has gone before, the graces and the sins, and bring ourselves by God's help where we need to be. We are called to do much more than sit home behind our closed doors. We have a message to deliver. Are we ready to do so?



Getting to Know the DCJM

From November 13th to December 13th the three first year novices, Br. Miguel Ruiz, Br. Stephen Suddjian, and Br. Mark Lederhos completed one of the three main months of the first year of their novitiate: the month of helping in a hospital. The hospital that they helped in was located in Las Hurdes, in western Spain about 20 miles from the border of Portugal. Las Hurdes historically is one of the poorest areas in Spain. When the hospital was built in 1952 there was no road and all the materials had to be carried from the nearest city, a feat that in and of itself required help from on high. However, the divine providence didn't end with the completion of the hospital, it just got started.

The thing that sets this hospital apart from any other hospital is the group of nuns that devote their lives to the service of it. The Servidoras de Jesús del Cottolengo del Padre Alegre is an order like that of none other. They rely solely on the providence of God in order to run the 9 hospitals they have around the world. They receive no governmental help, no monthly donations from the faithful, they don't sell any goods and do not ask for anything from anyone. The way in which they live is by relying on Divine Providence through the adventitious actions of the people God works through to support them. From unknown people showing up to the hospital with the exact money they need to pay bills to the water company shutting off their neighbor's water instead of their own after defaulting on a month's payment, God not only sustains the Cottolengo Hospitals, He helps them to thrive. Br. Stephen says that the part of the month most impactful for him was being able to witness the work of this Divine Providence and see the immense joy that came from this trust in God.

Instead of being in constant fear of where their next meal or payment for electricity would come from, the nuns surrender themselves to Christ and trust in Him to take care of their needs. This trust in God extends beyond the nuns to the patients themselves; many of which, through the example of the nuns, learn that despite the illnesses they may have, be them physical, mental, or emotional, to put their trust in God and see their crosses as blessings. The humility of both the nuns and the patients at the hospital is something that stood out to Br. Miguel throughout the month. "God is humble and loves us. He will help us and take care of all of our needs." Miguel was also very humbled by the surrender of the nuns to the will of God. Everything that they receive is from the grace of God and to put one's trust in Him is to trust in something real and unwavering.



The novices ask for prayers during this time of their discernment and vocational journey and assure that the prayers will be going both ways. They would also like to wish all of their friends and family back home a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year! May this time of Christmas remind us all of the gift that Christ gave us in His coming down to Earth and the gift He continues to give us through the Eucharist.

The faith of these nuns and patients when written on paper seem to be super human or something only great saints are capable of, but the most resounding part of the month for Br. Mark was the immense humanity present in that hospital. He says that after a month in Cottolengo it's impossible to look at the world the same way. The way in which you learn to love the sick there through feeding them, cleaning them, and talking with them changes you in such a profound way that it's as though your glasses have been cleaned and you are able to see humanity and its intrinsic goodness and right to life. While the three brothers were there, they performed a small talent show filled with guitar, piano, and magic tricks. It was one of the great highlights of the month for both them and the patients of the hospital. While performing for them some of the patients started dancing to the music and a smile was seen on the face of some of the patients whom the brothers had thought were incapable of smiling. The brothers learned that while they couldn't take away any of the crosses of the sick that were there, they could accompany them through it and bring joy to them. If there is one word that the novices could use to describe their time in helping in the hospital it would be JOY.


