Congress recently passed a massive stimulus bill that includes \$2.75 billion in aid for struggling private schools in the wake of the pandemic -- including our Catholic schools. This new funding is called the "Emergency Assistance to Non-Public Schools" (EANS) Program.

However, in order for our Catholic schools to obtain these funds, Governor Polis must apply for this money before February 8, 2021. If Gov. Polis fails to act, our Catholic schools, students, and families will miss this important source of help in a very difficult school year.

Dear Parish Family,

I contact you today with hope and prayers that you and your family are happy and healthy. The new year has begun with some troublesome events but we know that God is still on His throne! I would like to update you on the current status of the 2021 Gift of Treasure campaign that we began in November.

First, I'd like to share a brief reminder of why we give. In scripture, God asks us to give of our time, talent, and treasure, not because he has a need for these gifts, but because he knows that we need to give for our own happiness. Then, when he sees our response in love, he gives us even more of his love and grace. So, what begins as a gift from God, becomes a gift to God, and results in a greater outpouring of love and grace from God. Worship and Reflection

Gospel Meditation

It was a normal day by all accounts, but John just wasn't feeling himself. He was a little lightheaded and out of sorts. Later in the afternoon, he experienced a sharp pain in his chest and arm. Quick thinking and action brought John to the emergency department with a diagnosis of a significant heart attack. Surviving this ordeal, he found himself face to face with his cardiologist, having an honest conversation about things that needed to change. "I came close to death," John found himself thinking. Then came the remorse. He was a young man with a loving wife and children who were very close to facing life without him. John found himself with intense sorrow for living an unchecked and self-indulgent life that almost brought him to his demise. He wanted to change.



We all have our wake-up calls. We have experiences and encounters that force us to really think twice about choices we have made and directions we have taken. Often, we find ourselves looking at those we have hurt square in the eye and wallowing in our foolishness. We regrettably realize that we have allowed our needs to lure us into making some cruel mistakes. We impulsively say things and flippantly do things that reveal our unredeemed and unhealed self. It is a self we stumble over and try to tame but can't quite seem to master and control. Help!

We spin our wheels, naively thinking that we will somehow, perhaps through persistence, get ourselves unstuck. But, we don't. We just get out of the car, feeling very helpless, and ignorantly look at the mess we got ourselves into. Did we ever think to ask someone for help? Or, taken the advice of One who is wiser and avoid this route altogether? "Come after me," are words that Jesus says to all of us. In order to heed his invitation, we must leave our ego-self behind and follow.

When we really see and understand the freedom, peace, justice, and love he offers, we find ourselves with such sorrow in our hearts for how foolish and silly we have been. All the misguided choices and sinful actions come full view and we see how risky our random impassioned behaviors really have been. Repentance is beautiful. When done with a sincere and contrite heart, it directs us to the glory that can be ours, ignites us with the challenge of living a life in service of others and reminds us that all is well.


Second Reading: 1 Cor 7:29-31

The Gift of the Mass

What graces, gifts and virtues the Holy Mass calls down: repentance for sin, victory over temptation, holy inspirations, the grace of final perseverance, upon which depends our salvation, and temporal blessings, such as peace, abundance and health.

(St. Leonard of Port Maurice, 1676–1751)

Why Should You Offer a Mass?

The Church has a long tradition of offering Masses for the living and the deceased. But why should we offer Masses for our loved ones? What is the benefit?

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches us that, “The Eucharistic sacrifice is... offered for the faithful departed who ‘have died in Christ but are not yet wholly purified,’ so that they may be able to enter into the light and peace of Christ” (1371). This idea of offering Masses for the atonement of sins after someone has passed away is also found in 2 Maccabees 12:43-45:

He then took up a collection among all his soldiers, amounting to two thousand silver drachmas, which he sent to Jerusalem to provide for an expiatory sacrifice... Thus he made atonement for the dead that they might be absolved from their sin.

But it is also beneficial to offer Masses for our loved ones who are still alive, and for ourselves. According to St. Anselm (1033–1109), “A single Mass offered for oneself during life may be worth more than a thousand celebrated for the same intention after death.”

So, whether we are offering Masses for our deceased loved ones, or for those who are still with us, the reason we offer a Mass is the same: because we want them to be united eternally with God.

Put this body anywhere. Do not let care about it disturb you. I ask only this: that you remember me at the altar of the Lord, wherever you may be.


