First Vows of Br. Joseph Paolucci

“How can I repay the Lord for all the great good done for me?” (Ps 116)

And the psalm continues, “I will lift up the cup of salvation and call on the name of the Lord.” First vows are a time to recognize the many blessings that God has given me through many years of His faithfulness.

First of all, I want to recognize the gift that my family has been in my life. I am one of 8 kids among a big extended family. My dad, mom, and seven siblings have been fundamental in my relationship with the Lord. Our parents instilled in us early on the way of living a friendship with Christ. From an early age we also learned that the best gift or toy we could have were our other siblings. My four brothers and three sisters have been the ones that showed me how to concretely live the friendship with Christ that our parents taught us. Going to adoration, praying the rosary, having conversations on the faith life, raising their children in the faith that they have lived: the family was the foundation of my faith life.

One of the values I learned as a young boy was to be open to God’s will for my life. I decided that I would be open to the priesthood if that was God’s will. When I was 11 at the FOCUS 11 spiritual encounter with St. Mary’s at the Carmelite monastery, I received my first questioning of whether I was open to becoming a priest. In a letter I sent to the then Br. Juan Espino, I told him that I was open to the priesthood.

In my freshman year of high school at Steubenville of the Rockies, my openness to the priesthood was put to its first test at the calling to everyone open to the priesthood and religious life at the end of the conference. I stood and went forward with many other young people despite the fear and shame of what my friends were thinking.

I continued with an “openness” to the priesthood in high school, yet I often closed that willingness to be open “only if I received something really clear”. With Fr. Luis’ help in spiritual direction and my parents’ and siblings’ example, I maintained a prayer life often going to the adoration chapel and to daily mass at least once a week. I also went to a few Kairos events (when I couldn’t use the excuse of having football or lacrosse practice) that showed me that the priesthood could be a fruitful option for my life. In my senior year of high school I had decided to go to Benedictine college to continue to continue the friendships I had built in high school.



Then the Lord used the small door I had left open to Him, and Fr. Luis invited me to a year in Spain with the brothers in formation. That invitation struck something in my heart that made ignoring it later on impossible. But I ignored it. I wanted to live an adventure after high school, and I thought that adventure was waiting for me in college. I continued with my idea of going to college and having a big family in the future. Having learned the great values of a big family, I was set on having no less than 12 children. Nevertheless, the more I tried taking steps towards college, the more I was bugged by the idea of going to Spain. I had received the great gift of being part of a large family, and I had always wanted a big family of my own. Yet opening my plan of my future to what God’s plan may be was a battle. What finally convinced me along with the advice of all my family members and friends was what Fr. Luis said about the year: the Lord has given you many blessings in your life, why don’t you offer a year to Him to see what He may want of you. I saw my family as the greatest gift in my life. How could I deny offering just a year to Him who had given me that great gift? I realized that the true adventure that the Lord had for me was to follow Him to Spain. I had to trust greatly in what the Lord wanted for me in an unknown country, and I decided to go to Spain...

One day in prayer during the months of summer before going to Spain, the Gospel passage of the young rich man in Mark 10 struck my heart, and confirmed my decision to offer a year to the Lord. I was encouraged by Christ’s words that everyone who loses brothers, sisters, mother, and father in this life will receive a hundred fold in this life and in the life to come. The Lord had given me much in my life, and He was inviting me to “sell” the greatest gift I had for a year and follow Him to Spain. Only partially understanding the passage, I thought that my gift of a year to the Lord would pay off greatly in the future.

On coming to Spain, I was amazed by the community’s likeness to my family, which received me as another brother. During the year, I saw a joyful life where I could live an adventure with the Lord and have another type of family, and potentially more kids as a priest (spiritual children). This wasn’t easy to accept, but during a visit to Rome during holy week, it became more clear. After not being able to finish the seven churches pilgrimage at St. Peter’s (which had closed for the day) I simply realized that the plans that the Lord had for me could be different from what I had planned. Through my close relation with the Disciples over the years, and growing friendship with Christ, the Lord had been slowly leading me to choose to follow His plan for my life. The Lord offered me an even greater gift to follow Him as a religious.

Getting to Know the DCJM

In prayer, I came to understand more profoundly what Christ's call to me, in the shoes of the young rich man, meant. His "follow me" meant a radical way of life in imitation of Christ through the evangelical vows of poverty chastity and obedience. That call, as St. John Paul II says in the encyclical "The consecrated life", was a gift from God in an invitation to live "Cristiforme", imitating Christ more radically. The next step the Lord was calling me to take was in the novitiate with the Disciples. The novitiate has been a time to learn to serve Christ with greatness in simple daily tasks. From simply cleaning clothes or taking care of the garden to the more intensive, and extremely important job in any community but especially in a community of men, that of cooking, I discovered the importance of doing every little task with great care. As is typical of any Disciple who passes through Madrid, I have also learned to love seafood and fine meats and cheeses, and also discovered a new zeal in studying. I have even started to want to try to learn about classical and Gregorian music, but Br. Stephen is still working on that...

After the first year of the novitiate and with Fr. Carlos' wise guidance, I was able to confirm the Lord's calling to take the next step, and to commit myself to His heart through religious vows. These will serve as a visible sign of my yes to the great gift that He has offered me to follow in His steps living a life of poverty, chastity, and obedience. Only with His grace and with the guidance of family members, friends, and spiritual direction was I able to say yes to Christ's invitation.





Mission Appeal July 24 and 25

The Missionary Cooperation Appeal program was implemented by the Pontifical Mission Societies for the propagation of the faith in mission areas where the Catholic Church is emerging, but financial resources are scarce, and to inform parishioners of the work of the universal Church. Each year, parishes in the Archdiocese of Denver provide financial support to foreign missions as well as struggling missions in the U.S. which cannot minister to the spiritual and pastoral needs of the poor without outside help.

The mission appeal this year for our parish is the Mary Mother of God Mission Society which is assisting two American priests who are reviving the Roman Catholic Church in the Russian far east in the city of Vladivostok. After nearly four generations of religious and social persecution, the priests have been working since 1992 to re-establish the Church in the region. They founded or re-founded 13 Catholic parishes in an area covering over 500,000 square miles. They also build service centers and have established support programs to bring hope to people who have suffered much.
