

## OUR PASTOR'S BLOG

### Our Sacrifice for the Offertory



Last week we addressed our parish's need to have the offertory fully funded for this year. I offered the challenge and you accepted it, as you can see from the report of last week's offertory in this bulletin. Remember that our parish needs an average \$8,500 per week to meet our financial obligations. Currently, we are 18% below that budgeted income for the year to date. However, your generosity makes me confident that we can end the fiscal year on June 30<sup>th</sup> on budget. That will only happen through your generous support of our goal.

Parishioners have asked me if we will still have second collections since we are putting our efforts into making the offertory goal for this year. The answer is no, if I can avoid doing a second collection. Archbishop Aquila has generously allowed us to use monies from the offertory to contribute to those funds which would normally be funded by the second collections. Those funds include the Retirement Fund for Religious, The Church in Latin America, The Eastern Europe Fund, The Black & Indian Mission, Catholic Relief Services, Catholic Home Missions, Respect Life, Catholic Communications Campaign, Peter's Pence, The Church In Africa, Catholic University Of America, World Mission Sunday, and the Catholic Campaign For Human Development.

There are, however, some collections which I am not free to dispense the parish from giving through an in-pew solicitation. These collections include our mission cooperatives and the Retired Priests Collection. On those Sundays when we will have to take up a second collection, we will put a note in the bulletin the week prior to the collection.

If you rather donate money, Sheri will make arrangements to pick up a donation from your home and shop for you as well. The tree goes up on November 28th and gifts can be returned to the tree or the parish office up to December 20th. When you take an ornament, be sure to register that ornament with one of the Catholic Daughters who will be in the vestibule. Please wrap or bag your present and attach the ornament to the gift.

## Denver Catholic Register dated October 10, 1918

In Sept. 1918, the Spanish Flu began to ravage the world. By the time it had run its course, this H1N1 “bird flu” virus infected about 500 million, killing an estimated 50 million worldwide with 675,000 of the victims in the U.S. Just over a century later and in the midst of our own global pandemic, a look back at media reports during the time of Spanish Flu is eerily reminiscent of our current year.

The first recorded death from the flu in Denver occurred on Sept. 27, 1918. By Oct. 6 schools, theaters and churches were ordered to close and the Register reported “Church is without Mass first Sunday in 36 years and many Colorado churches closed by influenza - Masses cannot be offered on Sunday even outdoors in many Colo. Parishes.”

What followed in the subsequent weeks was not unlike what today’s Catholics have experienced through this pandemic. Another article reported “St. Patrick’s church in Pueblo was lonely and desolate again last Sunday: No Mass, no Benediction! What a weary, dreary place this world becomes without these great manifestations of Infinite Love. We feel like the Children of Israel in exile, as they watched by the waters of Babylon and wept when they remembered Sion.”

It went on to offer words of instruction to the Catholics of the day, which we have experienced and even are experiencing now as public Mass is still limited and not yet being celebrated at full capacity. As the death count dwindled and it seemed the peak had passed, the ban on public gatherings was lifted on Nov. 11, the day World War I ended. Thousands jammed downtown streets shouting and celebrating, over 8000 poured into the City Auditorium to sing and listen to speeches, theaters opened again, but by late November, flu deaths spiked and once again a ban was placed on public gatherings. Masks were required, but the rule was unpopular, especially since people felt they wouldn’t work and stores and theaters objected to closing again. Sound familiar?

In December, theaters and churches would reopen with restrictions and flu cases peaked in Denver, but rapidly declined through the end of the year. As the death count dwindled and it seemed the peak had passed, the ban on public gatherings was again lifted.

For Catholics, it probably felt like a more joyous Christmas than usual that year. In the Dec. 26, 1918 issue of the Register, readers were likely delighted to read the headline “Public Mass again said in Littleton.” The ban has been raised and attendance at church was permitted on the last Sunday of December. Notwithstanding the depth of the snow and the stormy nature of the morning, Mass attendance was good, some coming a great distance. How comforting it is to know that in 2020, we are loved by the very same Lord who sustained our brothers and sisters at that time is still sustaining us today.

Continue to pray for an end to this pandemic.

## GOSPEL MEDITATION - November 22, 2020 - Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

Many Americans are fascinated with England's monarchy. For many different reasons, we are drawn to the regal pageantry and all of the protocols associated with royal lifestyles. What's most amazing is that for all of the media attention focused on the comings and goings of English royalty, they really have very little effect on the day to day dealings of their country. Thoughts and images of kings and queens are often centered on this story book understanding of who and what they are. We associate protocols, etiquette, and proper words and actions to how we approach members of a royal family. These tools serve the necessary purpose of keeping them isolated, enthroned, and at a distance. There is something attractive about being an observer of ritual, pomp, and circumstance. It's almost theatrical.

Is this how we see Jesus Christ, too? We often behave as if Christ is an isolated, enthroned, royal, and even ineffective king. Jesus wants nothing to do with having the status of an earthly king. Jesus also does not want to be watched, observed, or set apart. He wants to get down and dirty with the very stuff of life especially the poor, marginalized, confused, hurting, lost, broken, imprisoned, and forgotten ones. Jesus is the king who turns the tables on us and wants not only our attention but our engagement and conversion. He wants us to get dirty too.

How we treat other people is at the heart of Christ's kingdom. "Whatever you did for one of the least brothers of mine, you did for me." At different times in our lives we are all counted among the "least" ones. We may not be physically poor, but we can easily become emotionally and spiritually poor. We may not be marginalized as many physically are, cast aside because they have too many needs or don't quite fit in. But who hasn't experienced isolation, loneliness, inner turmoil, angst, heartache, or loss? Almost every human being has experienced brokenness at one point or another, or will most definitely at some future point, facing discouragement, fear, insecurity. People are thirsty for more than water. We are imprisoned by our prejudices, misconceived notions and ideas, self-focused obsessions and ideologies. There is a lot of pain and many least ones around us. Stop, look and listen. This is what Christ the King is asking us to do. Look deeply into the eyes and soul of your sisters and brothers, all of them, and see Christ himself.

Being a spectator and observing all of the pageantry isn't enough. Jesus wants us to inherit the kingdom and live the kingdom. It is built on the blocks of love, mercy, compassion, hope, faith, and blessing. It engages those who want it, changes and informs minds, inspires and transforms hearts, converts and renews souls, and sets things right. There is such a great need around us. Are you ready and willing to do whatever you can to serve in God's kingdom?


