

OUR PASTOR'S BLOG

The Deposit of Faith

Our responsibility to God is to remain faithful. Few would deny that statement, but living in faithfulness in the midst of our times becomes difficult when the Spirit of the World is in opposition to God. We have received a gift of teachings which we treasure and hold, this gift of divine teaching is called the Deposit of Faith. The Deposit of Faith includes such things as the teaching that Jesus is truly present in the Blessed Sacrament, that we should keep Sunday as a holy day, and the natural law must be observed. The bishop's role is to protect and teach the Deposit of Faith.

We have a particular blessing in Archbishop Samuel Aquila's boldness in teaching and protecting the Deposit of Faith. While the Church has always held that all human persons have infinite human dignity, this love for all persons does not mean that every action of human persons should be blessed by the Church. In a statement on the inability of the Church to bless same-sex unions, Archbishop Aquila states the following, "Recently the Holy Father issued a clarification through the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith (CDF) that the Church cannot bless same-sex unions. I am grateful for this statement as it reaffirms the Church's longstanding pastoral support for persons with same-sex attraction but in a way that does not condone a lifestyle that objectively separates them from God's plan for the human person." Respect Life News: The Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act (H.R.619) has again been introduced in Congress to protect babies from infanticide. But efforts to bring the bill to a vote in the House are being blocked. YOUR ACTION IS NEEDED to urge your Representatives to sign a discharge petition that would allow this vote to occur. Some states have passed laws to expand abortion and to repeal laws providing specific protections for babies born alive after an attempted abortion. The Born-Alive Act would provide these specific protections nationwide to help prevent newborns from being killed or left alone to die. Continue to pray and contact our state representatives to let them know not all people find abortion acceptable.

GOSPEL MEDITATION: 5th Sunday of Easter

“Spiraling out of control,” is a phrase that can easily describe the current display of human existence. In addition to the violence, unrest, uneasiness and turmoil that are common elements of our daily news, other essential pieces are misplaced or missing. Many lack an objective center around which to order and structure their lives or a clear set of definable goals or mores to act as guideposts and life directives. It appears that “feelings” have become a “new god” and traditional structures and ideals set aside. It is almost as if history only shows that we got this whole thing wrong and many are determined to finally set things right. The real truth, however, is that while wrongs and errors are certainly a part of our often-checkered past, it is hardly the case that all was wrong. It is not our task to rewrite the history of our lives, but to learn from mistakes that were made, and preserve the perennial wisdom at the root of our successes. Learning is an essential part of being human.

The question becomes, however, from whom do we learn? Some have such a hard time placing God in that position, but that is precisely where God needs to be. God is the Master Teacher from whom all of humanity learns and gets its cues. It is in and through this relationship with the Gardener of Life that we are fashioned and pruned into the people we are intended to be and can be. It is only in God that we are able to find our best selves. Sadly, many think that religion too, as well as history in general, has also gotten all this wrong. Yet, our resurrection faith tells us differently. We are reminded, today especially, that we are meant to remain in Christ as Christ remains in us. We are also reminded that Jesus, the Incarnate God, is the vine upon which we grow, the branches that flow from the source of God’s life.

Giving up our will to God’s can be a painful endeavor. It is not easy to set our own desires and wants aside and allow God to step in and direct and guide our growth. But this is the only way to prevent deadly weeds from overtaking us and bringing us to a place of self-destruction. God’s commandments are the very guideposts and benchmarks we need, yet many seek to remove them from all public view because they appear to limit self-expression and suppress what is considered by many to be “human freedom.” They are the only way we can find freedom, however. And, until we learn this fundamental lesson, we will continue to spiral out of control, never really knowing who we are, what our potential can be or how life really can be lived. We will not know peace.



FAQ on Restoring Sunday and Holy Day Obligation. The dispensation to attend Sunday Mass will be lifted on Pentecost Sunday, May 23, 2021. Catholics who have not already returned to Mass should use the Easter season to pray whether they have serious reason that prevents them from attending in person. If not, they should begin to resume normal attendance over the next several weeks in anticipated of the obligation being restored.

As Catholics, we are invited by God to gather together in community, and participate fully in the Sunday Eucharist, which is the “source and summit of the Christian life.” Participation in the communal celebration of the Sunday Eucharist is a testimony of belonging and of being faithful to Christ and to His Church. God gave the Eucharist as a gift to us for our own spiritual well-being, happiness and eternal salvation.

The dispensation is being lifted in the interest of promoting the common good, the dioceses and our parishes have taken many steps to help protect public health during this global pandemic. This briefly included suspending in-person Masses during the early pandemic, however as the worst of the pandemic seems to be behind us, access to the vaccine has increased and our other areas of life continue to move back towards normal, the time has come that a general dispensation is no longer necessary.

There always has been a dispensation for example, if a person is sick or homebound, visiting in areas where no Mass is available or storms. Anyone who is unsure about their personal situation should speak with their pastor or any priest. Parishes have consistently followed the recommendations of public health experts during the pandemic and will continue to take prudent steps to ensure that public Masses are celebrated in a safe manner. While entering into any public space has included some risk, the precautions taken by our parishes have proven to be extremely effective and we are unaware of any issues of community spread happening at a public Mass.

The Bishops of Colorado have affirmed that vaccination should never be a requirement for admittance at any public event including public Masses. However, regardless if one gets vaccinated or not, all Catholics should continue to take prudent steps to prevent the spread of the coronavirus until this pandemic has completely passed. 


