Fr. Accu's Notes: Pentecost, Something Totally New

Jesus died on Passover, and he was raised on the third day. He stayed with the Apostles for forty more days until the Ascension and on the fiftieth day, it was Pentecost. That means that the Apostles spent nine days without Jesus being physically present among them and without having received the Holy Spirit. During this time they prayed and chose Matthias as the new Apostle.

When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together. And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim. (Acts 2:1-4)

As we can see, Christian Pentecost is a very different feast from the Jewish one, but somehow it can also be seen as its fulfillment. Like the Hebrews for the harvest, the Apostles must have been joyful and grateful for what they had received. Christians didn't just receive something from God, they received the Holy Spirit, who is God himself. Instead of bringing something back to God for the poor, they had to bring God straight to the ones who didn't have him. Therefore they went out to preach.

There were many people in Jerusalem to celebrate Pentecost from all over the Roman Empire. Most of them were Jews, but many were not. Some of them were converts to Judaism, others were Hebrews who simply were born and raised in faraway countries so they didn't speak Aramaic as their first language. When the Apostles preached, they spoke in different languages, so that everyone heard them in their native language, even with the right accents. It was a miracle. In the end, that day, about three thousand people were converted by Peter's words and by the miracle of the language and were baptized.

Only the real presence of God could explain the difference that was visible in the Apostles. Before Pentecost, they were shy, confused, and lacking initiative. In nine days, they only managed to pray and to choose St. Matthias. After Pentecost, they went out, preached, and performed miracles. Only God can make such a change possible.

Pentecost was certainly a turning point in the life of the Apostles. We looked at it briefly earlier. Let us have a closer look at all that took place that day.

- **The Holy Trinity was completely revealed.** Israel knew that God was one but they thought he was also only one person: the Father. The Incarnation of the Son brought the knowledge of the second person of the Holy Trinity to us. It took a while, but after the Resurrection, the Apostles had to recognize that Jesus was the Son of God and God himself. They also received the third person of the Holy Trinity, the Holy Spirit, on Pentecost.

- **The Holy Spirit lived among us.** The first result of the Holy Spirit's revelation was that he started to live among the people who follow God. The whole human history could be split into three parts. First when God the Father was among us in his creation, in his relationship with Israel and in the Temple. Then when God the Son was among us as a man who lived in the Holy Land two thousand years ago. The third and last part is when God the Holy Spirit came to live among us in the Church.

- **The whole of revelation was completed.** Jesus had already told us everything that we need to know about God. The second result of the Holy Spirit's revelation was that he allowed us to understand the content of Jesus' revelation and to believe in it.

- **Sacraments.** As we saw, the Apostles celebrated many sacraments. In Acts, we see them celebrating Mass, Baptisms, Confirmations and Ordinations.

- **The Apostles lived like Jesus.** After the Apostles received the Holy Spirit, they went out preaching in different tongues. Even from the very first moment, we can see that they lived like Christ, who went around, preached, and performed miracles.

For these reasons we can say that Pentecost marked the beginning of something totally new in the history of the world: it was the birthday of the Church.

BIG CHANGES COMING SOON!

On May 16, the City and County of Broomfield is moving to Level Clear: New Normal. In Level Clear, “businesses will operate at 100% capacity with no mitigation requirements, although indoor mask requirements may still apply” (broomfield.org/3366/Simplified-Dial-Framework).

Because of this, Nativity will begin a major reopening initiative involving the following changes:

- We will remove the blue tape from pews, allowing parishioners to sit in any row.
- We will return to our normal method of distributing Holy Communion, with parishioners filing into lines to approach the altar.

WEEKEND OF MAY 22-23

- Archbishop Aquila is reinstating the obligation to attend Sunday Mass.

In this Sunday's Gospel passage (Jn 15:9-17) after having compared Himself to the vine and us to the branches, Jesus, explains what fruit is borne by those who remain united to Him: this fruit is love. He again repeats the key-verb: abide. He invites us to abide in his love so that his joy may be in us and our joy may be full (vv. 9-11). To abide in Jesus' love.

Let us ask ourselves: what this love is in which Jesus tells us to abide to have his joy? What is this love? It is the love that originates in the Father, because "God is love" (1 Jn 4:8). This love of God, of the Father, flows like a river in his Son Jesus and through Him comes to us, his creatures. Indeed, he says: "As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you" (Jn 15:9). The love Jesus gives us is the same with which the Father loves Him: pure love, unconditional, freely given love. It cannot be bought, it is free. By giving it to us, Jesus treats us like friends – with this love –, making us know the Father, and he involves us in his same mission for the life of the world.

And then, we can ask ourselves the question, how do we abide in this love? Jesus says: "If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love" (v. 10). Jesus summarized his commandments in a single one, this: "that you love one another as I have loved you" (v. 12).

To love as Jesus means to offer yourself in service, at the service of your brothers and sisters, as he did in washing the feet of the disciples.

It also means going outside of ourselves, detaching ourselves from our own human certainties, from earthly comforts, in order to open ourselves up to others, especially those in greater need. It means making ourselves available, as we are and with what we have. This means to love not in word but in deeds.

To love like Christ means saying 'no' to other 'loves' that the world offers us: love of money – those who love money do not love as Jesus loves –, love of success, vanity, [love] of power.... These deceptive paths of "love" distance us from the Lord's love and lead us to become more and more selfish, narcissistic, overbearing. And being overbearing leads to a degeneration of love, to the abuse others, to making our loved ones suffer. I am thinking of the unhealthy love that turns into violence – and how many women are victims of violence these days. This is not love. To love as the Lord loves us means to appreciate the people beside us, to respect their freedom, to love them as they are, not as we want them to be, gratuitously. Ultimately, Jesus asks us to abide in his love, to dwell in his love, not in our ideas, not in our own self-worship. Those who dwell in self-worship live in the mirror: always looking at themselves. Those who overcome the ambition to control and manage others. Not controlling, serving them. Opening our heart to others, this is love, giving ourselves to others.

Dear brothers and sisters, where does this abiding in the Lord's love lead? Where does it lead us? Jesus told us: "That my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be full" (v. 11). And the Lord wants the joy he possesses, because he is in complete communion with the Father, to be in us insofar as we are united to Him. The joy of knowing we are loved by God despite our infidelities enables us to face the trials of life confidently, makes us live through crises so as to emerge from them better. Our being true witnesses consists in living this joy, because joy is the distinctive sign of a true Christian. True Christians are not sad; they always have that joy inside, even in difficult moments.

May the Virgin Mary help us to abide in Jesus' love and to grow in love for everyone, witnessing to the joy of the Risen Lord.






