A LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

I would like to offer you a reminder of the potentially historic deliberations that are happening in the Supreme Court in the coming days. The Supreme Court will be hearing oral arguments on the case of *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health* starting on December 1. The specific questions the Court will answer is whether a state may enact limits on abortion before viability or when the baby is capable of living outside their mother's womb. The devastating conclusion in the infamous *Roe v. Wade* case claimed that the government's role, for the first time in American history, was to sanction the taking, not the protecting, of vulnerable, innocent human life. Roe actually argued that the more vulnerable the life, the more it can be aborted out of existence. The Dobbs case rightly challenges that assertion, directing our country back to a basic respect for life for all.

This court decision could completely reset abortion legislation nationwide, empowering whole states to, once again, decide for themselves how they choose to protect life. As Catholics, we know better than to take that possibility for granted, and we are called to pray ardently in moments such as these. To paraphrase St. Augustine: Work like everything depends on you, and pray like everything depends on God.

In light of this occasion, parishes across the nation are being called to pray in Adoration on the eve of the Supreme Court hearing December 1. There are many opportunities in the community for you to engage in a time of prayer for this intention. Mary's Homes of Hope in Arvada will be offering nine hours of prayer and adoration on Wednesday, December 1, for each of the Supreme Court Justices and asks you to join. It is an open invitation to all those who wish to participate in this time of adoration and prayer from 10:00am-7:00pm, following a 9:00am Mass at Mary's Homes of Hope.

Nativity will be offering the 5:00pm-6:00pm Holy Hour for the Court's ongoing deliberation on Thursday, December 2. Additionally, we encourage you to visit the Nativity Adoration chapel to pray for this intention, joining our brothers and sisters across the nation in praying that all life would be respected and preserved as a gift from God and that those who seek to devalue it would turn toward the Creator, who gives and sustains all life.



The Advent season has two meanings. It emphasizes both the celebration of Christ coming into the world as a man and also the second coming when the Lord will return again. It blends together a penitential spirit, very similar to Lent, a liturgical theme of preparation for the Second and Final Coming of the Lord, called the Parousia, and a joyful theme of getting ready for the Bethlehem event.

Come, Lord Jesus! Come! May this Advent be a time of deep renewal in my life, dear Lord. May it be a time in which I strive with all my heart to seek out Your gentle and profound voice. Give me the grace, dear Lord, to turn away from the many noises of the world that compete for my attention and to turn only to You and to all You wish to say. Come, Lord Jesus, come into my life more deeply during this Advent season. Jesus, I trust in You.



THE HOPE CORNER: A MENTAL HEALTH MINISTRY

As Thanksgiving approaches, we all think of counting our blessings. In the science of psychology, one of the recommended evidence-based strategies is the practice of gratitude. Gratitude has been researched to improve physical and psychological health, enhances relationships, empathy, sleep and self-esteem, promotes a feeling of peace, reduces anger and social comparisons and fosters resilience.

One of the early studies of gratitude had subjects simply write three things per day that they were grateful for over 365 days. The only condition of the study was they could never write the same thing more than once. This was one study to show the significant positive changes of gratitude. I encourage each of you to begin the practice of gratitude by writing 3 things a day of anything you experience, see, smell, hear, touch, taste and signs through your day from God. You will be amazed by the benefits of the daily practice of gratitude!

PARTIAL INDULGENCE DECREE

This year marks the 75th anniversary of St. Frances Xavier Cabrini's canonization. Mother Cabrini is a special saint in the state of Colorado, as she founded the Queen of Heaven girls' orphanage here while carrying out missionary work during her lifetime, and the property upon which it was founded is now home to the beloved Mother Cabrini Shrine.

To honor Mother Cabrini's diamond jubilee of canonization, Archbishop Samuel J. Aquila has decreed that those who visit the Mother Cabrini Shrine and spend time in prayer will be granted a partial indulgence, beginning on the Feast of Mother Cabrini, Nov. 13, and going to her feast day in 2022. For those who are homebound or unable to make a pilgrimage to the Shrine for grave reasons, they, too, can be granted a partial indulgence by uniting their prayers to those who visit the Shrine.

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Today, with the First Sunday of Advent, we begin a new liturgical year. This season invites us to reflect on the dimension of time, which always exerts great fascination over us. However, after

it also continues and is actuated through the whole span of cosmic becoming, until the end of time. So too, although the Incarnation-Redemption occurred at a specific moment in history the period of

the example of what Jesus loved to do, I wish to start with a very concrete observation: we all say that we do not have enough time, because the pace of daily life has become frenetic for everyone. In this regard too, the Church has "good news" to bring: God gives us his time. We always have little time; especially for the Lord, we do not know how or, sometimes, we do not want to find it. Well, God has time for us! This is the first thing that the beginning of a liturgical year makes us rediscover with ever new amazement. Yes, God gives us his time, because he entered history with his Word and his works of salvation to open it to eternity, to make it become a covenantal history. In this prospective, already in itself time is a fundamental sign of God's love: a gift that man, as with everything else, is able to make the most of or, on the contrary, to waste; to take in its significance or to neglect with obtuse superficiality.

Then there are the three great "points" in time, which delineate the history of salvation: at the beginning, Creation; the Incarnation-Redemption at the centre and at the end the "parousia", the final coming that also includes the Last Judgment. However, these three moments should not be viewed merely in chronological succession. In fact, Creation is at the origin of all things but

Jesus' journey on earth it nevertheless extends its radius of action to all the preceding time and all that is to come. And in their turn, the final coming and the Last Judgment, which were decisively anticipated precisely in the Cross of Christ, exercise their influence on the conduct of the people of every age.

The liturgical season of Advent celebrates the coming of God in its two moments: it first invites us to reawaken our expectation of Christ's glorious return, then, as Christmas approaches, it calls us to welcome the Word made man for our salvation. Yet the Lord comes into our lives continually. How timely then, is Jesus' call, which on this First Sunday is powerfully proposed to us: "Watch!" (Mk 13: 33, 35, 37). It is addressed to the disciples but also to everyone, because each one, at a time known to God alone, will be called to account for his life. This involves a proper detachment from earthly goods, sincere repentance for one's errors, active charity to one's neighbour and above all a humble and confident entrustment to the hands of God, our tender and merciful Father. The icon of Advent is the Virgin Mary, Mother of Jesus. Let us invoke her so that she may help us also to become an extension of humanity for the Lord who comes.
