ENCOUNTERING CHRIST IN A TANGIBLE WAY

In the early hours of Friday, October 4, 12 adults, one teen, and four children gathered at Denver airport, filled with anticipation and excitement for the pilgrimage ahead. It was 6:00 am when we embarked on a spiritual and communal journey that would take us to Washington, D.C., a city rich in history, faith, and culture.

Upon our arrival, we were warmly greeted by Ilene and Jim Dubey, our advance team, who had thoughtfully prepared a picnic lunch for us. After a long flight, we were eager to stretch our legs and enjoy a meal together at a sprawling playground near our hotel. The fresh air and shared laughter set a joyful tone for the days ahead. That evening, we gathered for Mass, shared dinner, and settled in for an early night of rest, preparing for the weekend's activities.

Saturday morning, we carpooled to the Saint John Paul II Shrine, founded by the Knights of Columbus, where we celebrated a private Mass. After Mass, we explored the John Paul II exhibit, which offered a profound look into the life of this remarkable pope. The exhibit showcased his journey through history, from his early years to his pontificate, with relics, photographs, video clips, and writings. His influence on the Catholic Church, mainly through his participation in Vatican II and his personal connection with people around the world, was incredible. As we walked through the exhibit, it was impossible not to be moved

by John Paul II's enduring faith, resilience, and commitment to human dignity, even in the face of immense hardship.

After our time at the shrine, we crossed the street to visit the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception. With its 80 chapels and oratories, this majestic church honors the Blessed Mother's many apparitions. Our guide led us on a tour, explaining the significance of each chapel and how they represented different devotions to Mary. It was a beautiful testament to the universality of the Catholic faith and how Mary is a source of comfort and inspiration to people from diverse cultures. We ended the day with dinner and a spirited game of UNO back at the hotel, bonding over friendly competition and shared stories. For the occasion, Fr. Antonio Lopez, Regional Superior of the Fraternity of Saint Charles, joined us and shared his personal story about Saint John Paul II and how he influenced his life to the point that nowadays, Fr. Antonio is the provost of the JP II Institute for Marriage and Family in D.C.

Sunday morning brought us to St. Patrick's Church, the oldest Catholic parish in Washington, D.C., dating back to 1794. We celebrated Mass with the parish priest, and after the service, a seminarian gave us a tour of this historic church. The beauty of the sanctuary, combined with its rich history, was a reminder of the deep roots of Catholicism in the United States. Following Mass,

the group dispersed to explore the city, with many taking the opportunity to visit iconic monuments and museums. From the National Mall's solemn beauty to the Smithsonian Museums' inspiring exhibits, there was something for everyone to experience.

That evening, we again gathered for dinner at a local family-owned restaurant. The evening concluded with several rounds of the game Sushi Go and evening prayers, a peaceful end to a fulfilling day.

This pilgrimage was not just a tour of historical and religious landmarks; it was a shared experience of faith that brought us closer to each other and to God.

The group was made up of four families, each representing a different JP II small group. Rachel and Nick Bradley, Erika and Mike Oakes, Jacquie and Ryan Colby, and Lisa and Brian Arellano. Some of us formed new friendships, while others deepened existing bonds. Yet, throughout the journey, we were united by a common desire to encounter Christ in a tangible way through our shared experiences of faith, history, and community.

Starting and ending each day in prayer, visiting sites that reflected our rich Catholic heritage, and exploring memorials that echoed the profound sacrifices of countless individuals, we felt God's presence with us. One particularly moving aspect of the trip was learning about the life of Pope John Paul II. His life was marked by immense hardship—growing up during the war, losing his loved ones, and witnessing the devastation of his homeland. Yet, despite these trials, he never wavered in his faith. Instead, he turned to prayer, allowing his relationship with God to shape his mission to the world.

As the longest-reigning pope in modern history, John Paul II traveled to 129 countries, logging over 700,000 miles and spreading a message of hope, human dignity, and mercy. He canonized 482 saints, showing us that holiness is attainable for ordinary people living extraordinary lives of faith. He gave us the Luminous Mysteries of the Rosary and encouraged devotion to Divine Mercy, reminding us that God's love and grace are always within reach if we open our hearts to Him.

Our pilgrimage to Washington, D.C., was a time of spiritual renewal, shared joy, and a deeper connection with our Catholic faith. Through prayer, reflection, and community, we experienced the profound presence of God in our lives. As we returned home, we carried with us the lessons of Pope John Paul II's life and the realization that no matter where life takes us, God is always in control, and His victory is assured when we place our trust in Him.

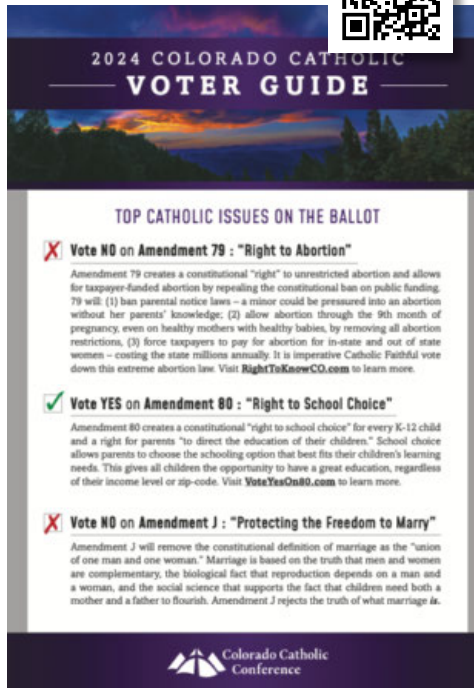

The 2024 Knight of Joy was the highest-grossing Gala in the history of the school, raising \$354,906 gross, and \$293,000 net!

Nativity is under the pastoral care of the **Priestly Fraternity of St. Charles Borromeo**, a religious order, founded in 1985 by Msgr. Massimo Camisasca in Italy. The order has its origins in the charism of Fr. Luigi Giussani, founder of the Catholic lay movement Communion and Liberation (CL). Here is how the Priestly Fraternity of St. Charles Borromeo is described by the founder, Msgr. Massimo Camisasca:

Fraternity: “The Fraternity is a companionship made up of people that are placed together by an Other. [...] Each of us [...] is continually accompanied by Christ through his brothers.”

Priestly: “The priestly vocation [...] is a continuous communion with God and man. [...] It acts as a bridge between heaven and earth, represents a fundamental link in the history of salvation, and also serves as an important figure in the journey towards unity among men.”

Missionary: “Mission [...] consists simply in entering within the same mission for which God sent His own Son into the world, for which the Son sent the Apostles, and for which, in turn, the Apostles sent other brothers, until the visible echo of that event touched even us.”

The priests of the Fraternity live together in houses of three or more. The communion among them is meant to sustain their vocation and be a path towards conversion. They are willing to be sent around the world wherever the Church has a need, according to the wishes of the bishop of the diocese in which they reside. Learn more at:
