




Are you following us on Facebook? We post daily! We post motivational and spiritual messages along with events and news for the church and school and have a fun trivia question every Tuesday!

This weekend we celebrate the Great Feast of Pentecost. This is when the Holy Spirit came down upon the Apostles and empowered them to witness to all about the things Jesus Christ has done and continues to do for us.

Historically, Pentecost occurs fifty days after the Resurrection. The word Pentecost is Greek, meaning the "fiftieth day". At this time the Jews celebrated Pentecost, fifty days after the feast of Passover, when they offered God the first fruits of their harvest. It is a time of great joy and thanksgiving. Pentecost, was one of three pilgrimage festivals the Jews celebrated. The account of Pentecost in Acts of the Apostles, is very vivid. There is a strong wind, then tongues of fire appeared over the heads of each Apostle. The tongues of fire are a symbol for language. Each person present heard the Apostles speaking in their personal native tongue. This was to overcome the Spirit of evil from the story of the Tower of Babel (Genesis 11:1-9). This is to show that the Church is universal, and Jesus came for everyone. That is why the Apostles were sent out on a mission to spread the good news to the world. Just like the Apostles, we too are sent to be witnesses of Jesus by our words and actions.

Our Easter Season formally comes to a close, but not really. Maybe just the idea of a constant celebration of Easter is over, but we should ALWAYS celebrate Jesus in our lives until he comes again. Easter Season has been a time of renewal of our faith, so that we like those early apostles and disciples might be prepared and empowered to give witness to Jesus. So, just as Jesus sends them out, we are also sent. To go live and spread the Good News of Jesus Christ.

"Faith In Action Idea Of The Week"

Wisdom, Knowledge, Understanding, Counsel, Fortitude, Knowledge, Piety, Fear of the Lord. Gifts directly from God and are effective beyond measure when used.

Today we reach the finale of the Easter season with the celebration of the great Feast of Pentecost. Reflecting on today's readings inspires a sense of awe as we consider the mighty power of the Holy Spirit at work giving birth to and sustaining our Church. Just as awesome — the same Spirit is calling to us this day to take up our part in the Church's saving work.

In the first reading, from Acts, we see the creative genius of the Holy Spirit moving through the newly confirmed Apostles "who began to speak in different tongues as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim." The large crowd, gathered from all over the world were "amazed" and "astounded" that each one could understand the Apostles speaking in their own language.

Each one of us, young and old alike, is personally called today by the Holy Spirit into the same mission as that of the first Apostles — to advance the Kingdom of God in our corner of the world. Just as He did on that Pentecost day, the Holy Spirit speaks to us in our "own language" to give us the Good News of the Gospel and urge us to share it. We can think of our own language as the particular gifts, talents, and passions we possess. We experience the presence of the Holy Spirit through them and we are meant put them to the work in grateful service of the Kingdom of God.

When we consider the stewardship way of life we are called to live, we often focus on the challenges it poses. Surrendering ourselves to God is indeed a challenging way to live. But it leads to a life that is exciting, creative, and deeply rewarding. Stewardship allows us to experience life as a great adventure because it is a life guided and directed by the very source of power and creativity — the Holy Spirit!
