



This is the 14th Sunday in Ordinary Time. Today's reading from the Prophet Isaiah, is from the last chapter of his writings. We hear a theme from our prophet, one of hope and rejoicing in the promises of God. The people are returning home after the Babylonian

exile. They find the City of Jerusalem and the Temple in destruction yet, they are told to rejoice. God's promise is to once again make of them a fruitful people and a great nation. They hope in God's promise of the good things that come to those who are faithful. God offers us the same promise. None of this comes without living out our faith by our words and actions. We need to practice what we say and believe. As we renew ourselves in the Eucharist, we become a new creation in Christ Jesus. We in turn are called to spread the Good News.

In our second reading, we hear the last of St. Paul's Letters to the Galatians. He has tried to reinforce his teachings about Jesus, mainly that by the death and resurrection of Christ we are freed from the Law. The cross of Jesus has set us free, and Christ needs to be the center and core of our lives. So, how do we live as Jesus asks us? What needs to change in our lives?

In our Gospel from Luke, Jesus appoints seventy-two others and sends them in pairs ahead of him to the places he intends to visit. He needs them to prepare the people for his message of Good News of the Kingdom. Some people will listen, and some will resist. Much like our world today. Clearly, we all need this message of love and hope. Our role is to spread this Good News by our words and actions.

We thank God for the Roe vs. Wade decision being overturned. What a poor choice form the beginning. Our work needs to continue to overcome the tragic loss of so many innocent lives. We must be the example of respecting all lives, all people and work to provide for the needs of everyone. Jesus is sending us out in pairs to spread the Good News of his love for everyone and that we need to do the same.
