This event is free and open to the whole community!

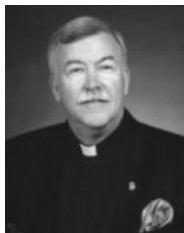
St. Peter is located at 55 Jefferson in Monument.

This is the 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time. Our reading from Deuteronomy, speaks to us about the Covenant relationship the people have with God. It's one of love and fidelity. There are all sorts of people telling us what to do on a daily basis, and sometimes we listen

and sometimes we don't. If we are going to listen to someone, it should be God. Deuteronomy is the Book of the Law given to the people by Moses. It contained what God asked them to do in order to live in God's grace and blessings. It would demonstrate their willingness to sacrifice God and trust in him. Which is no easy task. Moses is growing old, it's time for him to pass his leadership role on to Joshua, so he might lead the people to the Promised Land. Moses tries to reinforce God's law. It should be part of their inner being. It should be on their lips and in there hearts. The truth of God and his love should be a reality in everyday life and build everlasting relationships. The Ten Commandments are the ultimate benchmark of God's laws. If we follow them close by, we are on the road to success.

In St. Paul's Letter to the Colossians, he tries to explain exactly who Jesus is. It's the summation of all that Jesus is and what he has done for us. Jesus reconciles us to God by his death and resurrection.

Today's lesson in the Gospel from Luke is about a scholar, (scribe) who asks about how to inherit eternal life. Good question for all of us. The scholar knows the law and answers correctly. But even in his correctness, he needs to clarify for himself the part about who is our neighbor. Jesus tells a parable that cuts to the heart of the answer, the story of the Good Samaritan. The simple answer is everyone is your neighbor especially those in need of the most help. The scholar failed in his answer of Jesus, but Jesus shows mercy and love and invites the scholar to do as the Good Samaritan-help everyone! Good advice for all of us.

## STEWARDSHIP IT'S WHAT WE DO!

### "Faith In Action Idea Of The Week"

*"Stay involved. Stay active. Smile at others. Come to Mass. Bring your family." ~ Monsignor Jaeger*

In today's Gospel passage, from Luke, we read the well-known parable of the Good Samaritan. Here, Jesus teaches us in rich detail what stewardship in action looks like. In fact, this parable could just as accurately be called the parable of the Good Steward.

The first thing we note about the Good Samaritan is that he is aware of the needs of those around him and responds generously. While the priest and Levi brush right past the man on the side of the road, the Samaritan is watching for those who might be in need. He has a hospitable way of looking at the world around him and so he is able to "see" in a way that the others did not, and he was "moved with compassion at the sight" of the man.

Next, we see the Good Samaritan spring into action to serve this man, setting aside his own schedule and plans to meet his needs. He does not just give the man a few dollars or offer quick words of encouragement from across the road. He goes right up to the man. He cleans and bandages his wounds. He puts the man on his own animal and brings him to an inn where he can heal. He ensures the innkeeper would continue to look after him, and he commits to returning to the man on his way back.

That is how we live out God's commandments. That is true hospitality and service. That is how a good steward springs into action when he comes upon a neighbor in need. And Jesus says to each of us personally, just as He did in today's Gospel, "Go and do likewise."

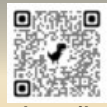

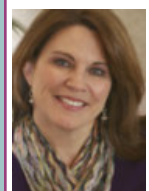
