

This is the 16th Sunday in Ordinary Time. In our reading from Genesis, Abraham and Sarah welcome three strangers and provide hospitality. In the Biblical world hospitality was associated with godliness. They provide a great meal and rest from the heat of the day.

Abraham and Sarah are childless and are now 100 and 90 years old respectively. They have prayed for years that they would have a son, and heir. They were unaware they were entertaining messengers from God. One of the strangers tells Abraham and Sarah that by the same time next year she would have a child. Imagine their surprise at their age to have a child. God gives blessings to his faithful servants.

St. Paul writes to the Colossians. He rejoices in his own personal sufferings as a minister of God's word for their sake. As a good steward of his gifts Paul helps to further the mission of the Church, to proclaim the word to all people and in spite of his own suffering.

In St. Luke's Gospel, Jesus is invited to the home of Martha and Mary. Martha, as in our first reading from Genesis, is consumed with the task of hospitality. She presents a lavish meal while Mary sits with Jesus in conversation. Martha says something to Jesus, who tells Martha not to be so worried about the meal, but be more attentive as Mary is to his message. He came to speak to both of them about his kingdom. How about us? Do we welcome Jesus and listen or are we too busy with social expectations? We are all invited to make time for Jesus and listen to his word!

STEWARDSHIP *IT'S* WHAT WE DO!

"Faith In Action Idea Of The Week" "Seek to learn on earth those truths which shall remain valid in Heaven" ~Saint Jerome

In today's Gospel reading from St. Luke, we receive a reminder about the proper use of the gift of time, a fundamental aspect of a stewardship way of life. Our passage highlights one of the most famous dinner parties ever thrown, recalling the day that Martha and Mary hosted our Lord in their home. We are told that Martha, as a good steward, welcomes Christ in but then becomes "burdened with much serving" while her sister and fellow hostess chooses to simply sit with Jesus, listening to Him speak.

Martha becomes indignant at Mary's behavior and complains to Jesus, "Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me by myself to do the serving? Tell her to help me." But Jesus, in His infinite wisdom, refuses to get pulled into this sisterly spat. Instead, He offers Martha a fresh way to look at the situation. "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. There is need of only one thing."

What is that one thing? It is to put Jesus first in our lives and above all other things; to "sit at his feet" and listen as Mary did, giving Him the priority of our time no matter how busy we think we are. When we truly commit to putting Christ first in our daily lives through a regular time of prayer and frequent participation in the sacraments, we will find that all our other concerns become less pressing, less overwhelming.

Why is this so? Because the time we invest in our relationship with God saturates all aspects of our lives with His grace. And because God cannot be outdone in generosity. He will abundantly reward any sacrifice we make to spend time with Him.
