

From Our Pastor**HE IS RISEN!**

All of the evil fell upon Him. He was like a lamb brought to the slaughter; He did not resist. He experienced the envy of the scribes and Pharisees who mocked and ridiculed Him. They did not understand who He was or what He said. He was betrayed by one of His own: one of his closest companions with whom He often ate. Judas had other ideas about who the Messiah should be and did not accept God's will for his life. He was abandoned by those whom He had taught and formed. In front of the fear of death, they escaped to save their own lives. Peter, the rock on which He had promised to build His Church, three times swore to a servant girl that he did not even know who Jesus was. Also, the crowd that a few days earlier was singing, "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" was shouting, "Crucify him, crucify him!" He did miracles and healed so many. He showed compassion and mercy and His life was lived for the sake of others. Why would no one stand by His side and defend Him?



Pilate believed Jesus to be innocent, but handed Him over to be crucified. He was flogged by Roman soldiers and spent the night alone in prison. It is difficult to image the pain of the crown of thorns, the carrying of the cross and being nailed to a cross and raised up to suffer and die. Jesus offered Himself for the sins of all people from all times.

The body was wrapped in a burial cloth and placed in a tomb which was sealed with a stone. All was silent during Holy Saturday. It appeared that it was all over.


Today we celebrate that He is risen; the tomb is empty. Jesus has truly risen. He was seen by some and even 500 at once. He has conquered sin and death; He will never die again. He has a resurrected life and a glorious body. He comes to bring peace and to share His Divine Spirit. The last word is not death but life. His triumph is the Good News for us. There is no sin, no evil, no suffering that is greater than the love of God shown to us in Jesus Christ. His love is victorious. We are reconciled with God, our sins are forgiven, heaven has been opened. We can live in communion with God and spend eternity in His presence. Jesus desires to give us the gift of true freedom. Now we no longer have to live enslaved to our passions and the Evil one. The chains that bound us have been broken. Now we can live not for ourselves but for Him who died for us. We can live a life of love and service. We can enter into the will of God.

Jesus has been faithful to His mission. God promised to send a Savior to set us free and bring us true fulfillment. We have been created by love and for love. We can be happy because of Jesus Christ. After the 40 days of Lent, we have 50 days to celebrate the Season of Easter. In this time we praise God for the mission of Jesus and for the Church which makes it possible to share in His new Life. In Baptism we are united with Jesus in His death and resurrection. In the Sacraments, Jesus is truly present and continues to fulfill His mission for each one of us in particular.

A Happy Ending Isn't the Whole Story

“Is there a happy ending?”

When my kids were young, we never made it past the first whiff of any narrative tension before I got this question. As soon as whatever princess or furry woodland animal who was the hero of the story got into any small scrape, they wanted that reassurance, “Is there a happy ending?”

I can't say I blame them. Don't we all feel that way sometimes? We enter into a relationship with someone or some situation, and we just want to protect ourselves. We want to know it's not going to go badly — or, if it does, that we will be able to come back from it. It's a human instinct, a reflex. Our inclination to protect ourselves makes it so that we sometimes want to press fast-forward on the bad stuff and skip straight ahead to the happily-ever-after.

Easter is the ultimate happy ending. It's the day of miracles. The day when all the stones roll away and all the sins are forgiven. It's the day that puts everything right.

But if we learned anything from this week — from the Passion and death of the Lord — it's that we can't press fast-forward on the hardships of life. That tension, that loss, that fear — it's crucial, isn't it? As Catholics, we are who we are because of Easter. But Easter doesn't happen without Good Friday.

So, does the story of salvation have a happy ending? We know it does. But we also remember that the ending isn't all that matters.
