

Fr. Chris' Catholic Cultural Corner

BEHIND THE BIBLE

The Second Vatican Council produced 22 Pastoral documents, addressing specific aspects of the Church and its ministry. One of the Documents is entitled "Dei Verbum:-or "Word of God". It is specifically speaking of Divine Revelation, or how does God speak to His people. One aspect of this is of course, the Bible.

In speaking of the Bible, Dei Vergum states: "For holy mother Church...holds that the books of both the Old and New Testaments in their entirety, with all their parts, are sacred and canonical because written under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, they have God as their author and have been handed on as such to the Church herself." (D.V. #11 &12). This is just confirming that God is the author of Scripture.

But look at the next paragraph from "Dei Verbum". It says, "In composing the sacred books, God chose men and while employed by Him they made use of their powers and abilities, so that with Him acting in them and through them, they, as true authors, con-signed to writing everything and only those things which He wanted,...." (D.V. #12). Over, the years have believed and taught that the human authors of the Bi-

ble were simply writing what God dictated to them. But, Dei Verbum clearly says that God made use of their powers and abilities. This means that St. Paul brought his particular wisdom to what he wrote. Albeit, inspired by God, and guided by the Holy Spirit. Scripture is not the result of simple dictation, with the author sitting with pen and scroll, scribbling down dic-tation, stopping God occasionally to say, "Okay, God, hang on and slow down. I'm out of parchment!" The Evangelists, St. Paul, and the other authors of Scripture brought themselves, their worldview, and their wisdom to their writing. More importantly, they brought their own faith and relationship to God to bear.. When we read or study Scripture today, we have a twofold chal-lenge. First, we are 21st century people, not Biblical era people. It's hard to read ancient texts with our modern mindset. This is why it benefits us to "study" Scrip-ture. Second, we have to know who is writing and speaking. What was their worldview? Again this takes some study if we truly want to invest in Scripture and let it guide us.

Our annual Great Adventure Bible Study is commencing for the next year. It will begin a great journey, of helping to understand this great gift of the Bible, and help it to live in our lives.

Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Whenever I hear this challenging gospel I think of the 2001 movie, *A Beautiful Mind*, about John Nash. It tells the shocking story of this Nobel Laureate in Economics, whose life is filled with interesting, companionable, sometimes frightening, but always utterly imagined friends. He is deeply schizophrenic, and we don't realize that until certain revelations throughout the movie cause us to question who in his life actually exists.

He finally has victory over his illness by training his mind to ignore his hallucinations. Whenever he encounters his "friends," he forces himself to ignore them. This is how I feel about Jesus' admonition that those who harbor evil thoughts, as well as a number of deadly sins, are defiled. It's what we're thinking about on the inside that corrupts us and makes us sad. I try to train my brain to ignore its tendency to review the irritating behaviors of people around me.

Think about gossip. Isn't it delicious to hear something unsavory or scandalous about someone? It's especially precious if it's about someone we know, and even better if it's about someone who has, in the tiniest ways, hurt our feelings at some point in the past. Then---yippee!---we hear something uncharitable about them, and we start marinating that news over and over in our hearts. We ruminate and luxuriate in it in our hearts, and, soon enough, we are defiled with the spiciness of sweet revenge.


And it is sweet, for a minute. But in the end it makes us less.. I want what's going on in my brain to match the person I present to the world, especially since that's the brain that asks for Jesus' mercy every day.
