Fr. Chris' Catholic Cultural Corner

SALVATION-FEW OR MANY?

In the Eucharistic Prayer prayed at each and every Mass, during the consecration itself, the following words are said: "The Blood of the new and eternal covenant, which will be poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins." Ten years ago, when the Roman Missal was "re-translated", we had this line changed, "all" was changed to "many". It begs the question of who receives the forgiveness of sins. It is, of course, not a referendum on the economy of salvation offered by Jesus' death on the cross. No, it speaks to the acceptance of the salvific act effected by Christ. That acceptance is up to us. I remember being a little 1st grade student in Catholic school some years ago. Sr. Lorraine, a terrific teacher and nun, told us that non-Catholic did not go to heaven. My first grade brain did not quite fathom this in the realm of God's love. Now, I am not "calling out" Sr. Lorraine per se, but speaking to a question which still confuses some Catholics based on what we have been taught or learned. What is the answer to this question. Is it the few or the many?

The answer can be found in the Second Vatican Council document, "Lumen Gentium". This is the Dogmatic Constitution on the Church, and speaks of the very nature and essence of the Church as the Body of Christ. In this document, it speaks to different aspects of Christianity and humanity. For example, "Basing itself on scripture and tradition, it teaches that

the Church, a pilgrim now on earth, is necessary for salvation" (#14). Christ himself spoke of the necessity of faith and baptism (Mark 16, John 3). In speaking of our non-Catholic yet Christian brothers and sisters, it speaks thus, "Many of them celebrate the holy Eucharist and cultivate devotion of the Virgin Mother of God. There is furthermore a sharing in prayer and spiritual benefits; these Christians are indeed in some real way joined to us in the Holy Spirit for, by his gifts and graces, his sanctifying power is also active in them and he strengthened some of them even to the shedding of their blood". (#15).

Special attention is given to those many non-Christians. "Those who, through no fault of their own, do not know the Gospel of Christ or his Church, but who nevertheless seek God with a sincere heart, and, moved by grace, try in their actions to do his will as they know it through the dictates of their conscience--those too may achieve eternal salvation." (#16).

Discipleship is answering a call of Christ. That call goes out to many, if not all humanity, in many different ways. Moved by the Holy Spirit, we answer that call, each according to his or her own motivations and abilities. This is faith, the faith which Jesus teaches us, the Virgin Mary models for us, and is available as a gift to us all.

The precepts of the Lord give joy to the heart. (Ps 19)

Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

I've just finished Kristen Hannah's *The Four Winds*, and I don't know if I'll ever get the dust out of my mouth. I love a novel that is so compelling that you live in it, and see the world through it, every day that you're reading it, and for weeks afterward.

The Dust Bowl endured for nine long years, with the unrelenting series of misery caused by drought, dust storms, and poor farming practices overlapping with the ten years of the Great Depression. Millions descended upon the California fields, begging for work planting and harvesting.

The book follows its characters from the plains of Texas up to the San Joaquin Valley. Just when we think they are finally going to have enough to eat and drink, we encounter the merciless owners of the fields, who, recognizing that there are millions willing to work for less, begin withholding wages from the starved migrant workers.

That's where today's shocking reading from the Letter of James intersects. But this ugly business of employing workers for the fields, and then cheating them of their wages, goes back much earlier than that first century letter.

The book of Deuteronomy may be at least seven hundred years earlier. Look at 24: 15: "You shall give him his wages on his day before the sun sets, for he is poor and sets his heart on it."

How terrible to work hard, on an empty stomach, and receive no pay at the end of the day. The author of the letter of James railed against this malicious practice. O God of the harvest, protect all workers who labor to bring food to our tables.

How are you following the biblical mandate to ensure that workers receive just wages?
