Fr. Chris' Catholic Cultural Corner

GET TO KNOW: POPE ST. JOHN XXIII

As I hope you are aware, Spirit of Christ is entering into a year of saints. We will be celebrating the cloud of witnesses, which are the holy men and women declared saints in our Church. Every week, there will be a special "Saint of the Week". A short video is available on our website, given by a parish staff member about the life and legacy of the saint. The videos are also archived on the website for your later viewing.

The week of October 10, we look back at Pope St. John XXIII, whose feast day is October 11. "Good" Pope John served as Pope of the Roman Church from 1958 to 1963. He was born Angelo Roncalli in Lombardy in 1881, the 4th of 13 children. His parents were share-croppers. He was ordained in 1904, also receiving a degree in Canon Law. During World War I, he was drafted into the Royal Italian Army (no exemption for clergy!). He served in the medical corps as a stretcher-bearer and chaplain. After the war, he was named a Bishop, and spent most of his career in diplomatic service, serving as Nuncio to Bulgaria, Turkey, and Greece. He also served as head of the Vatican Jewish Agency. From there, he served heroically to assist Jews during World War II. In 1952, he was named a Cardinal, and named Archbishop of Venice. It was from there that he was surprisingly elected Pope in 1958.

Upon his election, he said the following in choosing his Papal name, "I choose John...a name sweet to us because it is

the name of our father, dear to me because it is the name of the humble parish church where I was baptized, the solemn name of numberless cathedrals scattered throughout the world, including our own basilica. Twenty two Johns of indisputable legitimacy have been Pope, and almost all had a brief pontificate. We have preferred to hide the smallness of our name behind this magnificent succession of Roman Popes." His first act as Pope was to make pastoral visits, not done by a Pope since 1870. He visited children infected with polio in a Roman hospital, andvisited inmates in Rome's Regina Coeli prison., where he told the inmates, "You could not come to me, so I came to you." The Second Vatican Council was announced in 1959, for commencement in 1962. Right before the opening of the Council, he visited Assisi and Loreto by train, praying at the tomb of St Francis. He was the first Pope to leave Rome since 1870. This humble, holy man was diagnosed with stomach cancer in September of 1962. In October of 1962, he offered to mediate the Cuban Missile Crisis between Kennedy and Krushchev. Later that year, he was named Time Magazine's "Man of the Year". He died June 3, 1963, his last words being, "I had the great grace to be born into a Christian family, modest and poor, but with the fear of the Lord. My time on earth is drawing to a close. But Christ lives on and continues his work in the Church". On April 27, 2014, the Feast of Divine Mercy, he was canonized along with his fellow Pope, St. John Paul II.

Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Imagining a camel small enough to fit through the eye of a needle can make you stop and rub your eyes and say, "WHAAAT?" This hyperbole for things we could never possibly do was a common example in the world of Jesus, and he certainly meant the image to be taken seriously when he taught about what it takes to enter the kingdom of God.

I have been blessed in my life to be almost constantly in the presence of deeply wise people, people for whom the pursuit of and submission to wisdom has been far more important than any other crown. So when my lifelong friend Mary Frances Jaster answered the phone today I said, without preamble, "Talk to me about the rich young man." Without missing a beat, she referred me to lyrics from a song I didn't know, lyrics that tell of being touched by seeing a man with no clothes, no money, no plate.

There are blessed moments in life that shrink us. Seeing the Afghan refugees arriving with no clothes, no money, no plate is one of them. Standing in a dark field on a dark night and seeing the galaxy twinkling above is another. That same galaxy certainly inspired the psalmist to ask "Who are we, God, that you are mindful of us (8:4)?

There are other moments that shrink us too, like when we realize how wrong we've been, and how much God has forgiven our arrogance. I love finally seeing the world from God's perspective. Like John the Baptist, I want to decrease, so that Jesus in me may increase. Somehow, the more space he takes up, the less space I need.

Migrant Ministry Update

Thanks to your generous support of clothing drives this summer, the Migrant Ministry prepared and distributed to farm workers over 200 individual bags that included toiletries, a hoodie/sweatshirt/long sleeved shirt, several pairs of socks, work gloves, a cap, shower sandals, bandanas and a welcome card. We were also able to provide a small "thank you" to the workers at the end of the season - Skip Telgenhoff made 100 rosaries with prayer instructions in Spanish, which were given to the workers as they finished with their work here in the Fall.

In the next few weeks, the migrant ministry will explain the upcoming holiday called the Day of the Dead, or Dĺa de los Muertos, on November 2. The parish celebration will look a little different this year, although will still honor the traditions and spirit of the days that coincide with Halloween, All Souls Day, and All Saints Day in the Mexican, South and Central American cultures.

The Migrant Ministry recommends watching the Disney animated film "Coco" with your family to see how a young boy learns about his family's history, cleans the gravesites of the deceased (like the U.S.A. tradition of Memorial Day), prepares an ofrenda (remembrance table) about the deceased and decorates it with candles, marigolds, cut-out paper banners (papel picado), favorite foods and drinks, photos, sugar skulls (calaveras) and the bread in the shape of a skull with frosting in the shape of bones (pan de muerto).
