PRAYING FOR THE DEAD/MASS INTENTIONS

As Catholics, we have a long tradition of praying for our beloved dead. During this month of November, we are especially aware of this call and need to remember our departed brothers and sisters. The practice of praying for the dead predates Christianity, and is found in our Jewish roots. In the 2nd Book of Maccabees (12:46), it states, "Therefore Judas Maccabeus made atonement for the dead, that they might be delivered from their sin." The Catechism reminds us that in each and every Eucharist, we remember and offer sacrifice for the dead. As it states, "From the beginning the Church has honored the memory of the dead and offered prayers in suffrage for them, above all the Eucharistic sacrifice, so that, thus purified, they may attain the beatific vision of God. (C.C.C. #1030).

We know the souls in heaven do not need our prayers, and that the souls in hell will not benefit from our prayers. So, our prayers of suffrage are meant for the souls in Purgatory. In keeping with these doctrinal teachings, our liturgical and devotional practice has involved Mass intentions. We are planning for next year's Mass intentions here at Spirit of Christ. We deal with a HUGE volume of requests, and there are simply only so many Masses which can be offered. Spirit of Christ has received permission to have two intentions one day during the week, and for one week-end Mass. One Mass is also set aside each weekend "pro populo". This is "for the people". It is a requirement of Pastors in Canon Law that they pray publicly for their parishioners once each Sunday at Mass. So, as you can see, there

are 12 Mass intentions each week (give or take) and 52 weeks a year. Do the math, and you come up with roughly 625 Mass intentions a year. Add in a few other considerations like Priest Convocation, Holy Days, Vacations, etc, and the number is probably right around 600.

On Monday, Nov. 29, 2021, we will "open up the book" for the 2022 calendar year. To adequately serve the needs of our 2600 family population, we have a few guidelines. Each requestor is limited to 8 requests a year. We also cannot guarantee dates, for example, we cannot necessarily give you the 16th of every month for a Mass intention.

Canon allows parishes to schedule just one year "out", so we cannot go beyond 2022 at this time. Once the schedule is filled (usually by February/March), the book is closed for the year. At that time, the parish is able to refer to other churches and chapels and religious orders which are willing to take our "extra" requests. Those referrals are available in the parish office.

There are also several other ways we remember and commemorate our deceased. The 12 hanging candles in the church are scheduled for a week with a specific name attached. While not Mass intentions, this is also a way to mark our prayers for the deceased. The last Friday of the month daily Mass in the Chapel, all those who have had funerals during that month are remembered and prayed for at Mass. Families are invited to attend those Masses. Thank you for all your cooperation in our very important prayer for our deceased.







The Advent Wreath Prayers

It starts at the evening meal on the Sat. before the first Sunday in Advent with:

The Blessing the wreath

O God, bless our wreath and be with us as we prepare our hearts for the coming of Christ. As we light the candle each day, help us to keep our own hearts burning with your love.

Then follows the prayer which is said before the evening meal each night of the week in Advent.

The First Week

“So be on the watch. Pray constantly for the strength to stand secure before the Son of Man.: (Luke 21:36)

We prepare ourselves for the Lord’s coming into our world and into our lives. We ask, “In what area of my life do I stand at a distance from God?” We examine our relationships with family, friends, classmates, business associates, and neighbors. Is our faith reflected in each experience of human contact? Is love of God and neighbor the basis for our interaction with others?

(Light one purple candle.)

Almighty and loving God, we have searched our hearts and reviewed our love for your people. Some relationships overflow with love while others have been found wanting. Yet it is our desire that you be a part of every human experience. We beg you now to fill our hearts with your love and sharpen our awareness of your presence in every moment so that wherever we go and whatever we do, we will be always “on guard” and stand secure before you. Amen. Each night, the first purple candle is lit and is left burning during the meal.

The Second Week

“Make ready the way of the Lord. Clear him a straight path.” (Luke 3:4)

In the second week of Advent, we consider our relationships with ourselves and with God. We ask, “Do I always appreciate the union of the divine and the human that makes me who I am?” Are we aware of the wonder of “self,” the gift of being bestowed upon us by our Creator? Do we appreciate and use our talents, energies, charms, and abilities for God’s glory? In prayer and worship, are we in touch with the divine presence within us and around us?

(Light two purple candles.)

Almighty and loving God, you who dwell within our hearts at every waking moment, keep us always close to you. Help us to recognize and appreciate the gifts and talents you have given us. Teach us to use our energies for the good of others and the glory of your Son Jesus, whose promise is too precious to ignore. Keep our hearts and minds ever alert to your personal and loving touch in every prayer, in every act of worship. Amen.

The Third Week

“He will baptize you in the Holy Spirit and in fire.” (Luke 3:16)

In the third week of Advent, we are called to respond to the gifts and graces we received in our baptism. We ask, “Does my life today fulfill the expectations and responsibilities of bearing the name of Christian?” What are we doing for the hungry, the oppressed, the sick, the lonely? Do we truly care about the needs of others? Do we accomplish cheerfully all that is expected of us in the work place or the classroom?

(Light two purple candles and one pink candle.)

Almighty and loving God, your Son has taught us the way to live as your children. We were blessed in our baptisms with special gifts and graces, and still there are times when we find it hard to be all that we should be. We ask for an increased awareness of the needs of others and for the courage to stand up for those who cannot stand up for themselves. Please, God, help us to so live in your grace that all who know us will know you and your love. Amen.

The Fourth Week

“Blest is she who trusted that the Lord’s words to her would be fulfilled.” (Luke 1:45)

In the fourth week of Advent, we consider Mary’s trust in God’s promise, her joy in his goodness to her. We ask, “Am I ready to receive and celebrate the coming of the Son of God?” We have considered our relationships, our love of God and God’s love for us, and we have responded by an awakened concern for the needs of others. Now we may echo Mary’s words, “My being proclaims the greatness of the Lord. My spirit finds joy in God my savior.”

(Light all four candles.)

Almighty and loving God, soon the whole world will celebrate the birth of your Son Jesus. Even as we rejoice in our remembrance of his birth at Bethlehem, we find greater comfort in his promise to come again. May our preparations for this wondrous season remain with us, increase in us, and become as much a part of us as our breathing and our heartbeat. Then we may say, “Come, Lord Jesus, we are ready.” Amen.


