

pastor's note



Over the years I have had some delightful and some difficult Pastor's Notes to write. The former includes times of welcoming and celebrating major feasts such as Easter and Christmas, welcoming people back after the limits of the pandemic and announcing and welcoming new priests and deacons to the staff of our parish family. The more challenging would include things like the pandemic and the limits and concerns it raised, acknowledging our need to be attentive to the plight of evil present in our world, manifest in things like mass shootings, racial injustice and it's consequences in our country and abroad, and the importance of not losing hope or silencing our voice when our moral compass is seemingly being disregarded by governments and institutions.

That said, I know from past experience that writing my final reflections as I am preparing to leave a parish community carries with it a plethora of thoughts and emotions, both joyous and poignant. And so I offer you these thoughts and reflections as I come to my last weekend experience here at St. Thomas More.

First and foremost I give thanks to our God who has bestowed on me the grace and blessing of being a part of this faith family for over eight years now. The grace and goodness you have witnessed to me has made my

time here truly invaluable in both the carrying out of my priestly duties and the journey of faith that I myself am on with you. I cannot tell you the number of times I have been moved and grateful for the witness of God in action in the lives and activities of this wonderful community. You have a rich heritage of being a bright and inviting sign of the Lord to many, both near and far. Thank you for continuing that great tradition and for the role of you parents who have striven to pass it on to their children.

I am both humbled and deeply grateful for the men and women of our parish staff, both in the office and in the school, who daily come to carry out the work of the Lord in your name and for the good of the wider Church. They inspire me with their faithfulness, their compassion, their determination and their love for the good people of our parish. You are richly blessed in having these fine individuals daily responding to the invitation to be a proclamation of the Good News of our God.

I know that over these years I have had to make decisions, take positions and even carried out conversations that have not always been universally accepted or appreciated. I assure you all that I did not do anything capriciously. I pray that all I have and continue to do is a result of my sincere attempt to shepherd and teach in ways that best serve the Lord and His Gospel call. Regardless, I do need to say that for anything that may have callously or insensitively offended you or others, I am sincerely sorry. I ask your forgiveness. And I pray that the Lord of all mercy and compassion may make it possible to take away any hurt, offense or pain that would in any way impede your coming more fully into the presence of the God who loves you infinitely.

I do want to thank you for your constant and visible witness of faith and devotion. I am always moved by the number of our parish family who come to the Lord daily in the Masses and Adoration, who make wonderful use of the sacrament of Reconciliation and who are such good and faithful stewards of your time, your talent and your treasure. The painting of a life of faith well lived that you create can rival that of many of the great masters throughout history. I will forever be inspired by your witness and faithfulness.

As you have heard many times, I and your other priests pray for you daily. I have heard multiple times from various individuals how they remember me and the other priests in their daily prayers. We cannot thank you enough. But I do want to assure you that even after moving on, you will be very much in my heart and prayers. You have been a wonderful gift to me and my faith journey and I know that the Lord is not taking you away from being a part of my heart. As we say in the confessional: Give thanks to the Lord for He is good, His love is everlasting!

Finally, many have asked, "Where I am going? And will I come back occasionally?" First, I am not going far. I will be living at the Elijah House on the campus of our seminaries and the Pastoral Center for the Archdiocese of Denver. And since they are replacing me with two priests, and you will most likely have more than enough for Mass coverage, I will probably only be here for the occasional confession times but not other liturgical activities.

I will be available to help out at other parishes within the Archdiocese that don't have the blessing of so many priests, so pray for me as I will probably be on the road a fair amount in my coming years. Or pray for those on the road around me! I am most open to staying in touch, being invited for the occasional meal or other activity, and appreciate the ways you have made me feel at home here over the years. God bless you for that. 
