Lenten Regulations

1. By the law of God and the custom of the Church, all Christians are required to do penance.
2. The season of Lent retains its penitential character. The days of penance to be observed under obligation are Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of the Lenten season.
3. Abstinence from meat is to be observed on all Fridays of Lent. The law of abstinence and fast is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
4. The law of abstinence forbids the consumption of meat. The law of fasting permits only one full meal per day.
5. The law of abstinence binds those who have celebrated their 14th birthday. The law of fasting binds those who have celebrated their 18th birthday and continues until they have celebrated their 59th birthday.
6. Pastors and parents should take particular care to educate the young to a true sense of penance and self-discipline. More frequent use of the Sacrament of Penance and attendance at daily Mass should be encouraged during Lent, as well as other practices of penance and self-sacrifice.
7. The Fridays of the year outside Lent remain days of penance, but each individual may substitute traditional abstinence from meat with some other practice of voluntary self-denial or personal penance: this may be physical mortification, act of religion, charity or Christian witness. These works should be considered a minimal response to the Lord's call to penance and conversion of life.
8. All priests and deacons are delegated to grant dispensations to individuals, families or groups from their parish and visiting their parish.

Celebration of the Sacraments and Mass: The celebration of Baptisms, Matrimony and Funerals may be scheduled by calling the parish office. Attendance will be based on current guidelines from public officials.



We are holding public celebrations of the Mass based upon physical distancing of six feet and the capacity of the church, limiting us to 100 people for each Mass. (Instructions below to sign up to attend weekend Mass.)

The dispensation from the obligation to celebrate the Eucharist on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation remains in effect. We highly recommend that anyone with compromised health not attend public celebrations of Mass. Holy Trinity will continue to livestream Sunday Masses at 9:00 am on YouTube. Go to our website, Holytrinitycheyenne.org and click on the YouTube icon. You are also encouraged to join Fr. Tom at **1:00 pm on Sundays** to pray the Prayer for Protection and gospel reflection on Facebook.

Procedure for Signing Up for Weekend Mass: We require you to sign up for weekend Masses, and are able to accommodate up to 100 people. Ushers will assist with seating in order to maintain the required distancing between households. Everyone age two and up needs to wear a mask or face covering. Sign up for the next weekend will begin at 9:00 am on the Monday before that Saturday or Sunday. Sign up closes for a Mass when we reach 100 participants for that Mass. **We are not requiring you to sign up for Daily Masses.**

How to sign up (Registration for the upcoming week begins on the Monday prior to the weekend.):

1. Go to the parish website, www.holytrinitycheyenne.org, click the "Mass Registration" tab or button to register. **If you do not have internet access, please call the parish office between Monday and noon on Friday.**
2. Choose one Sunday Mass (Saturday evening or Sunday morning). Each Mass is limited to 100 people.
3. Be sure to push the "Submit" button. If you register online, you will receive an email confirmation.
4. **You will need to register each week.**

When you attend Mass:

1. **Please arrive at least 10 minutes early for Mass. YOU MUST WEAR A MASK TO ATTEND MASS.**
2. **Enter the church** using the doors on the east side facing Hot Springs Ave. Hand sanitizer is available.
3. **Observe physical distancing in the church.** Households will be seated together. Please ensure six feet of distancing from other parishioners and/or households.
4. **When coming to the altar for communion** use the side aisle, observe physical distancing and wear your mask.
5. **Communion will only be served in the hand.** Step to the side and lower your mask to consume. Return to your pew using the center aisle.
6. **At the conclusion of Mass** respect physical distancing when exiting. Please do not linger to visit in the church.

Some Ideas for Lenten Activities:

- * Come to the church at least once each week when it is not a Mass to spend some time in quiet prayer or view the posters on Eucharistic Miracles.
- * Set a bedtime alarm on your phone.
- * Call or text a different relative or friend each week to say, "Hi."
- * Fast from radio or TV news or social media once a week (e.g. One period of an hour and then two other 15-20 minute periods).
- * Count your blessings and write them down.
- * Do something nice for a friend or neighbor without being asked. (e.g. bake some cookies to share, bring in their trash can, brush the snow off their car, etc.).
- * Plan a family Lenten service project.
- * Make little care bags of toiletries and gloves/socks to pass out when you see someone who is homeless or asking for money.
- * Start a new prayer habit (e.g. Say the Rosary every Sunday as a family; Pray three prayers of thanksgiving every day).
- * Log on to Formed.org and watch a video to deepen your faith.
- * Contact a friend or family member and ask them to be your prayer partner.

Thoughts of the Pastor...



The first reading today is the Decalogue (the Ten Commandments) from the Book of Exodus. A similar listing is found in the Book of Deuteronomy. The shorter catechetical formulation is: First Commandment – I am the Lord your God, you shall not have strange Gods before me. Second Commandment – You shall not use the name of the Lord your God in vain. Third Commandment – Keep holy the Lord's Day. Fourth Commandment – Honor your father and mother. Fifth Commandment – Thou shall not kill. Sixth Commandment – Thou shall not commit adultery. Seventh Commandment – Thou shall not steal. Eighth Commandment – Thou shall not lie. Ninth Commandment – Thou shall not covet thy neighbor's spouse. Tenth Commandment – Thou shall not covet thy neighbor's goods.

This reading from Exodus is given to compliment the Cleansing of the Temple in the Gospel of St. John. In this context, the question becomes what needs cleansed from me as a Temple of the Holy Spirit for me to offer fitting worship and enter the Temple of the Church to worship at the altar of the Lord?

Do I have false idols in my life that are more important to me than God? Do I denigrated the Lord's name and things He has deemed holy? Do I fail to make the Lord's Day a day of prayer and rest? Do I show disrespect to those in authority? Have I killed someone and if not physically, then with my words? Have I surrendered to lust? Have I taken things that do not belong to me? Have I been dishonest? Have I desired another person and treated that person like an object? Have I been jealous of others for what they have? These sins and others make our souls marketplaces filled with noise and transactions that distract us from the relationship we are called to have with Christ and his Body, the Church. Through the celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation and the acceptance of God's love and grace, we have an opportunity to have Christ cleanse us so that we can worship in his Father's house.


Safe House is our March Charity of the Month. They would welcome household items, cleaning supplies, toiletries, baby care items, diapers, and non perishable food items such as canned food.



Everyday Stewardship

Parents Just Don't Understand: Anybody remember the old rap song by the Fresh Prince, aka Will Smith, "Parents Just Don't Understand?" As we grow up, it is sometimes a struggle for us to imagine that our parents understand us. It can seem impossible that Mom and Dad remember the stress of exam week or peer pressure. We never saw them as children; we never saw their disappointed faces when they weren't invited to a party, or their dashed hopes at a bad test grade. We never saw them homesick their first week of college or nervous to ask their crush to Homecoming.

We're often the same way about God. We gripe about what He asks of us. "He doesn't understand sin — he's all-good," we think. "He doesn't understand temptation — He is perfect."

In Scripture, God can be very much a father, telling us what we can and cannot do. And yet, in His divine genius, He is sometimes simply a man at a well, asking for a drink.

For me, it turns out I didn't need to tell my parents anything about what I was going through as a kid — they knew already. What I needed was for them to tell me what to do, and how to do it.

Similarly, we don't need to tell God about human nature. We need God to tell us about His nature. He's good enough to ask us for a drink, to enter into our humanity. But we have to remember, for our own sakes, to have the humility to ask Him for something, too — the water that will quench our eternal thirst.
