

Thoughts of the Pastor...

If someone asked you to describe your spouse, best friend, or sibling, how would you respond? Would you begin by telling the questioner their age, physical characteristics, employment, etc.? These descriptors will say something of your knowledge of the person. But, do they really describe who this person is that you care for and love? More than likely the questioner, if genuinely interested, wants to know more significant information such as, their personality, their interests, where do they find joy, what gives them life, what are they passionate about.

Each person in our lives will forever be a mystery, even our spouse of forty or fifty years. There will certainly be characteristics, habits, and attributes that will remain more or less constant in their life. But, to say, "I have him or her figured out," is not only a mistake, but a disregard for the complexity and mystery of each human person.

Today's Gospel has an important identity question proposed by Jesus. He has been with his disciples for some time now. They have heard his teaching, witnessed his miracles, eaten meals, walked dusty roads, shared laughter and tears. But do they know him? "Who do you say that I am?," is one of the most penetrating questions asked by Jesus. In the eighth chapter of Mark, Jesus asks Peter this most important and personal question. Peter's response is instructive, "You are the Christ." Christ is a title meaning anointed one. Jesus was truly sent by God for a particular mission and Peter understands, at least to a point.

Peter, although answering correctly, is quickly rebuked by Jesus. Peter fails to appreciate the particular salvific act of Jesus' death as part of Jesus' mission. It would take more time for Peter to appreciate the depth of Jesus' identity. That is true for us as well. Time spent with Jesus Christ in private and public prayer gives us the necessary time to grow in our gratitude and appreciation for and curiosity and understanding of who Jesus is for us, individually and collectively.

To know facts regarding the historical Jesus or even dogmas regarding him are important. But this intellectual knowledge does not make us a disciple. An atheist can know the same facts. A disciple has an intimate, ongoing, life-forming, and dynamic relationship with Jesus, the Christ. So, as Peter was asked, so are we, "Who do you say that I am?



Everyday Stewardship

Can You Walk the Walk? I've met and talked with enough people to feel confident that if you polled 100 fallen-away Catholics about why they didn't want anything to do with the Church, the term "accountability" would pop up in almost all of their answers.

And to be fair, a lack of accountability isn't just a Catholic problem. Talking the talk but not walking the walk has been a shortcoming handed down throughout the ages, across all creeds and nationalities.

Loving our neighbor, welcoming the stranger, clothing the naked, feeding the poor - it all sounds fantastic, especially when we're the ones saying it. But the doing - well, that's a different story, isn't it? We would do well to remember that Christ calls one of his best friends "Satan" when Peter tries to convince Jesus to stray from his destiny.

Have you ever been called Satan by one of your good buddies? I'll bet it's not a great feeling. But think about what Peter was doing. He had just said, "You are the Christ." And now, mere moments later, he's saying: "Don't say these things. Don't say you're going to suffer. Don't say you'll be killed."

He was telling Christ to squander what the Lord had given him. He was telling him that having faith was fine, but being faithful? It's just a little too hard. God has a destiny for you, too, and He's asking you to be open to it. Maybe it's not in your comfort zone. Maybe you don't think you can do it.

Lord, give us faith — but help us, also, to do the work.

The Way: A Healing Retreat for Male Survivors of Abuse, October 1-3, 2021, at Camp Comeca in Cozad, Nebraska.
