


Today our parish begins the synod journey, which follows in the wake of the Church's "renewal" proposed by the Second Vatican Council. By reflecting together on the journey that has been made, the Church will be able to learn through Her experience which processes can help Her to live communion, to achieve participation, to open Herself to mission. A two-part question prompts and guides us: How does this "journeying together," which takes place today on different levels (from the local level to the universal one), allow the Church to proclaim the Gospel in accordance with the mission entrusted to Her; and what steps does the Spirit invite us to take in order to grow as a synodal Church?

In the following days, please pray the *Adsumus, Sancte Spiritus* (available at <https://dioceseofcheyenne.org/synod-2021-2023>) and reflect on the above questions, as we begin this synodal experience.

Thoughts of the Pastor...

On October 10, 2021, Pope Francis opened the Synod of Bishops. The theme of the Synod is *"For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, Mission"*. Pope Francis stated in his opening remarks, "I am certain the Spirit will guide us and give us the grace to move forward together, to listen to one another and to embark on a discernment of the times in which we are living, in solidarity with the struggles and aspirations of all humanity. I want to say again that the Synod is not a parliament or an opinion poll; the Synod is an ecclesial event and its protagonist is the Holy Spirit. If the Spirit is not present, there will be no Synod." This weekend, October 16-17, 2021, Bishop Steven, all parishes of the diocese, and dioceses throughout the world, will officially enter the process.

So what is a synod? A synod can mean several things, such as a meeting, council, or assembly. At its root, synod means to "journey together". Paul VI established the Synod of Bishops in 1965. There have been several held over the years, called by Saint Pope John Paul II, Pope Benedict, and now Pope Francis. The synods called by Pope Francis explored such topics as young people and vocation discernment, family, and to identify new paths of evangelization in the Pan-Amazon region.

This particular synod will be like nothing we have experienced in modern times. Why? Because we are not entering the process to only produce a particular outcome, like a working document or plan. Rather, Pope Francis is asking us to enter the process to reflect upon being a synodal church. The fundamental question being asked by Pope Francis is: "How is this "journeying together" happening today in your particular Church? What steps does the Spirit invite us to take in order to grow in our "journeying together"? In a real way, the synod process is the outcome.

The synod asks us to truly listen to one another as we journey together with the Lord. The synod asks that we not only listen within our particular parishes, but broaden our capacity and willingness to listen to those beyond our parish and particularly the poor, those living on the margins. The purpose of such listening is to discover how our communion brings together in unity the various gifts for a missionary Church whose doors are open to all.

Plans are being developed for our participation in the synod process which will occur between November, 2021 and March 2022. The synod will conclude with the Assembly of Bishops in October 2023. The guiding documents from the Vatican can be viewed at: Synod of Bishops - Index (vatican.va)

Pope Francis concluded his remarks with the following prayer. May our hearts be united with his and that of the entire Church as we pray: "Come, Holy Spirit! You inspire new tongues and place words of life on our lips: keep us from becoming a "museum Church", beautiful but mute, with much past and little future. Come among us, so that in this synodal experience we will not lose our enthusiasm, dilute the power of prophecy, or descend into useless and unproductive discussions. Come, Spirit of love, open our hearts to hear your voice! Come, Holy Spirit of holiness, renew the holy and faithful People of God! Come, Creator Spirit, renew the face of the earth! Amen."





Everyday Stewardship

What's in it for me? I think we've all been guilty of looking at a situation and wondering what's in it for us. It doesn't matter if it's a particular work assignment, someone at the parish asking for help with the mission trip bake sale, or your spouse asking if you'll take over the grocery shopping this week. Often, our first reaction to one of these requests is a heavy sigh and the thought: “If I do this, what will I get?”

Sometimes it surprises us to realize that the Apostles were no different. We tend to idolize these contemporaries of Christ as giants who walked with the Savior. But in reality, these individuals were merely human beings struggling to commit to the task of everyday stewardship.

In the Gospels, we see glimpses of them longing for praise and affirmation. We see them jockeying for positions of power within the group of twelve. We see them expect earthly rewards like honor and admiration. We see them acting a lot like us.

But in the end, we see them transformed by the grace of God. Like all the saints, their holiness stems from their commitment to their call. They stumble through, and as they stumble, they keep trusting God. They keep turning to Him. They keep asking for help. They don't give up just because they keep failing at it.

We are defined by what we give when we have no hope of being reimbursed, rewarded, or recognized. The Apostles understood this, eventually, and they gave accordingly. Most of them gave their very lives.

Remember, they're just like us. If they can do it, we can too.




