


**Synod 2021 - 2023:** Over the next five weeks we will prepare to come together as a community to share our thoughts and feelings about the two-part question—*How does this “journeying together,” which takes place today on different levels (from the local level to the universal one), allow the Church to proclaim the Gospel in accordance with the mission entrusted to Her; and what steps does the Spirit invite us to take in order to grow as a synodal Church?* Keeping in mind that synod means to “walk together,” this week, recall how the Holy Spirit has guided the Church’s journey through history and, today, calls us to be witnesses of God’s love. ## Thoughts of the Pastor...

Did you know there are over 96 million photoreceptors within each retina? Sight is a remarkable gift! The cornea, pupil, lens, retina, optic nerve, and brain must all function together at a high level in order for us to see clearly the world around us. Damage to one or another of these key components weakens, distorts, or destroys our vision. As we age we can develop diseases of the eye such as glaucoma or macular degeneration. If treatment is unsuccessful the damage can leave us blind.

Today's Gospel story has Jesus encounter a blind man. His name is Bartimaeus, the son of Timaeus. We are not told if he was blind from birth or if a particular disease of the eye caused his blindness. Bartimaeus is a beggar sitting on the roadside. Shunned by the community due to his physical handicap, Bartimaeus is judged by his peers to be a sinner. His blindness is a clear sign of his unworthiness of God's love. For this reason, the crowd rebukes him and tells him to be quiet when Bartimaeus calls out to Jesus.

Not to be deterred from a possible encounter with the "Son of David", Bartimaeus calls out all the more. Jesus, ever willing to engage another human being whether judged by others to be worthy, asks Bartimaeus a simple question, "What do you want me to do for you?" Not surprisingly, Bartimaeus, replies, "I want to see." Bartimaeus is healed. He is told by Jesus to "Go your way." But, and this is significant, Bartimaeus followed Jesus on the way.

Did you know the "way" was an early descriptor for Christians? Believers in Jesus, as the Son of God, followed the "way" of their master. They walked a life of faith after the pattern of Jesus who suffered, died, and rose. So, yes Bartimaeus received his physical sight, but much more than that; he received spiritual sight through faith. Now, he would not only enjoy the visual experience of being human in all its beauty and wonder, he would have the capacity to grasp the spiritual truths that come from faith!

Bartimaeus would need that faith. In the very next scene Jesus and his disciples, and apparently Bartimaeus as one of them, enter Jerusalem for the final encounter with those who sought his life. How much easier it would have been for Bartimaeus to go his own way after Jesus healed him. We do not know what happened to Bartimaeus during those tense, difficult days in Jerusalem leading to the crucifixion of Christ, nor how he spent the remainder of his life following the Resurrection. However, he does serve as a model for us as we respond to the generosity of our Lord and Savior.

Are the "healing miracles" we witness in this life as answers to prayer viewed as quid pro quo: I prayed and God answered and now I move forward on my way? Or are they invitations to deepen our commitment to the Way, following the Master where he leads?

## Everyday Stewardship

**Giving as God does:** Ask yourself this question — what would you pray for if you really believed God could and would do anything for you? In my experience, we all have something. We all have that miracle we're afraid to request, afraid we will be disappointed.

Do we doubt God's readiness to give because we ourselves have such an imperfect understanding of charity and love? Maybe if we had better faith in God we would be more ready to give of ourselves — and maybe if we were more ready to give of ourselves, we would understand more clearly the ways of God.

Because we're not really afraid that God can't do something. We know He can do anything. What we're afraid of is that He will do what He always does: give us what we need, not what we want.

Have you ever had a friend in need and you just wanted to give them something — a meal, a phone call, a text? Not because you knew it would help, but simply because you wanted to reach out. And have they ever said to you: It wasn't so much what you gave, but the fact that you did. You gave them what they needed even if it wasn't what they specifically asked for.

When we give in this manner, we are giving as God does. Sometimes we are afraid to ask because we don't want to be disappointed. But remember, the blind man on the road got what he asked for, but he would have gotten what he needed even if his answer had been the opposite. God's generosity is always reckless, and it's always perfect




