

As parishioners, we are part of a community, a parish family. We do not visit on a Sunday morning, since we cannot visit a place that is home. We are the Body of Christ and every Sunday liturgy gathers Christ's Body to be re-created through Word and Sacrament. This primary activity of God re-creating the Church requires the gifts, talents, and time of each member. Each gift is an offering of love to one another and ultimately to God.

We need you now more than ever. Each of us has a responsibility in the celebration of the Eucharist. A danger of streamed liturgies was that we could find ourselves as passive spectators instead of active participants. Thoughts of the Pastor...

Like many things within Catholicism, feast days have a varied history. That should be expected in a Church spanning the globe through two millennia. encountering various cultures and languages. The feast we celebrate today is among them.



Epiphany comes from a Greek word meaning manifestation. Among Eastern Christians this feast is also called theophaneia or theophany, the appearing of God.

The origins of celebrating Epiphany are obscure, but probably associated with a celebration of the Incarnation as a whole. In parts of the eastern Mediterranean, Epiphany was the nativity feast of Christ. This was the practice of the fourth century Jerusalem church. The Jerusalem church did not adopt the December 25 nativity feast until the fifth century, and following its earlier practice the Armenian church has never done so. By the end of the fourth century most churches of the East had accepted the western Christmas and assigned January 6 as the feast of the Baptism of Christ. This date was an important day for baptism in the Byzantine church, which still has a blessing of water on this feast. The largest Greek Orthodox celebration in the world is held January 6 in Tarpon Springs, Florida, a small town outside of Tampa Bay settled by Greek sponge divers.

At the same time as the western Nativity feast of December 25 was being adopted in the East, Epiphany was accepted as a feast in the western churches. At first it seems to have been the feast of the three miracles: the visit of the Magi, the baptism of Christ, and the wedding feast at Cana. Eventually however, the Roman rite concentrated solely on the visit of the Magi as the content of the feast, assigning the baptism of the Lord to the following Sunday.

Although the feast of Epiphany has a varied history, its importance has not been lost either in the West or East. For us in the West with our focus solely on the Magi, the only source in Scripture is Matthew 2:1-12. The theological significance is clear: the manifestation (epiphany) is for the entire world, represented by the magi. Within the story these "wise ones," most likely astrologers from the East follow a star to Bethlehem. New stars were always associated with the birth of significant historical figures. Tradition teaches three magi or kings made the journey due to the three gifts that were offered to Jesus. But, to make the journey there would have been many more in the caravan.

God's plan of salvation takes a significant leap forward in today's feast of the Epiphany. A plan born in the covenant with Abraham where God promised children as numerous as the sand on the seashore or the stars in the sky, now moves beyond biological paternity. All humanity is now called into a covenant by faith forged through the life, death and Resurrection of Jesus, the Christ.







Everyday Stewardship

The Light of the Moon: If you own a television that has been turned on at any point in the last month or so, chances are you've caught at least a scene or two of the 1946 classic film "It's a Wonderful Life."

If you're not familiar with the movie, it follows the life of George Bailey from childhood through adulthood. A dreamer by nature, George has big plans for himself that involve world exploration and adventure — but family and community obligations keep him tethered to the same spot on the map, leading an altogether ordinary life.

One of the most memorable scenes from that movie is of George dancing with his sweetheart Mary while they sing "Buffalo Gals — Won't you come out tonight/And dance by the light of the moon?"

That lyric always catches my ear. Of course, the moon doesn't have any light of its own. All the moon has is the ability to reflect the light that shines upon it.

The same holds for us, doesn't it? Our stewardship is purely a reflection of the grace granted to us by another. "Upon you the LORD shines," writes Isaiah, "and over you appears his glory." Every good action we will ever take begins in the mind of God. The fact that we have the honor of carrying it out on His behalf is a beautiful gift. It is God that makes our ordinary lives extraordinary.

In the end of the movie, George Bailey realizes that he had a far greater life because, instead of being the hero of his own story, he allowed himself to reflect goodness onto others.

Remember — the magi didn't chart their own course. They merely followed the star.


